PASTOR'S MESSAGE

The season of Lent begins this week. It starts on Ash Wednesday, March 5, 2014. The season has been one that has always helped me to prepare for the greatest Christian Feast of the church year, the Resurrection of our Lord. Lent is a time of discipline and a time to learn more and more about God's word and about the life of our Beyond the teaching element of the mid-week Lord. Historically, each of the weeks during Lent was reserved for imparting some new dimension of Christian content and style to the life meal. My hope during this period of Lent is that the many members of our congregation would consider coming out to the mid-week services in order to receive some new dimension of Christian content offered during two specific times on Wednesday evenings. There is a time when we gather in fellowship around a wonderful salad and a selection of quite tasty soups. (If you have not attended the dinner fellowship you have certainly missed delicious homemade entrees). During this time of fellowship we receive a better knowledge about each other over table conversation. I for one hold that table fellowship is one of the most important fellowships of Christian community and commend our Lenten practice to you for your consideration.

The mid-week fellowship is enhanced, at a later time in the meal, by conversation over God's word. Our time is spent digesting Bible studies prepared to help us better understand God's will for our lives. Truly, the only way one can understand God's will is by reading of it in his Word to us. Outside of that word, trying to

figure out God's will and his direction for our lives is quite speculative and highly subjective so why not take some time to dig into the word itself and join your brothers and sisters in Christian devotion and education.

called, "Witnesses to the Cross". Five dramatic Dialogs shall be offered covering topics like resurrection, forgiveness, anger, and death. The Bible studies will also focus in on the themes of preaching each week so that there will be a sense of continuity between the lesson taught and the Word preached.

Of course it is my hope that everyone in the congregation would give up a couple of hours of time (From 6pm to 8pm) to be a part of this "Lenten discipline." The fellowship, the meal, the exhortation and discovery of Christian truths are indeed important to God's people. In fact, such things are important for all people. So, if you plan on coming, go the step further and ask a friend to join you. We would be glad to include friends and neighbors as a part of our fellowship.

Lent is upon us. I Look forward to sharing the season with you!

SUNDAY SCHOOL FOR MARCH 2014...

March 2: Jesus Teaches His Disciples to Pray

Some adults may feel uncomfortable admitting they struggle with prayer or have a very limited prayer life. To make this topic less threatening, be willing to share your own struggles with prayer. All Christians have struggled with prayer at one time or another-including Jesus' adult disciples. Also encourage discussion about prayer in terms of what participants could do, rather than what they have done.

Bible Point: We pray to God. Key Verse: Matthew 6:9-13

March 9: Jesus Feeds Thousands

Most adults have experienced times of need. In a society with high rates of unemployment and home foreclosure, you may have adults in your group who have literally had to wonder where their next meal would come from. You may have others who have no trouble with their basic needs, but are struggling with emotional or spiritual needs. Help participants understand that God can meet their needs abundantly.

Bible Point: God meets our needs. Key Verse: Philippians 4:19

March 16: Jesus Explains Eternal Life to Nicodemus

Nicodemus, a religious leader, is a perfect example of how even adults well-versed in religious principles may not understand the truth of eternal life. Sadly, many people are unfamiliar with who Jesus really is and what he accomplished for them on earth through his life, death, and resurrection. Other people believe that they can get to heaven through their own efforts. As you lead this lesson, don't make assumptions about what the adults in your group may or may not know. Help them to see that through a personal relationship with Jesus Christ, each of us can receive eternal life in heaven.

Bible Point: Jesus gives us eternal life. Key Verse: John 3:16

March 23: Jesus Talks With the Samaritan Woman

As this session reveals, Jesus offered the Samaritan woman eternal life—"living water." One amazing thing is that he picked someone others deemed as "unlovable"—an outcast—to share this gift with. Most adults feel unlovable in one way or another, and they need to know that Jesus offers his love to them. Everyone is worthwhile to Jesus. As you teach this lesson, help participants understand that Jesus still offers his living water to everyone who will receive it. Bible Point: Jesus loves everyone.

Key Verse: 1 John 5:12

March 30: Jesus Tells About the Good Samaritan

Our culture hears all about "love"—in music lyrics, in advertisements, on television, and in church. But what does it really mean to love other people? Today's session will help show adults that love is sacrificial. It's more than just the stuff of cheesy love songs. It's taking time out of our busy schedules to show that we care—even for people who are hard to love. Bible Point: Jesus says to love others as ourselves. Key Verse: Ephesians 4:32
