It's that time of year again. It's time for the day when we gather together as a family, look back at all that has happened, and remember with gratitude all the blessings we have received. It's time for...ALL SAINTS' SUNDAY. If you thought I was going to say "Thanksgiving," it's okay. Our nation does many of the same things on Turkey Day that our Church does on All Saints' Day. Yet centuries before the first Thanksgiving was celebrated on the shores of this continent, the Christian Church began commemorating All Saint's Day on November 1.

All Saints' is that day when we gather together and remember all of the faithful people of God who have come before us, all the people who lived and died believing that our Lord Jesus Christ died on the cross to take away their sins. Those saints include people like the Apostles of our Lord from the New Testament, the Prophets and Patriarchs recorded in the Old Testament, and the faithful people of God from the centuries between Bible times and today. It even includes people like your deceased Great Grandma Schmidt, or Smith, or Sullivan, or whatever her name was.

Saints aren't just those people who seemed to live super holy lives and have officially been given the title "saint" by some denomination somewhere. Saints are regular, ordinary people like you and me. What makes you a saint is not how holy your life might look to other people, but how holy Jesus made you in God's sight by shedding His blood on the cross (and that is completely and perfectly holy – in case you were wondering). In Christ Jesus, each and every believer is a saint, even if your life hasn't always been perfectly holy.

At Church on Sunday, November 3, we're going to be remembering all the saints of God. We're going to celebrate with them and give thanks for the forgiveness of sins that God has given to every one of us in Christ Jesus. Please notice that I said we are going to celebrate <u>WITH</u> them – with all of those who have gone before us in the faith. When we gather for worship, we're joining together with all the saints of every genera-

tion, from the Patriarchs and Prophets to the Apostles to the Reformers to your Great Grandparents, and it's not just on All Saints' Day.

Every time we gather together to celebrate the Sacrament of Holy Communion we gather together with all the angels and archangels, with all the hosts of heaven and that includes each and every member of the great cloud of witnesses that surrounds us, all the faithful saints who are with the Lord. As you kneel or stand at the altar, you are there with every faith-"ful child of God of every time and every place. You are bound up in that great cloud of witnesses as we all receive together the very body and blood of our Lord and Savior Jesus the Christ. Every faithful loved one that you miss, whether because they have died or moved far away, is there with you at the rail.

This November is the month we gather to remember and give thanks. As we start the month, we'll gather at CLC for All Saints' Sunday to rejoice with that great cloud of witnesses in all the spiritual blessings that God has bestowed on our Church and His people. As we close out the month we'll gather with our loved ones for Thanksgiving (both in our homes on that Thursday and at CLC the night before), to rejoice in all the material blessings God has bestowed on our *(Continued on page 5)*



#### HOW WOULD YOU LIKE TO HAVE THANKSGIVING DINNER WITH THE ENTIRE CONGREGATION?

I know, as much as the idea might appeal to some, there's no way to have Thanksgiving Dinner with every member of CLC. We don't have the space to prepare enough food to feed everyone, and we don't have enough space for everyone to sit down to eat at the same time. On top of that, even though I know we love each other in Christ, I'm also sure many people would prefer to spend Thanksgiving at home with their families. But what if I told you there was a way that you could, in a small way, share your Thanksgiving table with the whole congregation? Well there is.

Once again, this year we're going to have a loaf exchange at our Thanksgiving Eve Service. By including these loaves of bread on our Thanksgiving tables we can, in a symbolic way, share the meal with our wider family of faith.



Little Cherubs has been very busy throughout the month of October.

#### 3 year old class:

Our themes were:

- ✤ Fall Changes
- ✤ Fall & Harvest
- ✤ Fire Safety Week
- ✤ Pumpkins & Fall
- ✤ Fall/Costume Day/ Teddy Bears

We worked on Letters E, F, G, H, I and on Numbers 4, 5, 6, 7, 8.

Bible- Topics: "Noah", "Joseph Forgives", "Baby Moses", "Moses & The Burning Bush", "Moses Parts the Red Sea".

Stories: "I am a Leaf", "Leaves, Leaves", "Great Acorn Mystery", "Apples and Pumpkins", No Dragons for Tea", "Clifford the Fire House Dog", "It's Pumpkin Time", "Daniel Tigers Autumn", "Clifford's First Fall".

Art time: Squishy Leaves, Roller Leaves, Acorns, Squishy Pumpkins, Shape Rescue Truck, 5 Little Firemen, Pumpkins Rolling, 5 Little Pumpkins, Scarecrows & Pumpkins.

Teddy Bear Day: They brought their favorite stuffed animal or bear, went in front of the class and told us all about their stuffed animal. Also PJ Day, Picture Day – October 24<sup>th</sup>. We hired Nightingale Family Photography.

On costume day: Here at Little Cherubs we do not celebrate Halloween, but we understand how children love to dress up! So we invited the child to bring in their special costume to show their friends. We dressed them up so they could show their friends.

Other News:

- Cindy cut open a pumpkin, showed the children what was inside. Had them feel the squishy insides. They used their senses to smell, see, hear, taste and feel.
- ✤ Pastor came into the classroom on each Thursday to spend time with the children and have them get comfortable with him in the classroom. He makes that time so enjoyable.

#### 4 year old class:

Our Themes were: Apples, Noah, Popcorn Fire Safety, Columbus Day Fall, Owls, Pizza Day Fall, Teddy Bears, Acorns Harvest, Fall

We worked on Letters E, F, G, H, I and on Numbers: 5, 6, 7 & 8.

They had popcorn day. Miss JoAnn brought in her air pop popper. We placed a table cloth in the center of the room and watched the popcorn pop. All senses were used with this assignment.

Craig Henderson came into the classroom. He introduced himself as a regular looking man. Dressed in his uniform one piece at a time. It helped the children to get used to seeing a fireman in person. He showed the children that they never had to be afraid of a fireman if they had to come into their home in case of a fire.

He showed them how to check if it was safe to open the door to the room they were in. If the *(Continued on page 15)* 







door felt hot they were to move toward a window in that room, so the fireman could see them. He taught them about stop, drop and roll. He explained that they should never hide but yell out "here I am" if a fireman was looking for them.

They couldn't go on the fire truck because it was raining outside, but Craig brought the truck close to the Church entrance. The children stood under the awning. He showed them what kind of truck he brought and showed them all the equipment. He ended his time giving each child a fire hat, blew the horn and put on the siren.

For Science, the children watched Miss Martha and Miss Cindy carve open a pumpkin, put on a face, take out the seeds and show how it was all squishy inside. We also made pumpkin seeds for the children to try and did an experiment to see whether a chunk of pumpkin would sink or float. Each child was given a small pumpkin to paint and take home.

Story Time: "Fire Fighters", "Clifford The Fire House Dog", "My Big World", "Columbus", "Owl Babies", "Acorn Mystery", "Fall Leaves", "Very Busy Spider".

Art: Color the popcorn container red, white, red, white (Patterning) and glue air pop popcorn to their paper.

Bible Time:

- Noah Obeys
- ✤ Joseph's Coat,
- ✤ Baby Moses,
- ✤ Moses and the Burning Bush
- Partin the Red Sea

Noah Project: Building the Ark and putting all the animals in it.

Columbus Day Project: The children glued their 3 sail boats on construction paper and added the sails to make the Nina, Pinta, and Santa Maria. They created the water with crayons. Leaf Rubbings, and Water Colored the Burning Bush and added Noah.

Pizza Day was on the 18<sup>th</sup>. They made individual pizzas on English Muffins. They spread the sauce and put shredded cheese on the English Muffin, and Cindy baked them in the kitchen. That was a big hit.

On the 23<sup>rd</sup>, they had Teddy Bear Day. They brought in their favorite stuffed animal or bear in celebration of Teddy Roosevelt. The children dressed in their PJ's.

October 25<sup>th</sup> was Picture Day. This class dressed in a cap and gown which will be on their diploma from Little Cherubs at the end of the school year.

October 30<sup>th</sup> was bring your costume to school as a dress up attire. They just love dressing up.

Pastor visited this classroom on each Wednesday. The children just love to see what Pastor has up his sleeve each week. Whether it is a new song or speaking in French while singing Head, Shoulders, Knees and Toes.

#### FIRE SAFETY TIPS AT HOME

Make sure you have working smoke alarms in your home – one for every level. Remember to check all of them every month and to change the batteries regularly. (Twice a year is a common recommendation, and the beginning and end of daylight savings time can be a helpful reminder.) For added safety you can get units that are both smoke and carbon monoxide alarms.

- 1. Avoid electrical fires by unplugging appliances when not in use (This can save on your electricity bill too.) and do not overload outlets by plugging in too many devices with things like power strips. When using an extension cord, make sure it is thicker than the cord for the device you are plugging in (to keep from overloading the extension cord) and do not put electrical wires under rugs or in high traffic areas.
- 2. Consider getting at least one fire extinguisher for your home. More fires start in the kitchen than in any other room, so this would be a good place to have one. Remember to get a fire extinguisher that is designed to work on common fires you might have in your home.
- 3. Clean the lint trap of your clothes dryer regularly, preferably after every drying cycle, and clear out any lint under or behind the dryer twice a year. Fires in residential areas often start in the clothes dryer.
- 4. Have an escape plan for how you will get out of your home if there is ever a fire. Make sure you know the route out of every room in your house and practice getting out. Practice staying low to the ground and checking doors with the back of your hand to see if it is hot. Don't forget to designate a place outside of the home and far enough away where everyone will gather to make sure they are safe.

#### IF THERE IS EVER A FIRE AT CHURCH

Make your way to the nearest exit and go outside; when you are outside head to one of two meeting places.

- If you see the Church sign when you get outside, you are at the front of the building head towards the sign and wait on the front lawn by it.
- ✤ If you see the large white cross, you are at the back or the side of the building head towards the cross and wait on the back lawn by it.
- If you have limited mobility, ask for help and other members will assist you in getting as far from the building as possible.

The Wellness & Safety Committee continues to meet regularly, and we hope to have news about First Aid/CPR/AED training for you soon.
