Pastor's Message

"And [Jesus] awoke and rebuked the wind and said to the sea, 'Peace! Be still!' And the wind ceased, and there was a great calm. And He said to [the disciples], 'Why are you so afraid? Have you still no faith?" Mark 4:39-40 (ESV)

I had never heard the sound before and I will tell you the truth: It scared me. The sound was the noise of the Emergency Alert System, but the television was off. The sudden, ear-splitting sound came from my phone, but not just my phone – from my wife's as well. We were both startled and scared, first by the noise and then by the message that followed "Tornadoes - Take Shelter IMMEDIATE-LY." We called our daughter down from her room, and, like so many others, we hurried down into the basement. Grabbing the dog by the collar and leading him down with us, we all sat on the steps as first the sky went dark, then the power went out, and then we heard the sound of the wind and the rain. Sitting in the dark on the steps, I prayed.

We waited for the weather advisory from the national weather service to lift before we ventured out of the basement. As we waited. the fear and anxiety slowly turned to annovance and frustration when the advisory was extended. When the storm finally passed, the parsonage was without power, some branches and small trees had been damaged along the tree line (well away from the house), and part of the neighbor's tree had come down in the far corner of the property – aside from that, we were okay. Once the power came back late in the evening, things mostly got back to normal; however, many people were not so fortunate. For several days the news reported widespread power outages, damage to automobiles and to homes, roads blocked, and communities isolated.

Wherever people lived and whatever level of impact the storm had on them, there was one thing that just about everyone had in common – FEAR. We reacted with fear when news of the tornadoes came. We sat in fear in basements, in ground-floor hallways, and even in cars parked along the side of the road. We were afraid of the wind and the weather, afraid of the damage it might do and the injury it might cause. Just like the disciples, we were afraid.

They had been traveling in a boat with Jesus, out on the Sea of Galilee. The Lord slept on a cushion in the back of the boat while the disciples set out into the lake. Suddenly a great windstorm arose, and the winddriven waves were crashing into the boat and causing it to fill with water. The disciples ran to the Lord and woke Him up, imploring Him to help them. He responded by first rebuking the wind and the waves, and then by rebuking the disciples. He was right there with them, so there was no reason for them to be afraid. In their fear over the danger that they faced, they forgot whom it was, exactly, ythat went with them on the way.

There are times in life when we too face danger, whether from weather or war, turmoil or terrorism, and we also become afraid. As did the first disciples, our normal response to the danger we face is fear. Just like the twelve, we too forget whom it is that goes with us on the way. Jesus is with you ALWAYS, whatever the danger of difficulty you may face in your life, and He will never leave you or forsake you. You were joined to Him in Holy Baptism, and He to you, and there is nothing in this world that will ever separate you from Him.

Since Jesus is with you, there is nothing that you need fear. God Himself goes with you in all your ways, and He will guard and keep





Carol Weinshel of Fairfield has supported over 35,000 soldiers from her house, primarily with Combat Aviation Brigades (CABs). These soldiers have been deployed numerous times with the 159th, 82nd, 101st, 16th and 1st CAB. Currently, she has adopted a headquarters unit from the 1st Infantry Division, the 82nd CAB, a special operations group and a combined joint task force from the 3rd Infantry Division. 



Thou prepareth a table before me In the presence of mine enemies.


Thou anointest my head with oil, my cup runneth over.




