**Council Meeting Reminder** 

#### Pastor's Message

"A Christian preacher was preaching in the bazaars in India, and a Mohammedan said, 'Padre Sahib, we have a proof in our religion that you haven't got in yours. We can go to Mecca and find the tomb of Mohammed, but when you go to Palestine you can't be sure that you've got the tomb of Jesus.' 'Yes,' said the Christian preacher, 'you're right. We have no tomb in Christianity because we have no corpse.'"

(E Stanley Jones, from a sermon, "Christ is the Answer")

The message of Easter is "We have no corpse." Yet, it is more than that; it is "Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!" I am sure that as the sermon progressed the writer made this fact known as well. It is an important fact because it expresses so much about Jesus. Most notably it expresses a truth one should never forget; the truth that Jesus is Lord! And what does that mean? Well in conjunction with the observance of Good Friday it means that Jesus is Lord of life, that he has power over death and the grave. This to me is so very important to relay to you because I tend to feel that many people see Jesus as just another prophet, another holy man, another moral leader in the long list of leaders that have been a part of this earth. Yet Jesus is not just another person to follow because of his moral standards and wise sayings. Jesus is the person to follow because He Lives! No one else can claim that but Jesus alone.

The grave could not bind Jesus. Think about that especially this year when, already, we have been touched by so many deaths of members from our church family. The grave could not bind Jesus and it will not bind those who follow him. This is not true concerning the other religious leaders. You see, only Jesus is Lord of life and Lord of the living. He is just like his father. The living includes those who have gone to paradise before us.

"Jesus is Lord" also means that what was accomplished at the cross where he was crucified was indeed accomplished. There can be no guessing about that because the Lord has assured us all, "It is finished!"

If Jesus is Lord and we are on same team as followers then what Jesus finished has been finished for us, in our place. We do not have to finish anything because Jesus has done that for us. I believe our creed says "for us and for our salvation he came down from heaven." So, although we do sin, (acts,

words and thoughts for which we should still feel sorrow), Jesus has taken sins sting away. Hallelujah!!!

Jesus is Lord also means that when one is facing trouble, or a disaster or a dilemma, one does not face such things alone. When one is facing celebration, jubilation, wonder and joy, one does not face these alone either. One faces such things as these with "the LORD" by their side. For the risen one is alive and still reigns. The future is brighter knowing that the Lord is with you. In fact the last words Jesus spoke while walking the earth are these, "I am with you always even to the close of the age."

Jesus is with us as Lord and God. Sometimes this is hard to wrap your arms around. I guess that is why the Holy Eucharist is so important to me. For it is there that the same Lord comes to us in that mystery. Yes, he comes to us because he has always been for us. One who believes cannot afford to absent oneself from this mystery for it is there that the Risen Lord assures us of his love and his abiding presence.







Spring is here.... So excited to get the children outside again. We will be off the week of April 14 -18. So we will be covering Jesus Enters Jerusalem, Palm Sunday, Easter and when we get back He is Risen.

I have a great treat to make with the children to explain he has Risen... Take a Crescent Roll/Pillsbury and a Large Marshmallow. Spread out uncooked crescent so that you can wrap the marshmallow in it. Explain to the children that this is the Tomb where Jesus was placed. The marshmallow represents Jesus. Bake the Crescent Roll and the Marshmallow for about 10-13 minutes at temp on Crescent Roll Directions. Let them cool. Have the children take a bite. They will see that the marshmallow is no longer there. He has risen!

I end this with a verse from 1Corinthians 1:18 For the word of the cross is folly to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God.

This time of year is my favorite. Taking the walk with Jesus and saying he has risen brings joy to my heart.

#### NEWS FROM THE HOUSE & GROUNDS DEACON



#### JUNIOR YOUTH RETREAT UPDATE...

Several of our junior high youth attended a "winter extravaganza" retreat put on by our New England District in Keene, New Hampshire in February. Trinity Lutheran Church welcomed about 70 youth from all over New England. The true beauty of their church is the stained glass depicting the Good Shepherd and the Lutheran rose, around which their nave was built. The theme of the retreat was "Live Loved (d)." This message gave our youth a chance to differentiate between the worldly view of love and how God wants them to experience His love, and how that love can be demonstrated to others.



Through worship, activities and reflection the message was clear that the love portrayed through social media, music, and pop culture today can often lead youth away from the love God intends for their lives. A local guitarist and a hand drummer added to the meaningful worship time. There was a nice balance of worship, free time, activities, and eating. Did I mention the food was incredible!



Three women cooked homemade meals all weekend. I do not think they left the kitchen. In addition to worship, kids went tubing for the afternoon at Granite Gorge ski resort, then had the opportunity to swim and go rock climbing at the nearby YMCA.

Youth also participated in a service project which involved creating cards for servicemen and women and college students in order to demonstrate God's love to others. On Sunday, President Yeadon delivered a powerful sermon that the kids really related to. During his sermon at worship on Sunday, Pastor Yeadon humored us with quotes from popular songs...showing the distortion and conflicting messages about love that our youth need to navigate through on a daily basis.

The organizers of this New England District retreat were all so supportive and kind and excited about regenerating the youth activity level in New England. All leaders expressed declines in church membership and poor attendance in their Sunday School and youth programs, across the board. The good news is that they realize that the struggle exists and are willing to put the time and effort into getting the youth excited about their relationship with Christ. They want to be able to reach out to youth by providing them with programs and opportunities that will increase youth in their faith and number.

New England is facing a rapid decline in church membership and involved excited youth. As Pastor Yeadon stated, "The youth today is the future of the church." Overall, this was a great experience for our junior high students, thanks to the efforts of a lot of like-minded leaders throughout New England.

A reminder note to us all from Carol Weinshel:

"I must tell you that on 17 December of 2013, there was a Black Hawk helicopter crash in Afghanistan where 5 of our solders from the 1st Combat Aviation Brigade were killed as well as one from the 2nd Cavalry Regiment in Germany. 

#### April 6: Jesus Raises Lazarus From the Dead


If you watch the evening news with any regularity, it's easy to be overwhelmed by hopelessness for our world. Combine that with individual stresses and problems, and you can imagine that many of the adults in your group feel hopeless about at least one thing in their lives. Use this lesson to help people see that even in the most hopeless situations, Jesus has the power to bring hope.

**Bible Point:** Jesus gives us hope.

Key Verse: John 11:25



Adults often categorize praise only in terms of a worship service, without giving much thought about who they are worshipping and why. In their daily lives, adults can easily get caught up in the pressing tasks of the moment and forget that these are opportunities to praise Jesus. This lesson will help you lead your group in an investigation of different kinds of praise, going beyond just a great song or a well-crafted worship service.





#### April 27: Peter Explains Belief in Jesus

Have faith can be a somewhat clichéd thing to say nowadays. It often sounds like a mere platitude that doesn't offer real words of comfort in troubled times. It can even feel like a guilt trip as if the person's lack of faith is the reason their troubles persist. As you teach this lesson, help adults understand that having faith is no cliche. Faith is of greater worth than gold and can be strong as we await our inheritance in heaven.

Bible Point: Have faith in Jesus. **Key Verse:** Romans 5:3-4
