PASTOR NUECHTERLEIN'S MESSAGE

THE FOUR MARKS OF THE CHURCH: ONE, HOLY, CATHOLIC, AND APOSTOLIC

Every year on November 1st we Christians celebrate the Feast of All Saints. If you were to try to summarize "All Saints Day" in one word, that one word would certainly be "church". All saints are the people the church is made up of, those of us who are still living here on earth AND those who have already died and gone to heaven. All of us who have been baptized, living or dead, belong to the communion of saints.

Unfortunately, in the minds of many people the word "church" does not conjure up the picture we'd like. When they hear the word "church", they may think of an institution that is concerned mostly with preserving itself rather than with helping them. Or they may think of a group of people who are continually squabbling – or who keep trying to dominate their private lives – or who pride themselves on being the one and only source for divine truth – or who are always asking for money.

The phrase "All Saints" rescues us from all those misconceptions. For it describes us from the perspective of what God has already done for us through His Son's death and resurrection – and what He is still doing for us now. The phrase "All Saints" brings to mind images of holiness and heavenliness and purity and joy. But how can we keep saying, as we do in the creeds, that the church is "one, holy, catholic, and apostol-

ic" – in view of everything we know about the church as it really is. Are we deceiving ourselves?

No, we're not! Even as we know one another's faults, yet choose to focus on one another's strengths – even as parents know the worst about their children, yet choose to see and think of them at their best – so our God chooses to see us as one day we SHALL BE, even though He and we know that time has not vet come. Advertisers like to use the word "heavenly" and the phrase "a taste of heaven" – in order to get us to buy their products. But the truth is, this side of the grave we're not yet capable of experiencing what heaven uis really like. Still, under the influence and guidance of God's Holy Spirit, we keep trying. And in Holy Communion we are even privileged to receive and share a foretaste of the life of the world to come.

The church into which each of us was baptized is indeed one, holy, catholic, and apostolic. For the time being we're in the division known as the church militant; that is, we're still doing battle against sin and death and the devil. But because we've been baptized, our names are written not only in the congregation's Parish Register but also in the Lamb's



MEET OUR MISSIONARIES...

J.P. and Aimee serve in northern Vietnam, where the LCMS has carried out human care and education projects for over 20 years. J.P. and Aimee work with local partners in developing and implementing community development projects in rural areas. They have also established a social enterprise to reach out to young families in the city. Moreover, J.P. and Aimee facilitate and oversee GEO personnel who teach EFL in universities in and around Hanoi, as well as short-term service teams from the United States and Asia.

J.P. was born and raised in Richmond, Va., received his undergraduate degree in theology from Lenoir-Rhyne College in North Carolina and received his Master of Divinity from Concordia Seminary, St. Louis, Mo., after serving in Vietnam for two years as a vicar. Aimee (Crawford) was born in Tulsa, Okla., and raised in Richmond, Va. She has both a bachelor's and a master's degree in dietetics from James Madison University in Virginia. J.P. and Aimee have two daughters — Celeste, born in March 2007, and Isabella, born in August 2009 and one Son, Isaac born this year in Vietnam.

In June we reported about a workshop offered by LCMS at Play! café, in partnership with Blue Dragon Children's Foundation, to teach kids about personal safety. Since this first workshop, we have done TWO MORE workshops, each time with more than 100 registrations! For the sake of quality we've limited the workshop to 25 children each time. We plan to offer at least 3 more workshops this year to meet the huge demand. Personal safety is an increasingly important topic for parents in Vietnam, with growing awareness of child abuse and persistent problems related to human trafficking. Kids traced their bodies on a piece of paper, and were then asked to identify different parts of the body. The instructor from Blue Dragon then helped the kids distinguish between parts of the body that others can touch, and other parts that remain private. If someone should touch their private parts, kids practiced how to assertively say, "no!" These simple lessons cannot be taken for granted in developing Vietnam.


SUNDAY MORNING COFFEE HOUR VOLUNTEERS NEEDED...






HOPE PREGNANCY CENTER...
