#### PASTOR'S MESSAGE

"Make a joyful noise to the LORD, all the earth! Serve the LORD with gladness! Come into his presence with singing! Know that the LORD, he is God! It is he who made us, and we are his; we are his people, and the sheep of his pasture. Enter his gates with thanksgiving, and his courts with praise! Give thanks to him; bless his name! For the LORD is good; his steadfast love endures forever, and his faithfulness to all generations." Psalm 100 (ESV)

It would be easy to look at the world today and to be anything but thankful. I won't go into lots of details, but between the pandemic and its wide ranging repercussions, the divisive presidential election that draws to its close on November 3, the increasing cold and darkness that descends this time of year. and all the personal problems that our members seem to be encountering (especially related to their own health or the health of a loved one) there seem to be more reasons to be sorrowful than there are to be thankful. Yet nothing could be further from the truth.

Back in May I wrote of the good that God was still working for all of us in spite of events in the world, and even working blessings for us through some of them. Well, the same is true when it comes to being thankful. Even in the midst of all that can seem to be wrong in this life, God is still blessing you. You are His; He made you and His love for you in Christ Jesus is never ending. He is pouring His good gifts out on you every day, provide us with ample reason to give thanks to Him and bless His name.

Just look at some of the many things that He has been at any time in recent history and people done since only March: CLC celebrated two 60<sup>th</sup> Anniversaries – the arrival & installation of Pastor Nuechterlein (along with Gloria and the kids) and the groundbreaking for our sanctuary. Sure, we had to wait to celebrate them in person, but when the day arrived to celebrate together outside, the Lord blessed us with a beautiful one. <sup>20</sup> Those are lots of reasons to give thanks to Him.

Seven (7) young men and women confessed their faith in Jesus this Fall in the Rite of Confirmation. Admittedly, the ceremony was pushed back from the Spring and we experienced some technical difficulties. Still, as the students stood outside on the back lawn of the Church, the weather cooperated wonderfully. Those are more reasons to give thanks to Him.

Over the last two months alone, four (4) little children have been welcomed into the Lord's family by Water and the Word in Holy Baptism – and those are just the ones done by me. Pastor N and Pastor G each also conducted a Baptism here at CLC during that time. In total, half a dozen new souls were added to the number of the faithful by the Lord here at CLC alone. Those are even more reasons to give thanks to Him.

Despite all the hardship and the challenges that the pandemic has <sup>y</sup>brought, by the grace of God you all have continued to be as faithful as you could in giving of your time and your talents. As a result, though our Mission Plan does not stand where we thought it would be when we established it last year and we have been impacted by what is going on, CLC

is still blessed to be not too far off from our Plan. That's a reason to give thanks to Him and to all of you.

Our nation is more divided now than it has are at odds with each other over many issues. At the same time, people in our nation have now become more involved in their communities and in the political process than they have before. AND THE CHURCH COUNCIL Greetings All,

Our remote Council Meeting in October had full attendance and each council member and committee deacon provided productive updates. Amidst the abnormal times we are living in, overall CLC is running smoothly. A few key highlights were that we exceeded our goal with helping our neighbors and delivered over 1,500 lbs and \$1,125 to the Cheshire Community Food Pantry. The \$39K PPP (Payroll Protection Plan) loan remains likely to be forgiven; however, we anticipate that being delayed and not approved until 2021. Our mission plan giving is trending just under 95% allowing us to continue delivering on our congregational commitments locally and afar.

Sunday School kicked off virtually between morning services on the second and fourth Sunday's of the month, and we thank the volunteers who commit their time to make this happen and teach our children and youth. Adult Bible study continues at 9:15 a.m. between services on non-communion Sunday (2nd and 4th Sundays) in the Fellowship Hall for everyone who is comfortable attending in person, as well as being offered remote via Zoom. Wednesday afternoon (1:30) Bible Study has also resumed in person and via zoom.

Little Cherubs Preschool has remains in session with 9 four year old's enrolled and is adhering to local Covid-19 guidelines. The teachers again are Director JoAnn Holstein, along with Martha Henderson and Cindy Barker, and we thank them for all that they do!

For those unable to attend the celebratory Anniversaries event on Sunday October 4<sup>th</sup>, we had a great afternoon with fantastic weather and amazing district Pastors offering many thanks and praise to Pastor Nuechterlein and Gloria. We are richly blessed for all that they have done and continue to do. Pastor N was very appreciative of the kind words offered by all, and very thankful for the additional \$5K gift we were able to present to Pastor Yeadon for the New England District. The video of this is available on our CLC YouTube Channel.

Thank You gentlemen for cleaning out our walking trail. The children have loved walking looking for Fall items to put on their science table within the classroom. One of our little boys loves filling his pockets with acorns. Some of our activities relating to leaves and fall consisted of Seasons of an Apple Tree, Leave Sorting, a Leaf Book 1-4, Roller Leaves Art, and ending with Popcorn Day.

What a very busy month we had. The children are loving Bible Time and are remembering the Bible Stories. They recite to Pastor all that they have learned.



# NEWS FROM OUR EDUCATION DEACON...

Little Cherubs:

Little Cherubs Pre-School is back! Classes started on September 8th with (9) 4-year olds. We currently do not have 3-year olds enrolled. The low enrollment reflects the uncertainty around the pandemic; however, maximum enrollment allowable under COVID state regulations for our facility is 14. We have had parents previously enrolled with their children expressing a "wait and see" approach to future engagement.

We are on a 5-day school option plan: Monday, Wednesday & Friday 9AM to 12PM, or 9AM to 1:30PM, and Tuesday & Thursday 9AM-12PM. Three students have been enrolled in the 5-day option. COVID guidelines are in place and in compliance with the Centers for Disease Control along with the Connecticut Office of Early Childhood. A policy for mask wearing is in place. The school passed a State inspection on September 22nd.

We are blessed in having our three teachers; JoAnn Holstein (Director), Martha Henderson and Cindy Barker. Along with Pastor Rowold, all have worked tirelessly to keep Little Cherubs Pre-School open. We owe them our gratitude!










### NEWS FROM THE SOCIAL WELFARE DEACON...

October was a busy month for Social Welfare. During the month we supported the following causes:

- Vicki headed the hygiene kit project that supplied 55 kits to Orphan Grain Train
- We continued to support Holly's friend Carol Weinshel who collects items for the troops in Afghanistan
- We had a unique chance to support Cheshire Community Food Pantry in October. The Covid pandemic has left the supplies at the pantry limited. Thrivent issued a challenge to Church's in multiple New England states. The first 100 completed Thrivent Action Teams that gathered at least 500 items for donation to a local food pantry will see a \$500 check go to the benefiting organization. There are clothes, shoes, medical equipment, hospital beds, bikes, health kits, pillow case dresses and backpacks packed into uniform boxes that are eventually loaded on a container and shipped to a needy location is the US or overseas.
