


Now with the calendar turning to May, I'd like us to sustain our Resurrection momentum and keep our eyes, ears and hearts open to:






Church Softball!

THE GANCARZ GARDEN...

Spring cleanup was completed and today, April 26th, it is being watered by our Lord. I have been asked about the new bench that sits under our beautiful copper beech tree. The bench was part of an Eagle Scout project successfully completed by C.J. Caron Jr. Remember last fall when many of you bought cookies and other goodies at our church to help fund the project? C.J. also organized his scout troop to remove invasive plants, relocate rock, mulch under the evergreen bush, carefully trim the lower branches of the beech tree and plant bulbs in the garden. The bird house also received a fresh coat of paint. With the addition and careful placement of the new bench, one can view the perennial flowers that are starting to emerge this spring. Narcissus and daffodils are now in bloom. A lilac, butterfly bushes, evening primrose, astilbe, delphinium, iris, phlox, lupine, hydrangea, coreopsis, white daisy, Queen Anne's Lace, and a variety of coneflowers will follow. In the fall the rosa rugosa and black eyed rudbeckia will dominate the garden. Zennias will be added for spots of color.

Historically the area was designed by Buzz Gancarz to be a collection basin for water runoff from the parking lot. Thanks to Al and Johnathan Manke of Tower Farms, many of the perennial flowers and the three tall grasses were donated several years ago. Additional plants have since been given by El Smith, Martha Medford and the Gancarz'. The Japanese maple was given by Phil Kenney and the large Korean dogwood was a memorial gift by Bob Raddatz in memory of his wife Jean. Take time to sit on the new bench and thank C.J. Enjoy what nature has to offer.

NEWS FROM OUR LITTLE CHERUBS...

Things we practice at Little Cherubs can be practiced at home as well.

SPRING: Because observation is such a basic learning tool, springtime provides an ideal climate for learning outdoors. Taking walks on the Nature Trail. Here are some suggestions for using a stroll outdoors as a vehicle for expanding vocabulary, practicing listening and memory skills pointing out basic concepts: 1. Devote a portion of your walk to "Listen", 2. Explore the textures and smells you find along the way. 3. Compare the trees, animals and flowers and rocks you observe as same or different in color shape and size. 4. Use such descriptive words as above, below, between, under, next to, inside, small, medium, and large in making reference to things you discover. 5. Discuss the "best part " of your trip when you get home. It is not only satisfying to recall fun events together, but such reminiscing is also good practice for your child's memory skills.

Judy Watson lives at 43 Elmwood Drive, Cheshire; 203-439-0769. Judy enjoys reading, antiques and gardening.








CARE PACKAGES FOR THE TROOPS...





May 4: Jesus Returns to Heaven

Many Christians today know a lot about Jesus. For example, they know that after he died and rose from the dead, he returned to heaven and will return to earth again. But sharing this information is a different matter. It can be hard for adults to summon the courage to tell others about Jesus. Today you can help participants realize that they can be witnesses for Jesus—at home, in their neighborhoods, at work, at school.

Bible Point: tell others about Jesus. **Key Verse:** Matthew 28:19-20

May 11: Christians Care for One Another

It's easy for Christians to be kind to each other while they're sitting together in church— in fact, it's expected. But unlike the society we'll learn about today, our lives outside the church building can be pretty segregated. Geographic distance and over-packed lives can make it difficult for adults to care for other Christians during the week. Use this lesson to encourage your participants to care for God's family all week long.

Bible Point: God's family takes care of each other.

Key Verse: Hebrews 10:24-25

May 18: Stephen Forgives His Accusers as They Stone Him

Persecution comes in many different forms. Because of their belief in Christ, adults may get passed over for promotions, ignored by their neighbors, or even picked on by lukewarm Christians. While some might be able to weather persecution, others give up, wear out, or keep their faith to themselves, embarrassed to admit they're Christians. As you teach this lesson, help adults understand the benefits of standing up for Jesus through times of persecution.

Bible Point: We stand up for Jesus.

Key Verse: 1 Peter 3:15


May 25: Paul Teachers in Athens
