#### Pastor's Message

"Many are the plans of a man's heart, but the Lord's purpose will prevail." Proverbs 19:21

So, how was your Summer? Did you go anywhere on vacation? Did you accomplish everything that you wanted to?

If you're anything like me, you approached the Summer months with all kinds of plans. Mine were to finally get the parsonage set the way we wanted and go through any and every box still left from our move last year. I also planned to spend some time relaxing with my family. I had books I planned to read and a number of other things I intended to do. As the Summer draws to a close, I look back at all my plans, and see that I didn't really accomplish any of them – at least not in the way I had planned.

Sure, we made progress on things at the parsonage, but we're still not where I wanted to be. (There are still boxes not emptied, but I don't want to talk about that.) I spent time with my family, including a wonderful time with an Aunt and Uncle who decided to visit Connecticut from the Midwest at the last minute, but the hurried pace of a short stay by out of town guests is not exactly relaxing. And as for those books, well, let's just pretend I never said anything about having books I wanted to read.

As it turns out, God had some very different plans for me. During the Summer I visited with CLC members in my office, in their homes, in hospitals, in rehab, in nursing homes, and in hospice. I had meetings with volunteers, committees, Deacons, and prospective members. I presided at a funeral and then a baptism a little over a week later. I had the unique experience of getting some of our young men and women together to paint the Youth Room. Many of those things were not in the plans that I made for So, did your Summer go according to plan? what I was going to do over the Summer, but they were what the Lord had in mind.

Throughout our lives we make plans: what job

we want to have, where we want to live, what we'd like to do on our vacation, and all the rest. Sometimes life goes according to plan, and what we wanted is what ends up happening. Often, however, life does not go as planned and we are left doing the best we can to adjust to the circumstances.

When circumstances cause our plans in life to change, it can be frustrating and annoying if its due to something minor or petty. It can even be downright disheartening and discouraging when plans change because of major difficulties or calamities. It's easy to become overwhelmed when all your plans have gone out the window and you are left to try to make sense of things.

> It's happened to me, and that's when I first came across the passage from Proverbs 19 above: "Many are the plans of a man's heart, but the Lord's purpose will prevail." These words brought me great comfort at a time when circumstances in life were out of my control. We are not in charge of things; God is. Even when what we want or expect or plan in life is left in total chaos, God's will for you is moving right along as planned. His purpose for you is not hampered or hindered by any of the roadblocks, detours, or speedbumps in life.

When your life does not go as planned, remember Proverbs 19:21. God continues to work out His plan for you, even if yours are in shambles. His purpose in Christ Jesus is to bring you back to Himself, forgive your sins, and give you everlasting life with Him. Nothing in this life will thwart His purpose, because Jesus already did to all for you on


Jean was the organist at the Cheshire Lutheran Church for over 30 years prior to her retirement.


