PASTOR'S MESSAGE

I was reading over some older resources for the season of Christmas. I came upon a statement in one source that said, "The danger for many Christians and congregations is to lock the Christmas cycle in the past tense." I wondered about this statement to see if what was said a number of years ago still held true for people and churches today. My opinion is that many Christians walk the path that leads to the past when it comes to a religious or spiritual understanding of Christmas. Most people tend to focus upon the happening in Bethlehem of Judea enhanced by biblical costumes and nostalgic songs. But here is the danger. People get stuck there. It is a vesterday event.

The theme of the Christmas cycle is one that is not simply about the past, but it is also about the present and the future. It is about the present because the coming of Jesus is also about his coming into our lives through the sacrament of baptism. It is about the present because the babe born in Bethlehem is the Christ who lives in us and whose life is expressed through us. Perhaps this expression of Christ's life in us is given vitality at the time of celebrating the birth of Jesus, for it may seem that people air a different spirit when thinking about the day of Christmas. Perhaps the life of Christ in us becomes exposed as we are forced to deal with the regular forces of the day, but "it's Christmas" and so we deal differently with them because the So my friends in Christ, as we gather for the past has meaning for our present lives. For those of us who try to live the "Christmas spirit" maybe what we are truly trying to do is live the Christ who rules our hearts and minds through faith. People who view the holiday only as a past in their lives today and depend upon his event to be remembered once a year may not find themselves engaged in the Spirit of the day. They are caught in the past that has little bearing on the present. Yet, the reason for the birth was

to bring light to our world of darkness, which indeed Jesus did from his birth forward. Now as followers and believers in him we continue to manifest his light in the present which manifestation confirms the truth that the theme of Christmas is a present reality.

Ah, the Christmas cycle is not only one that engages the believer in the past and the present, but also embraces the future. It reminds us that there is more than the present wrapped up in the birth of Christ, there is a future. The future is found in the fact that Jesus Christ is to return to this world. The one who died upon the cross and who rose

from death and the grave will come to rescue us from this "veil of tears." We are not only looking backward as Christian people, but forward with hope. Advent is overflowing with images

of Christ's

coming again and in that part of the cycle we look to Christ to come remembering, as bearers of his life in the present, there is nothing to \fear. There is for the believing

community, everything in which to hope. As the birth of Christ was an expectation hoped for, the second coming of Christ is the finale to the plan of God's salvation for all people. The prayer of God's people as each day passes is always, "Come, Lord Jesus, Come!"

holiday of Christmas let us remember that there is a yesterday, today and tomorrow all rolled up into the cycle. Let us move forward knowing that Christians can celebrate Christ promise to return, because they can rely on Scriptures accounts of Jesus' nativity.

NEWS FROM THE PRESIDENT

AND THE CHURCH COUNCIL

I again want to encourage all our members to prayerfully respond in thanksgiving for His blessings to finish our 2015 Mission Plan as best we can. We had a very good attendance at our November 16th Voters Assembly meeting where we heard reports from Pastor Gustafson, our officers and our deacons of the various avenues of worship, ministry and mission that occur here at CLC. Our financial Mission Plan for 2016 was presented, discussed and adopted by the Voters Assembly; members have received a copy of it with their 2016 stewardship packages. You may have heard our Stewardship Deacon, David Veleber, speak at a recent worship service about our 2016 Mission Plan. Please also see his article in this issue of the Heavenly Herald. As is noted on the 2016 Mission Plan, our offerings for 2016 are planned to be \$302,000; that equates to about a four percent (4%) increase over the offerings our Finance Committee projects that we, as a congregation, will have given in 2015.

As we approach the end of this year, the Finance Committee will monitor our progress toward our 2015 Mission Plan. To the extent that we fall short of our 2015 offerings goal of \$300,000 – possibly in the range of \$12,000 to \$15,000 – our plan to support various worthy outreach ministries typically suffers. So, with that in mind, I again want to encourage all our members to prayerfully respond in thanksgiving for His blessings to finish our 2015 Mission Plan as best we can.

The Voters Assembly also approved to move the Columbarium project forward to the next planning steps, including final design work and cost estimates, before any actual construction is authorized. Bylaws governing the operation of the Columbarium have been drafted and reviewed, and the Columbarium Committee has a bit more editing to do on them.

This Advent and upcoming Christmas seasons may provide opportunities for you to tell a friend or a neighbor a bit about CLC and invite that person to join you for a worship service or Bible study.

As always, please contact any member of our Church Council if you have any suggestions or questions. Our next CLC Council meeting will be Tuesday, December 15th.

I hope to see you in church!

- We can always use Alum, Flour and a Salt to make Play Doh and clean out your closets for extra Cookie Cutters to use with Play Doh.
- The Children Love Putting Puzzles together. If you have any to donate we would be so Thankful.













NEWS FROM OUR STEWARDSHIP DEACON...

I hope everyone had a very Happy Thanksgiving. I would like to wish everyone a joyous and Merry Christmas.

Many of you were present during my presentation during the two services on November 22nd and heard that there were really two parts – one about the shortfall for the current Mission Plan and the other about the desire to meet the goals of the 2016 Mission Plan. If you have not taken and/or returned your pledge packets, I urge you to do so as soon as possible. If you have not pledged in the past but would like to do so now, you can ask our Church Secretary, Carol Santoro, for a packet. I again thank all of you for your past generosity and look forward to a very successful 2016.

For those of you who were not present on the 22nd, the key points were:

- 1. There is a shortfall of approximately \$25,000 as we approach the end of the 2015 Mission Plan and we are asking everyone for help with trying to close that gap during the month of December so that we can try to meet our obligations.
- 2. For 2016, we are asking everyone to pray and give due consideration for the blessings we all receive and increase the amount of giving. There are materials in the pledge packet which clearly describe the joys and benefits of giving.
- 3. We are hoping that people who do not currently pledge consider committing to a pledge. It will help the Church to have a better idea of expected revenue and to be better able to manage expenditures. If you choose not to pledge, you can ask Carol Santoro for dedicated envelopes so that your donations can, at least, be attributed to you for tax purposes.
- 4. We are trying to get to a point where we meet all of our obligations in the Mission Plan. The 2016 Mission Plan is not much different than the 2015 Plan due to constraints. We would like to be able to try to grow the Plan so that we can start to set aside money for maintenance projects and to fully fund our objectives – including the objectives of our Worldwide ministry.
- 5. Whether you pledge or not, please consider filling out and returning a Time and Talent survey. The Lord's blessings take many forms and we would love to have people participate in the Church community by doing things for which they have time and talent.

Finally, the three charges I laid out at the end of the presentation were to: 1) take and review the pledge packet; 2) think of any fundraisers that we may be able to do to also help bring in new people; and 3) invite friends or families that you may know. I would like to see a growth in the Church – more kids in Sunday School and more members of the Congregation. Christmas time may be a good time to do this but there may be other events that we can organize that might also help provide a good way to inspire people. Many people are looking for a spiritual home. Why not invite them to make CLC that home?


