Pastor's Message

"For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures, that He was buried, that He was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures." 1 Corinthians 15:3-4 (ESV)

When you think of Easter, what comes to mind? It may be the Easter bunny or Easter eggs, Easter baskets or candy like chocolates and jellybeans, Easter bonnets or new Easter dress, the Easter Sunday service or Easter lilies, Easter breakfast at Church or Easter dinner at home with family gathered round the table. For many people this year, a lot of the things that we normally associate with Easter may not take place. The things that do will probably look very different this year as we continue to deal with the pandemic and all the safety

measures that it has spawned.

Our Easter services will certainly be different this year from a normal year. For starters, there will be three services instead of the regular two: 6:30 AM, 8 AM, and 10:30 AM. Next, the sunrise service will be held outside at the Columbarium (Lord willing and weather permitting), the 8 o'clock will be inside with the service streamed out live on YouTube, and the 10:30 will also be outside, though on the back lawn this time. Of course, all services will include appropriate social distancing and require masks, which is certainly NOT normal for Easter Sunday. The Easter breakfast has been replaced with a "Coffee And..." event that will use more of a "Grab and Go" format than the traditional Easter breakfast. another Sunday soon. Yes, Easter will be different this year at CLC.

Still, in spite of all that will be different, the most and always, important things will still be the same. The Easter Gospel will still proclaim the Good News In Christ, of the empty tomb. We will still sing the traditional Easter hymns (though fewer of them at the sunrise service). The Sacrament of Holy

Communion will still put into your hands, your mouth, the very body and blood of the risen Savior. The Easter acclamation will still proclaim, "Alleluia! Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!"

Our Easter WILL look different this year, but it will be a whole lot better than last Easter when the pandemic had us all worshipping from home. We will gather, we will sing, and we will celebrate. While we may not be "back to normal" yet, we will still be able to share together as a family of faith in all the joy and hope that is Easter. Jesus IS risen. The tomb IS empty. Your sins ARE

forgiven. Even if we don't yet have all the things that normally come to mind when we think of Easter, we still have our risen Lord and He's the most important thing.

Like you, I look forward to

the day when our Easter

has all that we've come to expect: bunnies, eggs, baskets, candy, bonnets, dresses, services, lilies, breakfast at Church, dinner with family, and whatever else is part of your family tradition. We're not there yet, but I have faith that we will get there. Until then, keep focused on what is of first importance: Jesus died for your sins, that He was buried, and He was raised on the third day for you. In Him your sins are forgiven and everlasting life is yours.

I pray I will see you soon, whether it's on Easter Sunday at one of the services or on

From a Wellness and Safety perspective, it has been just over a year now since the Covid-19 pandemic forced us to limit capacity to 50% and implement six foot social distancing. Although the governor lifted the capacity constraints for houses of worship on March 19th, we are unable to increase the number of in-person attendees allowed with the six foot social distance still in place. As more people become vaccinated over the upcoming months, there is light at the end of the tunnel when we all can attend church, worship, and enjoy fellowship together.

Little Cherubs Preschool continues to educate the children with Christian faith based teachings and experiences, and Craig Wilson was delighted to report an increase in enrollment from nine to twelve children.

COVID -19 PRECAUTIONS REMINDER...

COVID-19 restrictions, as mandated by Governor Lamont's Executive Orders, remain in place at CLC. On April 25 we will also check in to see if the am or pm time is better for Bible study in the month of May.



Thanks to all who continue to support this ongoing program. As a result of your purchases, \$100 was given to the CLCW in December.




Fatherhood Coach:

A LAMENTATION OF THE CRUCIFIXION OF OUR LORD AND HIS DEATH AT CALVARY

Fifteen years ago during a business trip from March 17-23, 2006, several colleagues and I had a chance to visit many significant cities and regions of Israel that relate to our Christian faith. 

Dorothy Ann Rippel was called home to our Lord on March 13, 2021. A Celebration of her life was held on Saturday March, 20, 2021.


Dorothy was the loving wife of Charles (Charlie) Rippel.






Bible Studies at CLC




