Pastor's Message

It is March! It is Lent! This year the entire month of March will be an entire month of Lent. It was a time filled with new life, when all the I have mentioned somewhere before a quote from the lips of Garrison Keillor, "For Lutherans every day is Lent." But what is Lent? Is it a tone? Is it a season? Is it a way of living? Is it all of these or none of these things?

For those familiar with the season of the church year known as Lent the tone is quite somber. People start it off with a mark upon their foreheads that reminds them of the very finite nature of their lives. We are reminded that from "dust we have come and to dust we shall return". Now there is a statement to get one's morning started, the brief reminder that one day we are going to die. It is something common to all humanity and that bridges all of the divides within human community. Yes my friends, both Democrats and Republicans alike, not to mention all the others within the smaller parties as well as for those with no party allegiance, myself included, we are all going to die and during Lent we remember this fact, this truth.

It is a day spoiler, a nasty joy buster to know that Lent is about how fragile we all are. I imagine those who wanted a lift me up column may be disappointed given what I am writing about. However, I am writing about

Lent because it has a purpose and that purpose is to bring us all together to consider our plight and to seek refuge from it. I think we need to call an assembly, a community of worship together to hear the news that dust is not the final word, but rather more of a warning. For Lent is going to bring us to the final word. Actually the word itself comes from an old Anglo-Saxon word for Spring, Lenchten.

vegetation that had been buried under the winter's snow arose like something new and alive again. It was a time not to remember the old but to grasp the reality of a new day, a birth of a new season. This is the purpose of Lent, to prepare us to look forward to life because we are too familiar with the reality of death all around us.

I was reminded again today of now death's shadow covers our world. I heard to radio and was alerted by a text on out that a little girl was taken from her home and being transported in a Sonata to wherever the suspect was going to take her. At the time of writing, the little girl's mother was the victim of a vicious confrontation with the suspect's knife leaving her without life; a reminder of the reality wof death around us.

> Lent tells us to gather into community and there to approach God who is gracious and merciful, slow to anger and who abounds in steadfast love. This sounds to me like Good News, to gather the wagons and to center them on

the only one who can give us life, the one who promises life, who will indeed spend his life for us so that we might have life forever. So while death tries to silence our hopes we are to be busy hearing, and focusing in on how God wants to raise our hopes once more. The how is the story to be told during Lent. It is the story of God's love for us in the person of Jesus Christ.

NEWS FROM OUR STEWARDSHIP DEACON...

Thank you again for getting the Mission Plan off to a good start this year. Normally, my articles focus on pledging and contributions. This month I want to discuss another potential source of revenue. This one is essentially **free money**.

I am talking about **Thrivent Choice Dollars**. Many of you have accounts with Thrivent Financial. If you do, you should be eligible for Thrivent Choice Dollars. This is a program run by Thrivent whereby Thrivent members can direct where Thrivent's charitable outreach funds go. Cheshire Lutheran Church is an eligible organization to receive these funds. But CLC needs you to make sure you contact Thrivent and direct them to dedicate your 2016 Choice Dollars to CLC.

Regardless of whether you got a reminder in the mail or not, I ask you to please contact Thrivent and direct your dollars to be contributed to CLC. This program provides a couple thousand dollars to the Church but it could mean even more because only a percentage of members actually direct their funds. A significant percentage of members of CLC who are also Thrivent members never direct the funds at all (even to other organizations). Without the direction, your Choice Dollars will expire and not be distributed to any organization.

REMEMBER: You have to make a specific direction each year. They do not assume that your past directions are your current directions.

ahead. Thi and Ly, however, are less traditional, and so they were happy to welcome us as their first guests. After meeting up with Thi and Ly, we were invited to their ancestral house (nhà thờ họ). Wealthier families will often have this kind of building. While not a house per se, there is one member of the family (in this case a widow) who lives on the premises or nearby so as to take care of it. The building then becomes an ideal meeting place for death anniversaries of family members or other events

Inside the ancestral house is the family shrine, often times quite elaborate, set up to honor and worship the family's ancestors. On the ancestral altar are different offerings, from fruit to alcohol to paper money. After we arrived, we observed other family members coming in to the shrine area, lighting incense, and having a brief moment of prayer. After prayer, they were careful to exit without turning

After everyone assembled, we enjoyed a convivial and plentiful meal, including copious amounts of rice-wine and sticky rice cakes (bánh chưng). The toasting went on for hours. When finished, J.P. was pleasantly full of both food and drink. Thinking we were done for the day, we began preparing to gather our things to leave, only to be told that we would visit another house. That visit includ-




CALLING ALL MEN...




