Above all, we rejoice at Your gracious promise to all Your servants, both living and departed, that we shall be raised from death at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

The following passages of Holy Scripture are read.

John 12:23–26

²³And Jesus answered them, "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. ²⁴Truly, truly, I say to you, unless a grain of

wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains alone; but if it dies, it bears much fruit. ²⁵Whoever loves his life loses it, and whoever hates his life in this world will keep it for eternal life. ²⁶If anyone serves me, he must follow me; and where I am, there will my servant be also. If anyone serves me, the Father will honor him.

1 Corinthians 15:51–57

⁵¹Behold! I tell you a mystery. We shall not all sleep, but we shall all be changed, ⁵²in a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet. The pastor may place his hand on the head of the casket as he says:

- P** May God the Father, who created this body; may God the ✠ Son, who by His blood redeemed this body; may God the Holy Spirit, who by Holy Baptism sanctified this body to be His temple, keep these remains to the day of the resurrection of all flesh.
- C** Amen.

hallowed be Thy name,

A Eulogy by the Reverend Richard L. Adinolfi

Lil grew up on Avenue V in Brooklyn, N.Y. not far from King's Highway from humble beginnings. Her mom, upon the untimely death of her husband, worked at a dress shop a few blocks from where she lived in a 3 story apartment building. There her mom raised Lil and her older sister Addie and Lil's two younger brothers Frank and Carl, both of them predeceased Lil years ago. Yet they all fared quite well, even Lil who was affected all her life with a back condition from contracting Polio at a young age. However, she never let that hold her back at school, at home or out and about. She even attended Mt

Olivet Church with her family.

From early in life she was quite outgoing, attentive and popular. She was fun to be with! She was vivacious and lively. Upon graduation from high school she became a secretary. However, once she married Al, she left her job and took on the responsibility of housewife and mother whom my brother Al loved and cared for dearly. She was a terrific wife to Al in every way. She was always there for him, her family and friends. She supported him in his political pursuits, hosting the republican gatherings he held in their home, and attending other fundraising and charity events that Maria and I attended with them on one or two occasions.

She was a fabulous mom from the time she gave birth to Debbie and Jo-Ann. What stands out in my mind is the time she spent making sure they had a fabulous Christmas, shopping months in advance for all the gifts she wanted them to have, and then putting them on display under their beautifully decorated tree and up to the ceiling. And in so many different ways she was always giving to her children, grandchildren and great grandchildren. She also volunteered at Jo-Ann and Joe's Day Care Center Jumpin Beans Day School. There she enjoyed attending to the children and doing other things to help out.

As a housewife she was always busy. She vacuumed and washed floors and clothes every day. She also loved to shop for food and clothes and this and that along Avenue U until retiring. She then moved to Cheshire where she resided until passing on.

Throughout her life she often got together with friends. But if the sun was out that day she was sure to be relaxing in the sunlight enjoying it. Sometimes she loved to knit and donated many items to the local church. She enjoyed getting together with her friends at The Cheshire Women's Club gatherings and playing bingo on Tuesday night with her friends. She was a terrific neighbor and friend!

From the time I first met her, along with my parents and sisters, Roz and Terry, I loved her as did they. She was so sweet and lovable; likewise, once Maria came into my life, she loved her too. In fact, Lil was the first one in the family to welcome Maria as my fiancée'. She was also the first to invite us to her home for dinner and social events. She gladly helped me purchase an engagement ring at a jeweler on Avenue U where she was familiar with every shop along the way. Since I was still attending Hunter College in New York city when Maria and I got married, Lil found us an apartment and helped Maria shop for the furniture and things we needed. Hallelujah! Thank You Lil!

Once Lil's mother Mary retired, she and Al found her a place to live in Cheshire so Lil could attend to her. Then when her mom became ill with cancer she had her mom live with them, so she could give her mom all the care she needed until her Mom's passing several months thereafter.
