PASTOR'S MESSAGE

CHESHIRE LUTHERAN CHURCH

"Alleluia! Christ is Risen! He is Risen Indeed! Alleluia!"

I know that Easter Sunday has come and gone, but the season of Easter still remains. The Easter acclamation has been used in our service and sermon every Sunday since April 1, and it will continue to be used for the remainder of the Easter season. (Are you tired of hearing and reading it yet?) In case you are wondering, the season runs for fifty days from Easter Sunday (April 1) through Ascension Day (forty days after Easter – May 10), until the Feast of Pentecost (May 20). On that day we will remember how the Holy Spirit descended upon the Disciples as tongues of fire and giving them the gift of speaking in foreign languages. We will also be celebrating the fact that six young women and men of our congregation will be making their Confirmation that day.

Pentecost Sunday will also be the first Sunday wherein you will not hear Pastor speak the Easter acclamation, "Alleluia! Christ is Risen! He is Risen Indeed! Alleluia!" But even though I may not speak the words that Sunday, the truth that they proclaim remains. As the Apostle Paul reminded the Christians in Rome, so he reminds you and me as well, "We know that Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him." (Romans 6:9 ESV). And that is Good News that we need to hear, even when Easter Sunday is long past.

It doesn't matter if Easter was six days ago, six weeks ago, or six months ago, we still need that Good News. We still need it, because all too often life brings us news that is anything but good. Whether it is news that impacts you personally and directly, news about a family member/friend/coworker, or news that comes over the tv/radio/smartphone/tablet. Bad news comes, and it can rend our hearts and even our lives. When that happens, we need the Good News of Easter most of all.

The Good News of Easter, "Praise God! Christ is Risen! Christ is Truly Risen! Praise God!", is what gives light to us in the midst of darkness, hope in the midst of despair, joy in the face of sadness. Christ being raised form the dead is the only thing that will bring true healing and peace to our lives and to our world. Politicians can make as many laws as they want, but they will not change people's hearts and minds. Students can leave classes and protesters can hold demonstrations, but they will not stop sin and sickness and death from having power over us. Only Christ Jesus can make a difference – only His cross, His tomb, His resurrection.

> In Christ Jesus we do have light and life, hope and joy; He sees us through all the bad times, the sorrow, the pain, the sickness, and even the death. Just as He is risen from the dead, never to die again, so He brings each of us too through death and the grave to that life that does not end. It's the Easter message, the Easter Acclamation – the Good News that Jeysus really is risen, God be praised, and we will be too.

Unfortunately, all too often the news that we hear and read in our lives is bad – problems here, there, and everywhere. It can be so overwhelming at times that we forget the Easter mes-

sage, the Easter Acclamation. And that is why we come to Church Sunday after Sunday, not because the message is going to change, but because in our ever-changing world it is the one thing that stays the same. So, come to church this Sunday, next Sunday, every Sunday. Be reminded of what you may have forgotten and hear the words that give us hope.

"Alleluia! Christ is Risen! He is Risen Indeed! Alleluia!"

NEWS FROM OUR HOUSE AND GROUNGS DEACON...

I would like to start my newsletter by recognizing and giving a great big thank you to some members of our congregation for their donations recently. To Don Drust for donating a new buffer for laminate floor and for replacing all the florescent lights in the common room and kitchen. Not only is the room brighter, but the floors look amazing! To Curt and Karen Smith for donating their vacuum and to Beth and Bill Soulier for donating a new wet/dry vac to the church. Both donations are greatly appreciated! If anyone would like to donate any other tools or appliances to the church, please let me know, thanks.

On April 21st, we had our annual outside cleanup of the church. The flower beds were weeded and raked, bushes were trimmed, leaves were raked, the butterfly garden was raked, weeded and cleaned and the driveway was swept/blown. A big thank you to all that helped, the church and grounds look beautiful!

The project to replace the church sign is moving along. We have a preliminary design and I hope to have it finalized by May with installation sometime in June or July. The new sign will be larger than our current one and more visible from the road. The sign will also include Little Cherubs so they will have a presence out front also.

Some upcoming projects that will happen over the next few months:

- The dishwasher in the kitchen was leaking and we had a plumber come out to look. They replaced the water line, but we also need to replace the solenoid valve. I will be working with some of the other members of the house and grounds committee to determine if we can fix ourselves, have an appliance person fix it or just get a new dishwasher. More to come.
- There was water coming in by the sliding doors at the back of the sanctuary and one of the big windows in Little Cherubs. We think it should just be a matter of doing some caulking to correct the problem.
- There are a few broken stained-glass windows; I will be looking to replace them now that the weather is getting better. I will keep you all informed.
- Joanne and Martha mentioned Little Cherubs would like to improve their playground with some new playscapes and re-do their sandbox area. We will be working with them on ideas and I'm sure I will be looking for volunteers to help make improvements. Stay tuned.

Lastly, I would like to thank all the church mice for all the work that is done behind the scenes every day. Ed Schweizer and Tim Wieland get the first calls when something goes wrong and usually fix it before I even know about it. David Schrumm probably knows every inch of the church and is always making little fixes here and there on things you don't even notice but make a big difference in the long run. Jim and Margie Mertz who keep our gardens weeded and beautiful all year long. Carol Santoro who makes sure all the yearly inspections and services are done, handles all the bills and service calls and generally keeps me on my toes. NEWS FROM OUR YOUTH DEACON...

Dear Parents of Teenagers,

Thank You for all you do to invest in the life of your teenager(s). You probably feel like an uber driver (ready to pick them up/drop them off when they call), coach (helping them perfect their sport), tutor (helping with them on homework), guidance Counselor (preparing them for the future) and, sometimes, a jockey (pushing them to cross the finish line...without a whip of course!)...all wrapped up in one! That's why, with all the insane busyness of parenting a teen, it's easy to let youth group attendance slide off the grid. It's tempting to think, "My kid's just too busy for a night of hanging out with other teenagers, playing some goofy games and hearing another Bible lesson."

Believe me when I say, I understand the temptation. As a parent of a wonderful daughter (who has tons of homework, takes Karate and is not yet old enough to drive) my fiancé and I are constantly under pressure to measure every event through the lenses of what matters most. We have decided that her continued Christian education outside of the weekly sermon is most important. Although we view ourselves as the primary spiritual influence of our daughter, we also believe that a strong youth ministry plays a vital role in her overall spiritual development.

With this as a backdrop here are 5 short, yet powerful, reasons you should encourage (make?) your teenager(s) go to youth group:

1. Teenagers need models and mentors.

"O God, You have taught me from my youth, And I still declare Your wondrous deeds. And even when I am old and gray, O God, do not forsake me, Until I declare Your strength to this generation, Your power to all who are to come. " Psalm 71:17,18

Of course you as a parent are called to be the primary spiritual mentor of your own children but he/she also needs other Godly adults! It's important for your son or daughter to see that this whole "Christianity thing" is more than just mom's and dad's belief system. They need to have models and mentors that reinforce all of the spiritual truth they are learning from you.

2. Teenagers need community.

"And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching." Hebrews 10:24,25

In an age of bullying, gossip, slander and hatefulness (which can destroy a teenager's selfidentity), young people need other young people who can lift them up, encourage them and challenge them in all the right ways. Youth group is also a place where teenagers can discover their spiritual gifting and begin to use it to serve others. This will help them have a heart to selflessly serve others for the rest of their lives!

3. Teenagers need a mission.

When Jesus challenged his most-likely teenaged disciples to "go and make disciples of all nations", he was tapping into the activist wiring of these young men. In the same way your teenager needs to be challenged with the mission to reach their peers with the good news of Jesus in a loving and contagious way.

Youth group is a place where your teenager can invite their unbelieving friends to hear the gospel. But it's also a place where they can be equipped to share the good news of Jesus with their own peers (which will help them grow in their faith!) As your youth leaders continue to build a Gospel Promoting ministry the message of Jesus will advance in them and through them. These activities will accelerate the discipleship process in the life of your teen in ways you could never imagine!

4. Teenagers need theology.

"Then we will no longer be immature like children. We won't be tossed and blown about by every wind of new teaching. We will not be influenced when people try to trick us with lies so clever they sound like the truth. Instead, we will speak the truth in love, growing in every way more and more like Christ, who is the head of his body, the church." Ephesians 4:14,15

Youth group is a place where teenagers can wrestle through the theology you've been teaching them (you've been teaching them right?) and have it reinforced in a powerful and personal way under the guidance of a youth leader who knows how to ask great questions and point teens to sound truth.

This should result in your teenagers knowing and owning their faith on a deeper level. Youth groups and small groups should be a place where teenagers can ask tough questions and even share doubts and struggles with their beliefs without fear of rebuke. Skilled youth leaders can take questioning teens back to God's Word as the source of authority and help them process through all of the Biblical truth you are praying they grasp, Believe and live out.

Great youth groups build on the foundation that Godly moms and dads have laid. And, for those teenagers who don't have believing parents, an effective youth ministry helps lay a solid foundation of Biblical truth for the rest of a teenager's life.

5. Teenagers need a safe place to confess and confide.

"Confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed." James 5:16

Often teenagers who struggle with sin and temptation have nowhere to confess and confide. They feel trapped by their sins. But a healthy youth ministry can create a safe space for teenagers to open up and talk honestly about their struggles. Of course this doesn't mean they should confess every sin to everyone. But it does mean that they should have a handful of others who know their struggles and can pray for and encourage them to walk in victory over those sins.

I often overhear my daughter confiding in adults she trusts outside the household. As we as parents often enforce rules and guidelines upon our children, it can be hard for our children to confide in us as they fear there will be consequences. For the parents reading this, I challenge you to look back at your youth and think of a time where you were scared to confide in your own parents.

An effective youth ministry can help teenagers deal with these challenges now and prepare them to be victorious both now and later.

Food for Thought?

Yes, I know that teen life is busy. But it would be a shame if our teenagers graduated from high school and were catapulted into "the real world" without every opportunity to know, live, share and own their faith in Jesus Christ.

At the end of the day, our teenagers embracing and embodying the Christian faith is more important than sports and more important than academics. Getting them involved in a healthy, vibrant youth ministry is worth fitting into a crazy, busy schedule. And if it's not quite as healthy as you think it should be then why don't you volunteer and make it better?

There's too much at stake for us to get this wrong. So let's get it right!
