Pastor's Message

What are you celebrating during the month of May? It is a good question as so many events happen in this particular month. Most people will probably affirm the fact that they will be celebrating Mothers' Day. It is an important day to consider because a mother's job is such an important calling in our world and culture. Mothers are usually seen as the nurturers; the people little ones and older ones go to for the daily necessities of life. This is not to say fathers are not important but let's face it when concern strikes for little ones the first word out of their mouths is often the word, "Mom!"

Moms have historically been the resident doctor, nurse, cook, dish washer, launderer, counselor, shopper, fashion consultant and sage. Moms are best friends while still being adult leaders and program directors. Simply put in today's verbiage "Moms Rock." So, yes, this day set aside for them is important and necessary to celebrate, just make sure you let mom celebrate with you by giving her the day off and going out to a restaurant.

I will not be here to celebrate the day with you. However, I will be in Stamford, New York to celebrate that day with a congregation that has special meaning for me. It was my first church located in a town of 1300 people. The name of the church is Trinity Lutheran Church. The congregation is celebrating its own birthday turning 50 this year and I was invited to join in the festivity of the day. It is a very small congregation in a very rural part of New York State, a place I fondly refer to as "Nowhere New York."

The church is 'hanging in there' offering ministry to those who come weekly for spiritual food and for Christian community. The deacon that serves the congregation faithfully comes all the way from Albany, New York, about an

York. It was displayed to remind the community hour and fifteen minutes away on a clear and church, the One Holy Christian and Apostolic Church that confesses one baptism, one faith and one Lord. It is that church upon which, so long ago, the Holy Spirit descended in tongues as of fire and ignited those gathered for ministry that continues this day all around our globe, from places like Cheshire, CT to Los Angeles, California, to Hanoi Viet Nam to St. Petersburg, Russia, to Rio







NEWS FROM OUR LITTLE CHERUBS...

Martha and I had a very busy month with the children. We were able to get all we wanted to accomplish done even with an April Vacation. Science was a very big focus for us this month since it is Spring. We spoke about plants needing sunlight, water and soil to grow. As an experiment we took three stalks of celery; one was put in a cup with water and placed in the closet; the second piece of celery was placed in the sunlight without water; and the third piece of celery was put in colored water and placed in the sunlight. The children are still in the process of seeing what happens to all three pieces of celery. So far we have seen that the celery that was placed in colored water turned the stalk RED. The one without the water in the sunlight is now wilted and the one in the closet without the sunlight but with water is still looking alive.

We talked about April Shower Brings May Flowers. Earth Day was explained and they made Earth Men. They also took a coffee filter and put blue and green stamps on it which were then sprayed with water to blend. Their hands were traced and placed so they are holding the Earth and the saying above was "He has the whole World in His Hands". For Liter Day they made trash bags out of lunch bags and decorated them. We talked about Reduce, Recycle, and Reuse.

A New song was taught about the Pussy Willow and they made their own pussy willow arrangement using Puffed Rice. I can not forget the Cherry Blossom. I brought in frosting and we colored it pink.' We baked Sugar Cookies. They spread the pink on the cookies and put Marshmallows on top to symbolize the Cherry Blossom.

Mother's Day is coming up so the children planted Marigold Seeds.

Bible time for the month had to do with Easter and we had the pleasure of Pastor and Andy coming into the Classroom.

All were kept very busy.


SUNDAY SCHOOL FOR MAY 2016...

May 1: Lydia is Converted

Many adults question their ability to share the gospel. Some worry about the reaction they may receive—and the impact that reaction may have on their ability to relate to neighbors, friends, or co-workers. Others feel inadequate to communicate the gospel message effectively. Yet Jesus' message is clear: We are to preach the gospel wherever we go, wherever we are. How can your class members overcome these obstacles and build confidence to tell others about Christ?

Bible Point: Be prepared to tell others about Jesus.

Key Verse: 2 Timothy 4:2



Salvation is a tricky subject for many adults. Those who were raised in a church or home where "doing the right thing" ruled supreme might mistakenly believe that their salvation is something to be attained by works. A performance-based societal tendency doesn't help to change this belief. Adults who had little or no church background may simply be confused by the concept of salvation—"Why would anyone want to save me?" they might wonder.

Bible Point: Jesus saves us. Key Verse: Acts 16:31

May 15: Paul Describes Living by God's Spirit

In our materialistic and technological world today, it's easy for adults to think they're self-sufficient and don't need God in their lives. However, nothing could be further from the truth.

Bible Point: When we live by God's Spirit, God changes us.

Key Verse: Galatians 5:22-23

May 22: Paul Describes Genuine Love

We all need love. This truth shouldn't be surprising, since God is love—and he created us! But the word love today has little meaning to many of us. One person says, "I love you." Another person says, "I love the color of your sweater." A third person says, "I love the snow." All around us, the word love is used in sexually oriented ways and to sell products. But the Bible is clear about what love is. Paul wrote about it in 1 Corinthians 13—the "love chapter."

Bible Point: God teaches us how to love.

Key Verse: 1 Corinthians 13:4-5

May 29: Jesus Tried and Crucified

People who wrestle with the question of what Jesus did for us land in one of two camps. In the first camp, people claim, "I'm not a bad person; Jesus didn't have to die for me." In the other, people cry, "I'm so much of a sinner—I don't deserve this gift!" Both responses illustrate an incomplete understanding of what Jesus did on the cross. Hopefully, this lesson will help to clarify what Jesus did for us...and why it's so important to accept his great gift.

Bible Point: Jesus died to take the punishment for our sins.




