NEWS FROM THE HOUSE AND GROUNDS DEACON...

Hello everyone, I'd like to take a few moments to fill you in on our church and parsonage.:

- Refrigerator—Earlier this summer our refrigerator in the church kitchen stopped working and needed to be replaced. We replaced it with a similar model that happened to be on sale, saving us a few hundred dollars.
- Defibrillator—This spring, the church council approved the purchase of an AED unit (defibrillator) for the church. It will be located next to the conference room/library
 - * Classes—I am in the process of setting up training classes this fall with more information to come
- Crèche Storage Shed—I would like to thank Joe Stark for the new shed out by the side parking lot for our creche that we set up each Christmas. Having a dedicated storage place for the creche will make set up and take down much easier and allow us to better preserve this beautiful display, thank you again Joe!

With Pastor Gustafson's retirement, the parsonage became my top priority to get it ready for our new pastor. Before pastor left we did a walk through and I made note of pastor's comments and recommendations. The house was in good shape but was in need of updating and some long over due cleaning. Since mid July we have been busy working to removed wallpaper and painting the kitchen, dining room, hall, upstairs hallway and all the bedrooms. We have cleaned all the windows, power washed the outside, removed 4 bushes and trimmed the rest, weeded all the gardens and taken down a rotting fence by the back deck. With a team of volunteers and many trips to the church and back to dump branches and stumps we removed a 40 foot pine tree that really opens up the front yard and lets the sun in and will help the grass grow. I am so impressed by all the work that has been done and by the wonderful support I have. I would like to thank everyone who has volunteered their time and muscles to help us and especially the following people who have been helping out not only on the weekends but also during the week; Ed Schwietzer, Tim Weiland, Dave and Sally Schrumm, Jim and Margie Mertz and Bill Sherman.

We still have a lot more to do such as replacing outlets, carpets, tiles and remodeling the basement and I will be reaching out for more help as the fall progresses but we are off to a great start. If anyone has carpentry, flooring or electrical skills, please reach out to me as we can especially use this type of expertise.

Thank you again to everyone that helps to keep our house and grounds in shape and looking beautiful, it is a wonderful reflection of our mission here at Cheshire Lutheran church.

In two weeks, the training program will conclude with a two day retreat in which students will have the opportunity to plan a small volunteer project and receive support from LCMS to implement it.
