## A WORD ABOUT THE LESSONS

*The Coming of the Christ Brings True Rejoicing in His Forgiveness* - When he preaches repentance, John the Baptist points us to Christ Jesus. John was sent by God "*as a witness, to bear witness about the light, that all might believe through him*" (John 1:7). He baptizes with water in order to "*make straight the way of the Lord,*" who shall redeem His people from their sins (John 1:23). That Lord Jesus "*who comes after*" John now stands among us and makes Himself known to us (John 1:26–27). He has been anointed by the Holy Spirit "*to bring good news to the poor*" and "*to bind up the brokenhearted*" (Is. 61:1). By the washing of the water with His Word and Spirit, He clothes His Church with "*the garments of salva-tion*" and adorns her with His own righteousness "*as a bride adorns herself with her jewels*" (Is. 61:10). Therefore, we "*rejoice always*" in the Lord, "*pray without ceasing*" and "*give thanks in all circumstances*" (1 Thess. 5:16–18). For "*the God of peace,*" who has called you by the Gospel, will surely "*sanctify you completely,*" so that "*your whole spirit and soul and body*" will "*be kept blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ*" (1 Thess. 5:23–24).
