#### PASTOR'S MESSAGE

"And in the same region there were shepherds out in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night. And an angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were filled with great fear. And the angel said to them, "Fear not, for behold, I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. ... And they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby lying in a manger. ... And the shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them." Luke 2:8-10, 16, 20 (ESV)

On the first Christmas night, the shepherds were hard at work in the fields, just like any other night, taking care of the sheep and minding their own business. It was just an ordinary day for them out there with the flocks. Suddenly the angel of the Lord appeared and broke the monotony of their normal routine, filling their ordinary night with the extraordinary. God's promised Savior was born and the angel was telling them, not the king in his palace or the priests in the temple; God was reaching out to regular people like them and inviting them to come to him.

We all know what happened next because we hear it retold every Christmas – as soon as the angels left, the shepherds set out to find the Child. When they found the baby lying in the manger, they told His parents (Mary and Joseph) what had happened out in the fields and the news of the angels. Then the shepherds left the holy family and shared the Good News about Him with other people as they went. Finally, the shepherds returned to the fields and picked up right where they had left off, doing their ordinary job of taking care of the sheep – just like any other ordinary night. Their lives were still the same, but they were different; they knew their Savior and that changed everything.

The Christmas Gospel reaches out to you and me. The Good News of the Babe of Bethlehem calls each of us out of our ordinary lives and normal routines to meet the Christ Child. It's true that we don't drop everything and leave work or school immediately to go and meet Him like the shepherds did, but you have to admit that going to Church on a Thursday night is certainly not a normal activity for most of us, nor are the tree and decorations and lights. The message of the angels pulls us out of our regular routines and ways of living; it removes us from our ordinary patterns of life and leads us into the extra-ordinary.

> There we see the baby of Bethlehem as He comes to us again, not lying in a manger, but here for you in His Word of Holy Scripture. We hear again the

Good News of His birth in Bethlehem, receiving the forgiveness of sins that He came to bring. We welcome Him as He comes to us, not wrapped in swaddling clothes, but in, with, and under the bread and wine of Holy Communion, as He places the gift of Himself into your very hands – given and shed for you. With our own eyes we see Him and with our own hands we touch Him. We find Christ the Lord not in a manger in Bethlehem, but in our Church in Cheshire.

Then, like the shepherds, we leave – going back to our ordinary lives and normal routines. When the weekend ends and Monday morning comes, it will be just another regular Monday for many; there will be bills to be paid, jobs to be worked, and chores to be done. (Yes, I know, the kids will still have off from school, but that too is part of the regular routine of life.) People will still have to wear masks and stay six feet apart because of Covid and everything will be as *(Continued on page 3)*





We kicked off the 2021 Stewardship campaign on Sunday, November 22<sup>nd</sup>, with Pledge Sunday. Each family has received, or will be receiving, a pledge packet. I have highlighted below three key components which are included in your pledge packet. The theme of these items all relate to our giving of our TIME, TALENT, and TREASURE, the core of what Stewardship is about.

#### 1st of three items in your pledge packet: Mission Plan. Aka Work Plan:

- ✤ We do not call this our budget, although it represents our financials, since everything in it supports the work we do, our mission.
- This plan includes both Home Ministry, including Little Cherubs Christian Preschool, as well as World Wide Ministry, where we support the broader community around us.
- The Mission Plan was thoughtfully developed by the Finance Committee, and approved by our Voters Assembly and the Council. If you have any questions about the Mission Plan, please ask me or any Council member.
- ♥ We are richly blessed, in that year to date for 2020, we are in a healthy financial position. This is due to the generosity of you, our CLC members.
- 2<sup>nd</sup> of three items in your pledge packet: TIME AND TALENT Cards:
- ✤ We are asking you to give thoughtful consideration as to where you may aspire to get involved in at CLC.
- ✤ Again, we are richly blessed, in that so many of our CLC family give tirelessly of their TIME AND TALENT. It is due to the cumulative efforts and energies of everyone that makes "this place" run.



That said, we always need "new blood"; new people to get involved and give their efforts and energy.

✤ As the expression goes "Many Hands Make Light Work"

✤ The Time and Talent card is the means in which you can indicate your interest in getting involved!
✤ This year, we refreshed the card to best align with current needs. For example, you will see a new section "TECHNOLOGY SUPPORTING MISSION", so if you have any skills and/or interest in say video streaming YouTube for our Sunday services, here is your chance!

Another update you will see on the Time and Talent card is we are making it easier to denote "current" involvement versus "interest" in getting involved, so we can clearly discern net new interest.

#### 3<sup>rd</sup> of three items in your pledge packet: Pledge Card itself:

- Here is where you have an opportunity to make a financial pledge, which supports the Work Plan I mentioned above.
- ✤ More correctly, instead of using the word "opportunity", I should say "responsibility". Makes sense, since everything that we have belongs to God, and is entrusted to our care.
- A note to Givers who have not made a pledge in prior years please consider doing so! Your pledge demonstrates your support of our Mission Plan, and it helps us best manage our financials.

So, what do I do next? Glad you asked! Your action is requested for the following items:

- Pick up your Pledge Packet at CLC, or call the church office to have it mailed to you
- ✤ Give thoughtful consideration to both the TIME and TALENT cards, and the Pledge Card
- Return both to CLC by December 13. You may put them in the offering plate, church office, or US Mail them to CLC's PO Box.

#### HEALTH & SAFETY COMMITTEE NEWS...

#### HAVE A SAFE & BLESSED CHRISTMAS

Our CLC Wellness and Safety Committee has been meeting monthly using the following instructional guides: creating a safe church, being prepared and aware and providing emergency medical care. We offer the following tips to help make your Christmas safe and secure.:

- If using a live tree, cut off about 2 inches of the trunk to expose fresh wood for better water absorption, remember to water it and remove it from your home when it is dry.
- A dried-out tree can catch fire faster than one that has been properly watered. Check the water level every other day to ensure proper hydration.
- If you buy an artificial tree, make sure it's labeled "fire resistant." Fire-resistant trees are less susceptible to catching fire.
- Replace any lights with frayed wires, broken sockets, and loose connections.
- Turn off all lights when you go to bed and before leaving the house to avoid a short that could start an electrical fire.
- & Keep candles on a sturdy base to prevent tipping. Never leave a lit candle unattended.
- Keep potentially poisonous plants poinsettias, mistletoe, holly berries, Jerusalem cherry and amaryllis away from children.
- Keep your driveway and walkways clear of ice and snow, especially if you're expecting guests. Roughly 16,500 Americans head to the hospital each year due to injuries that happen while shoveling or removing ice and snow. Wear proper boots with enough traction, point feet slightly outward to keep your center of balance under you, and take small, slow steps.
- Keep yourself and your family safe from food-related illness. Wash hands and surfaces often. Avoid cross-contamination by keeping raw meat, poultry, seafood, and eggs (including their juices) away from ready-to-eat foods and eating surfaces. Cook foods to the proper temperature. Refrigerate promptly. Do not leave perishable foods out for more than two hours.

Don't let the holiday madness take a toll on your mental and emotional health. Take some time off to relax and unwind. In addition, get adequate sleep.

To find out when worship services have been cancelled due to weather conditions, check TV channels, WTNH channel 8 or MyTV 9, WFSB channel 3 and on the radio, WTIC 1080 AM. We still have not heard from all of our High School Youth about their interest in Bible study; if you have not replied yet, please contact Pastor R.







#### NEWS FROM THE SOCIAL WELFARE DEACON...

One morning in early October, I received an email from Thrivent Financial, a Lutheran nonprofit organization. They were offering an Action Team challenge called FEEDNE2020. Groups were being encouraged to support the food pantries that are in dire need. We could get \$250 to use toward starting a drive to give food to a local food pantry. On top of that, if we were one of the first 100 to donate 500 items, the food pantry would receive a check for \$500. This was a no brainer-we could do that! The race was on! I got approval and presented the challenge to CLC. I received the Thrivent money and your contributions. October 14th, we reported that we delivered 604 items to Cheshire Community Food Pantry. It looked promising that we would be among the elite 100. There was a total of \$1238 given and a month for the drive. How do I spend that much in a month and deliver it all. A committee was formed DDD (DottiDianeDon). Diane Drust and I



shopped, taking advantage of sale and getting food that the pantry requested. They ordered cases and fresh produce through their ShopRite store. The Drust men delivered the majority of the food to the pantry-1360 ITEMS/1569 LBS. That is more than half of 2019 total donation to the CCFP. I had no doubt that we would come though and support our community in need.

The number of families using the pantry continues to increase due to the pandemic. We did get the additional \$500 from Thrivent but we need to continue to help supply the food pantry. You can drop off at their building on 175 Sandbank Road or send checks. WE are blessed, Bless the hungry and needy.

Saturday, November 14, was Cheshire's 15th annual "Lights of Hope". Cheshire Lutheran Church again participated as a sponsor on what was a beautiful lite night. The annual event benefits several Cheshire Youth and Social Services. Proceeds also go toward student scholarships and to The Petit Family Foundation


