Soon is coming the day when the little ones of our communities will dress up in various costumes so that they can go door to door looking for treats. Soon the day known as Halloween will be upon us and we shall be visited by the many who want to be something or someone else.

When I was a child most of the costumes had to do with ghosts, witches, goblins and the like. Then different types of occupational garb became fashionable. Children would dress up as pirates, or doctors, or ballerinas, or princes or cowboys throw in a couple of hobos and we were good to go. Today, they dress up as the most popular heroes of the day. Most of the time those heroes are characters from the latest animated film. The spookiness of the night has been transformed into a runway for the heroes of our time. The worry of being scared has been replaced by the fame of celebrity. There is nothing fearful about Halloween anymore. As members of the Lutheran Church we should cherish all that has been handed down to us. As members we should cherish the Word of God, a Word that changed Luther's life and the lives of many others. The slogan, "by scripture alone" is something we should not forget for it is through the scriptures that we have come to our faith, and with that faith own the grace of God offered in the gospel.

I encourage all who read this newsletter to delve into the rich Word of God. I encourage you and challenge you to do so on a personal level picking up the written word and reading it. I urge you to go a step further and to attend one of the many classes offered by CLC to study God's word. The trick is getting all who read this letter to take me up on my invitation. The treat will be found in all that shall be gained as the Spirit of God touches you via his life giving Word. And believe me and true to the season, as you immerse yourself in the Word of God your life will be changed. Grace and peace to you all.

vacations, as the Speaking of "spreading the Word" - Pastor Nuechterlein shared a video in an adult Sunday education hour a few weeks ago about a new Bible. The Saint John's Bible was commissioned by Saint John's Abbey and University in Minnesota and was created by a team in Wales, UK. To say that the Bible is "hot off the press" would be a misstatement, since it was done by hand and its production took about 15 years. The handwritten text is done in calligraphy and the color illustrations are vibrant and luminous! About 60 of its 1,100 plus large scale pages are on display until November 2nd at the Knights of Columbus museum in nearby New Haven. 

SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSONS FOR OCTOBER 2014...

October 5: God Floods the Earth

By this age, most of your students have surely experienced the heartbreak of broken promises. Parents may have disappointed them with changes of plans, and friends may have betrayed their secrets. Finding someone they can trust feels like a difficult task for young adolescents. In today's session, help your young people see that God always keeps promises. God is trustworthy beyond their wildest dreams, and God will never betray them.

Bible Point: We can count on God's promises.

Key Verse: Psalm 145:13



It seems as each day goes by, more and more things fight for young teenagers' affection. Media and pop culture endorse popularity, reputation, possessions, and style as worthwhile pursuits. So with all the competition for their attention and time, it may be difficult for your students to put God first. Use this study to help students understand the importance of putting God first in their lives and investing in a relationship with God—instead of in the other things that fight for their attention.

Bible Point: We put God first. **Key Verse:** Deuteronomy 6:5

October 19: Abram Follows God's Direction

Young teenagers have a lot of questions about the direction their lives are going. While they no longer desire specific direction from parents or teachers, they have a lot of unanswered questions about the right choices to make and what the future holds. Abram's example of blind trust in God can help middle schoolers see that even if they don't know the answers to their questions, they can trust and follow God.

Bible Point: We can always trust God.

Key Verse: Proverbs 3:5-6

October 26: Lot and Abram Divide the Land

Your students live in a society that tells them to "do what you want" and "look out for your-self." They may not have much experience considering others' perspectives, and they may tend to think what they're going through is more important than what anybody else is experiencing. And at an age where their bodies are changing, their focus can zoom in even more on themselves—how they look, what they wear, and what others think of them. Use this study to encourage your students to look past themselves. You can help them see life through the eyes of someone else and realize that the best way to live is to focus on others over oneself.



Key Verse: Luke 6:31










HOPE PREGNANCY CENTER...

THE REFORMATION: QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS...

By Dr. Norman Nagel, professor emeritus, Concordia Seminary, St. Louis



1. Why is the Reformation important for us today?

A: A Christian cannot live a single day without the forgiveness of sins.

2. Is there reason still to be Lutheran?

A: The Lutheran tradition points only to Christ for our salvation, free and complete.

3. What hallmarks should we keep in mind when celebrating the Lutheran Reformation?

A: We are nothing but given to, that is, by grace and by faith. Grace alone, faith alone, Scripture alone — all mean by Christ alone. There is no other Christ than the one Scripture gives us, which is the instrument of the Holy Spirit for bestowing the gifts of life and salvation. Jesus said, "The words that I have spoken to you are Spirit and they are life" (John 6:63 ESV). That centers everything in Jesus, in and from Jesus. At the heart of our celebration is extolling Jesus — proclaiming and praising Him, for which our tradition supplies us with bountiful resources in liturgy and hymns. "One generation shall commend Your works to another, and shall declare Your mighty acts" (Psalm 145:4 ESV).

4. What cautions should be observed in celebrating the anniversary of the Reformation?

A: In celebrating the Reformation we should be cautious not speak scornfully of any other Christians who look only to Christ for their salvation and not to themselves.

I am writing to you today, September 28, 2014, the season is Fall but it feels like the middle of Summer. 85 degrees out... I could enjoy this weather all Fall....



Attention Ladies!


