#### PASTOR'S MESSAGE

"And while they were there, the time came for her to give birth. And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped Him in swaddling cloths and laid Him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn." Luke 2:6-7 (ESV)

Every Christmas morning when I was growing up, my family would drive from Connecticut to my Grandparents' house down in Baldwin, NY, near the south shore of Long Island, and we'd usually stay with them until just after New Year's. The six of us from CT were not their only houseguests for the holidays, however; there was

also my Great-grandmother (who lived with them permanently), my Aunt and Uncle from Indiana, and a collection of other

family & friends who seemed to take turns staying with them. If you're doing the math, that's 11 family members, plus assorted guests, all crammed into one house

and it was not a large house. It was common for there to be several people crammed into rooms, four kids sharing one bed, and people sleeping on the "hide-a-bed" couches in the living room and the den. Once everyone had arrived, there was no place for anyone else.

Bethlehem must have looked like that when Mary and Joseph arrived that first Christmas; not only was the family home packed with relatives, but the whole town would have been packed with people. They had come from every corner of Israel, and possibly even further away, all because of the Roman census ordered by the Emperor Augustus Caesar. Every nook and cranny of the town was filled with distant relatives, and the only space left for pregnant Mary and her husband was the stable with it's manger. (For a modern referent, think "out in the garage.") With all of those people, there was just no place for them.

We all have times in life when it feels like there is no place for us. Sometimes it's a situation where there is physically no room, no place for us – a loaded car pool, a full table, a hotel that has no vacancies. Other times, the problem that is we just don't fit in, we just don't belong – it can happen at work, at school, or even at home. We look around at everything going on and at all the people around, searching for the place that is right for us, but no matter how hard we look, there is simply none to be found. I think we have

all felt that way at one point or another; you may even be feeling that way right now.

To anyone who has ever felt that there was no place for them, please know that is

why the Christ-child

came. He came FOR YOU, to make a place especially for you – not in some car or hotel, at a table or a workplace, or even in society or

your family. He came to make a place for you in Heaven, a place for you before the throne of God with all the saints and angels. Jesus left His place at the right hand of the Father to be born of the Virgin's womb, all to prepare a place just for you with Him. The one who had to be born in the garage because there was no place for Him made sure that there is a perfect place for you with Him forever. (He even tells us this explicitly in John 14.)

The Babe of Bethlehem was born for you and there is now a place for you with Him in Heaven forever. There is also a place for you here at CLC. It doesn't matter if you come once a week, once a month, or once a year; it doesn't even matter if you've only come once in the last decade. There is always a place for you here, and you are welcome any time. Here there is companionship with



Also, at the Voters' Assembly meeting, the following individuals were elected as our officers for 2019: President: Steve Feero, Vice-President: Vickie DePaolo; Recording Secretary: Terri Daly; Financial Secretary: Guy Mason; and Treasurer: Karen Smith. In addition, Andy Clark was elected for another 3-year term as our House and Grounds deacon. They will be installed in early January.

At our Thanksgiving Eve service, the Letter of St. Paul to the Philippians included "I have learned the secret of facing plenty and hunger, abundance and want. I can do all things in him who strengthens me." As Pastor Rowold added, "For that we give thanks". As we approach the end of 2018, our progress toward our 2018 financial Mission Plan is falling short of our offerings goal of \$285,000 by approximately \$16,900 as of October 31st. More specifically, if we divide that among 135 givers, that amounts to \$125 per giver. So, with that in mind, I am again encouraging all our members to prayerfully respond in thanksgiving for His blessings to finish our 2018 Mission Plan as close to 100% as we can.

Upcoming official meetings include our next CLC Council meeting which will be held on Tuesday, December 4<sup>th</sup> and our Annual Congregational Meeting which will be held following our worship services on Sunday January 13<sup>th</sup>.

Please keep in mind that the Advent and upcoming Christmas seasons may provide opportunities for you to invite a friend or neighbor to join you for a worship service, Bible study or fellowship event at CLC.



## NEED TO GET INFORMATION TO CERTAIN MEMBERS OF OUR CONGREGATION?





#### NEWS FROM OUR LITTLE CHERUBS...

I Can't believe that Thanksgiving has come and gone. Where have the days gone?

Little Cherubs Christian Preschool registered a 3 year old for the Fall of 2019 on November 14, 2018. Hooray, it was by word of mouth.

The beginning of November started with Teddy Bears. We finished up with the 3 year olds sharing their favorite animal / teddy bear and got to wear PJ's to school. The 3's learned how to play Duck, Duck Goose" and "What Time Is It Mr. Fox". They learned about the letter I and number 8. The Bible studies consisted of Moses and the Red Sea. Both classes conducted an experiment parting the Sea right before their eyes.

Since the Election was around the corner Miss Martha showed them what it meant to vote for someone or something. They did it with crackers - Ritz vs Saltines. The Ritz's won out.

The second week of November they learned about HIBERNATION and the animals that hibernate. The letter of the week was J and the number was number 9. In Bible they learned about Manna in the desert.

Some of the stories that were read were "Don't Wake the Bear" and "Where Fish go – Hamilton Duck"

The children learned about the life cycle of the Spider. The 4's made webs by rolling a marble on top of a piece of black paper in a box. White drops of paint were placed on top of the paper and they rolled the marble around to create their own spider web. Then they made spiders and put them in their web. The 4's played musical chairs and learned what the limbo was. What fun. We have been practicing Number Bingo, Letter Bingo and Shape and Color Bingo.

Veteran's Day was explained to the children and they created a badge in honor of time served by the veterans. The Bible for the week of the 11<sup>th</sup> was Joshua and Jericho. We learned about words that began with letter K and we did number 10. For story time "One Little, Two Little, Three Little Pilgrims".

We had a special time with Cheshire's New Children's Librarian. Her name is Emily and she is visiting both the 3's and 4's.

Since Thanksgiving was upon us they learned about the Native Americans, the Pilgrims, about the Mayflower, how many people were on the boat and how long it took them to get to Plymouth Rock. Also, they made the Pilgrim Table and had read to them "My Thankful Heart". They also made Cornucopia's and Indian corn. The 3's made Corn Muffins. Boy were they good.

The week of Thanksgiving in the Bible we studied all about David and Goliath. We learned about the Letter L and what words begin with the letter L. The last week of November the theme was winter changes. Art was Birds Fly South and Lady bugs in winter. The stories were "A Bed for the winter", "Goodnight Friends and much more. They moved onto Letter M and the number 11. The Bible for this week was Jonah & The Big Fish.

We have enjoyed Pastor playing games with us when he hears us in the Assembly Room. The children have enjoyed Pastor coming into class every Wednesday and Thursday. He has just molded into our routine. We love how he goes over with the children all that they have done on that day and after he is done with Bible he instructs the children what to do next. On the days we are going out he helps us get the children bundled. I must say Pastor Rowold is a great addition to our School.

So, you relived our month at Little Cherubs Christian Preschool. I hope you enjoyed all that we did.



O come, Thou Dayspring, come and cheer Our spirits by Thine advent here Disperse the gloomy clouds of night And death's dark shadows put to flight



When God Winks at You: How God Speaks Directly to You through the Power of Coincidence by Squire Rushnell






