
"The grass withers, the flower fades, but broken and hurting. You can hope in ing life is yours, even when faced with loss.

Monthly look for tips and information. Note that the AED (Automatic External Defibrillator) & First Aid kit has been placed on the wall outside the Library.

It's October. TIME TO GET YOUR FLU SHOT!!!

- 1. Everyone 6 months and older need to be vaccinated.
- 2. Now is the time to get your shot. It takes 2 weeks to build immunity.
- 3. Why every year? Viruses change quickly so last year shot will not work.
- 4. The Flu shot will not give you the flu.

Prevention for Colds and Flu.

- 1. Wash your Hands with soap and water.
- 2. Use alcohol base sanitizer if soap and water not available
- 3. Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth
- 4. Cover your mouth when coughing
- 5. Practice good health habits. Get plenty sleep, exercise, drink fluids, eat a nutritious diet, and manage stress.
- 6. If you are feeling sick stay home.




