PASTOR'S MESSAGE

"Your Word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path." Psalm 119:105 (ESV)

A couple of weeks ago we had a problem with the power at the parsonage. For a few minutes the lights flickered, first going dim and then brightening up; then suddenly they went out completely. About a minute later the power came back on, only to go out again right away. After five minutes the lights came back on and stayed on. At the time, we had no idea how long it would last, so we set about making sure we could get to our flashlights if it happened again. Most were exactly where they should be, and their batteries worked just fine, but not all of them. Our large camp lantern, which we used last

we still don't know where it ended up).

Flashlights and lanterns are great tools to have; whether you're camping with family, walking back to your car with friends after watching fireworks, or moving around inside your house during a power outage, they provide us light in the dark. These tools help us to see where we are going and keep us from getting injured in the dark. (Anyone who has stubbed their toe on the way to or from the bathroom at night knows

help in an emergency. Yes, flashlights are great tools to have, but only if you use them. If they're lost, inoperable, or we simply forget to use them, then they do us no good.

that I mean.) We can even use them to call for

Just as a flashlight or lantern provides you light so that you can see your way in the dark, God's Word provides you light to show you the way in our world. It helps you to see where you're going with your life and keeps you from getting injured in the darkness of sin. You can even use the Word as a source of help in an emergency. Yes, the Word of God is a wonderful blessing to have, but only if you actually use it. Sadly, many of us do not use it very often. Most of the people reading this article right now probably have a Bible, perhaps even more than one, but do you know where it is? If you do, when was the last time that you picked it up and read it? (And I'm not talking about the last time you used it to look up a passage for one reason or another; I'm talking about reading a section of Scripture, and then thinking

and praying about it.) Or when was the last time you attended a Bible study?

All too often, the Bibles that we have spend the vast majority of their time sitting on a coffee table or in a book shelf, and, if they get picked up at all, it's either to move it out of the way so that we can put something else there or so that we can clean the dust off of it. Sure, we can truthfully say that we have a Bible, but it does us no real good if we don't use it. In fact, that

begs a question; how much of the Bible have you read? Are you one of the folks who has read the whole thing from cover to cover, or are you part of the large group of Christians who just uses the Bible as a reference book (like a dictionary, thesaurus, or encyclopedia) when you want information or the answer to a question?

I will confess that I have not read the whole book cover to cover. I know, I know, as a pastor I should have read the whole thing by now. I've actually started to do it a number of times, but I've got all kinds of reasons and excuses as to why I didn't succeed. It's not just pastors, though, who really should have ready the whole Bible; every Baptized and Confirmed Christian should be able to say that they have done it, at least one time, if not more. So, I'd like to challenge you: Join me in reading through the whole Bible over the next two years! You don't have

to come to a Bible study or do it at a certain time of day. You can read it when and where you want and use whatever version or format that works best for you.

To aid us in this challenge, there are copies of a two-year Bible reading plan available at the back of Church and on the counter outside the Church office. It breaks the whole Bible up over a total of 105 weeks (just over two years), with one reading a day from Monday through Saturday of each week. The plan even gives a day off, with no reading on Sunday; you could also use that break to catch up on your reading if you missed a day during the week. I invite you to take a copy of the plan and use it, or use



ementia DEMENTIA FRIENDS USA...

A Dementia Friends Information session will be held at CLC on Tuesday, February 19, 2019 @ 1:30 PM. Dementia Friends USA is a global movement that is changing the way people think, act, and talk about dementia. Developed by the Alzheimer's Society in the United Kingdom, the Dementia Friends initiative is underway in the USA. By helping everyone in a community understand what dementia is and how it affects people, each of us can make a difference for people touched by dementia.

An Information Session is a face-to-face session that lasts approximately one hour (60 minutes) and is run by a Dementia Friends Champion or a pair of Champions. It covers the five key messages everyone should know about dementia through activities and discussion, but the session is not a formal training. Dementia Friend Champions, Vicki DePaolo and OT Students from Quinnipiac University will be presenting this informative session. Everyone is welcome; feel free to invite a friend to come along. When God Winks at You: How God Speaks Directly to You through the Power of Coincidence by Squire Rushnell


