Pastor's Message

'[Mary Magdalene] turned around and saw Jesus standing, but she did not know that it was Jesus. Jesus said to her, 'Woman, why are you weeping? Whom are you seeking?' Supposing him to be the gardener, she said to him, 'Sir, if you have carried him away, tell me where you have laid him, and I will take him away." John 20:14-15 (ESV)

It was early that first Easter morning. The women had found the tomb empty and gone to tell the Disciples. Simon Peter and another disciple responded by running to the tomb where are all that there is. they, too, found it empty. After the two of them went home, Mary was left in the garden by herself. First, two angels appeared and spoke to her, then Mary turned and was face to face with Jesus Himself.

I can't tell you how may times I have been asked by kids in Sunday School and adults in Bible Class, "Why didn't Mary recognize Jesus? He was right there with her, why didn't she realize it?" It's a fair question to ask,\; after all, she had strength to deal with things, that is when the spent more than a little bit of time with Jesus. Mary Magdalene was one of several women who were routinely part of Jesus' inner circle and who supported our Lord and His disciples in Paul, so also He says to you and me when their ministry. It could even be reasonably argued that only the 12 Apostles would have an easier time recognizing Jesus than Mary. So, why didn't she realize that He was there?

To answer that question, try to put yourself in her position. First, Mary had seen Jesus suffer in ways He did not deserve and then watched helplessly as His life was cut short. Add to that the shock of finding His tomb empty, and it's not really all that hard to understand. Mary is in the midst of sadness, grief, and confusion. She is the strength and ability to face all that life hurting mentally and emotionally, is probably angry and frustrated, and is dealing with pain and loss. At a time like that, none of us would think too clearly, see too clearly.

It is actually pretty easy to understand why she didn't realize that Jesus was right there with her, when you think about it. Not only is it easy to understand, it's also a fairly common occurrence. You see, it's not just Mary Magdalene who fails to realize Jesus is with her; it happens to lots of people when they are hurting, lonely, angry, confused, suffering, or in need. When pain and tragedy strike in life, it's easy for us to become so overwhelmed that all we can see are the bad things that are taking place; that crowds everything else out of our vision. At times, we can even begin to think that the problems

The truth, however, is much different for you and me, and for all believers in Christ Jesus. God's promise to you is "Never will I leave you nor forsake you" (Hebrews 13:5). Jesus is always with you, whether life is good or bad. Actually, He's especially with you when things are bad. When you are tired...when you are weak...when you are overwhelmed...when you no longer have the power of God is most at work in you. Just as God said to Paul, when He did not remove the "thorn in the flesh" that was tormenting life becomes too much: "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness" (2 Corinthians 12:9).

God in Christ Jesus is with you, is at work in you, when life is good and you have reason to rejoice and be glad. He's also with you and at work in you when life is bad, and you have reason to mourn and be sad. He's promised to be with you always, to the end of the age (Matthew 28:20) and He gives you brings with hope and confidence. With Paul we can truly say, "The Lord is my helper; I will not fear" (Hebrews 13:6).

On Easter morning, when we are surrounded by the hope and the joy of Jesus' resurrection,


GETTING TO KNOW OUR MEMBERS...








NEWS FROM THE FINANCIAL SECRETARY...

COVID -19 PRECAUTIONS REMINDER AND ATTENDANCE INFO...

As of the writing of this edition of the Heavenly Herald, the COVID-19 restrictions mandated by Governor Lamont's Executive Orders remain in place at CLC. When you visit the Church for services or Bible study, please remember to maintain social distancing and to wear your mask from the time that you get out of your car until you get back into it. Hand sanitizer is located at various places in the building thanks to Don Drust and Andy Clark, so please be sure to use it as appropriate when you here.

Please remember to sign up with the Church office if you would like to attend service on Sunday morning. We are aware that the Governor expects to lift many of the Covid restrictions during the month of May (for outdoor activities on the 1st and indoor on the 19th), but, until these changes are official, we are still limited to spaces for 16 households. If you show up to Church without a confirmed space, we cannot guarantee that we will have a place for you. Leaving a message on the Church answering machine does not mean that you are signed up; you must receive confirmation from the office that we have you on the list and there is a place for you.

When the Covid-19 restrictions are lifted, masks will still be mandated for indoor activities, and the Connecticut Department of Public Health is expected to release recommendations for indoor gatherings and large outdoor ones. The Wellness & Safety Committee will be reviewing these guidelines and working with the Church Council to determine the most responsible course of action for our congregation as we move forwards. Thank you for your patience and understanding.





And, when a child shares his/her innermost feelings with their classmates and their teacher, you see firsthand how scriptures can connect them to their world. It's unforgettable.


