



Advent Wreath Lighting

- P Dear friends in Christ, today we begin the season of Advent. It is a time of watching and waiting for the coming of the Lord. The Advent wreath reminds us of our yearning for God. Its circular shape tells us of God's everlasting love and faithfulness. The four candles remind us of the passing of time, our human history into which God has entered through His Son, Jesus. On this First Sunday of Advent, we remember how our Lord was first hailed as the coming king, and we look forward to the day when our King will come again. As we light the first candle on the Advent wreath, may its flame bid us always to be ready for the coming of the Lord.
- P Lord Jesus, You came into the world to reveal Your Father's love.
- C Lord, have mercy.
- P Christ Jesus, by Your dying and rising You have given us the promise of eternal life.
- **C** Christ, have mercy.
- P Lord Jesus, You ask us to be ready, watching and waiting for Your coming.
- C Lord, have mercy.
- P May Almighty God have mercy upon us, forgive us our sins, and bring us to everlasting life.
- C Amen.




