Pastor's Message

Hmmmm....Let me see. So this is Black History Month (BHM) or is it the month when we are to remember the presidents of our nation? I can remember that two specific presidents were singled out to be remembered. They were Abraham placed by the evil of the day, the deception of Lincoln (on February 12th) and George Washington (on February 22). However the truth be told, Congress only made Washington's Birthday a federal holiday with some states recognizing Lincolns birthday for his work in preserving the nation. New York, the state of my birth and home, recognized both so schools were closed on both days. Today, the USA really only celebrates one Day. But I digress.

This is the month of the ground hog, although by the time you read this article that day will have passed because we have delayed the printing and distribution of this month's newsletter. The month is also the month of Valentine's Day. It seems to me we pack a lot into the shortest month of the vear. BUT MOST IMPORTANT OF ALL this month is the month in which LENT begins. One needs to engage in that community and to come to the communion where one can supply and receive such support.

The world in which we live is a beautiful one. Its Peace and Grace from God our Father and beauty is a sign of God's blessing toward all peo- the Lord Jesus Christ, ple. The world we live in is also a hostile one. It is one that reflects the evil one who first caused Eve and Adam to question the intention of the

God who formed them. It is one that is in conflict with itself as daily one reads about the absence of love in the many corners of our world. The love of God has been rethe truth as God would have us to know it. It is no wonder that we have problems in the various levels of living; globally, nationally, and within our own homes. Therefore our call is to consider how we, as baptized children of God, are going to travel our world and our community.

Lent gives us a season to focus upon our daily living. It gives opportunity to reflect upon what it means to be like Jesus. Lent gives us a time to ponder the proper way to live. In fact, the mid-week services will be based upon the theme, "Living Lent as People of the Resurrection." Of course we will be reminded about the cross, but we will view that theme through the lens of the life that was won because of it.

My hope, as it has been throughout my ministry, is that you will take advantage of all the things that will encourage you to walk with Jesus. My hope is that you will join us for the fellowship of soup and salad dinners and for the Bible studies that will take place before worship on Wednesday evenings during Lent. My hope is that you will accept the invitation to worship midweek

My hope is that you will encourage one another to be a part of Lent, a season that will extend into the month of March and that you will grow in faith as you uncover the mysteries of baptismal living.





Peter, James, and John had related to Jesus as a human for some time. In their life-changing journey to the Mount of Transfiguration, they came face to face with the reality that Jesus is God.

Bible Point: Jesus is God's Son.

Key Verse: John 1:14

February 14: Jesus Teaches About Rewards

Whether or not they're the exact hardships Jesus named, you can count on the fact that all of the adults in your group are currently going through a tough time or have in the last year or two. It's just a fact of life! This lesson will challenge adults to think of hard times differently—not as obstacles but as faith fertilizer.

Bible Point: Jesus blesses people who have faith.

Key Verse: Colossians 3:2

February 21: Jesus Teaches About Loving Enemies

To many adults the golden rule seems like something for children—something that doesn't apply to them. In reality, it's a biblical principle that can be applied to all relationships—at home, among friends, and in the workplace. As simple as it seems, the golden rule is anything but simple to live out in everyday life.

Bible Point: Jesus says to treat others as we want to be treated.

Key Verse: Luke 6:31

February 28: Jesus Teaches About Good Fruit



However, this lesson may awaken some people's insecurities about their salvation.

NEWS FROM OUR LITTLE CHERUBS...

We have been extremely busy this month in terms of Bible and School Curriculum...



We talked about Epiphany and taught the children the song ... EEE EPIPHANY Christ was born for all to see...EEE EPIPHANY The Wise men came to the Lord... EEE EPIPHANY Jesus died for all to see.

We have been focusing on Jesus Growing Up from a child to a young man. The children have a better understanding that Jesus was very much like them as he grew up. Both Pastor and Andy have been visiting the Preschool singing songs and going over lessons.




RITA STARK PRESENTS CHECK TO YOUTH...

JULY, 1863—GETTYSBURG, PENNSYLVANIA...

A folded sheet of paper was found on a Confederate soldier who died near the fabled Devil's Den. History books will never list his name, but his insight into prayer—and the God who hears and answers—endures like one of the monuments erected to commemorate the battles.

I asked God for strength, that I might achieve, I was made weak, that I might learn humbly to obey.

I asked for health, that I might do great things, I was given infirmity, that I might do better things.

I asked for riches, that I might be happy, I was given poverty, that I might be wise.

I asked for power, that I might have the praise of men, I was given weakness, that I might feel the need of God.

I asked for all things, that I might enjoy life, I was given life, that I might enjoy all things.

I got nothing that I asked for, but everything I had hoped for. Almost despite myself, my unspoken prayers were answered.

I am, among all men, most richly blessed.

The soldier's observations were not forged in an afternoon; they were forged over months of seeking God in prayer.

God is more concerned about the intent of your prayers than the content of your prayers. The soldier called out to God when he could have complained or cursed. God saw the soldier's heart and lavished his gifts on him.

God is open-handed out of love. God did not wait for the soldier to realize the wrong intent of his prayers. God responded out of his character. He is the One who does "immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to his power that is at work within us" (Ephesians 3:20 NIV).

Civil War coins, belt buckles, uniforms, and weapons have all but disappeared, but the words of this soldier have endured. They stand like a battlefield monument to remind all who read them of the character and heart of God. God is listening to your prayers and answering according to his plan for your life. He is working to bless you.


Prayers:


