PASTOR'S MESSAGE

"1 Now after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea in the days of Herod the king, behold, wise men from the east came to Jerusalem, ² saying, 'Where is he who has been born king of the Jews? For we saw his star when it rose and have come to worship him.' ... ¹¹ And going into the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother, and they fell down and worshiped him. Then, opening their treasures, they offered him gifts, gold and frankincense and myrrh." Matthew 2:1–2, 11 (ESV)

January 6 is the Feast of the Epiphany; it is the day that the Christian Church remembers the visit of the *Magi* – those "wise men from the East" – who came to worship the Christ-child. We see them in just about every nativity scene and Sunday school Christmas program. They appear on Christmas cards and in beloved Christmas carols. Still, we hear the Scripture passage about their visit rarely (usually only when Epiphany falls on a Sunday) and we actually know very little about them.

We sing about those folks coming from the East as kings, but they were really *Magi*, "wise men" or royal advisors with knowledge about a wide variety of topics – not kings. We don't know exactly from where they came. We know there was more than one because the word Magi is a plural form, but we don't know that there were exactly three. (We assume three, most likely, because of the three gifts.) We don't know their names and whether it was a group of just men, or a group of men and women. We presume the gifts were prophetic, pointing to the fact that the Babe of Bethlehem would be our prophet (symbolized by the myrrh), our priest (represented by the frankincense), and our king (symbolized by the gold), but those are all just guesses.

There are only two things that we know for certain about these *Magi*; the first is that they

made it a point to worship the baby Jesus, altering their lives and going quite a bit out of their way to do so. Matthew's Gospel recounts how they "saw his star when it rose", which would have been when Jesus was born, and that's when they set out on their journey to find him. It was not a quick or an easy trip, and it would have caused a major disruption to their lives and incurred quite a cost. In fact, it may have taken as many as two years from when they set out to when they finally arrived in Bethlehem. We know this because Matthew refers to Jesus as a "child", which is a different word from the word used for "baby" or "infant" in the Scriptures, and the holy family is living in a house when the Magi arrive, not a stable. (There's also the fact that Herod's slaughter of the innocents in Bethlehem is directed at children two and under.)

The second thing that we know for certain about these *Magi* is that their worship of the baby Jesus included taking from the treasures that they possessed and giving them to Him. The gifts that they gave, gold and frankincense and myrrh, were not inexpensive or easy to acquire. No, they were costly and time consuming to manufacture. Gold had to be mined and then refined, while frankincense and myrrh were both derived from plant resins, requiring time for their respective plants to grow and mature; then the laborious work of harvesting the resins and refining them had to be performed. These Magi spared no expense in the gifts that they gave to the Christ-child.

As we start this new year, it's my prayer that we make a concerted effort to follow the example of the *Magi* and seek to emulate the two things that we know for sure about them. First, let's make worship an important part of our lives. I'm not asking you to travel long distances, disrupt your entire life, or incur



massive costs, but I am encouraging you to come to Church. If you and your household are well and have no underlying health concerns, consider coming to Church in person. We're following health guidelines during the pandemic and employing the best practices available to keep people safe as we worship, so come out in person if you are able. If you aren't able to come to Church in person, then make it a point to participate in worship via the live stream – and try to do it when the stream is actually live, not later in the day or later in the week. I know that life can be hectic and schedules challenging, but let's make coming together in worship a priority, not just something we do when it is convenient.



Second, let's remember to open up our treasures and give to God in a spirit of thankfulness. I'm not asking you to spend vast sums of money and donate precious metals or rare resins, but I am encouraging you to look at all the blessings that God has given to you and to give back to Him as an expression of thanksgiving. The *Magi* gave gifts from the treasures that the Lord had entrusted to them, and let's do the same. They had things like gold and frankincense and myrrh; ours are a bit different, but we all have treasures to offer: some sing or ring; others plant or prune; still others teach or lead; and then there are those blessed to be able to give financially. 





THANK YOU for your responses to date for the 2021 Pledge Campaign. I would like to share where we are as of December $23^{\rm rd}$.




SOUPER BOWL SUNDAY AT CLC...

There are separate carts for the 8 and 10:30 services and the hymnals sit untouched until the following Sunday. (By letting our hymnals sit for a week, that should provide more than sufficient time for any germs or virus that could possibly be on them to die and to remove the risk of touch-transmission.)

Printed copies of the service are still available for people to pick up during open office hours on Thursdays and they will continue to be an option on Sunday mornings for those who decide not to use the hymnals for any reason. 
