#### Pastor's Message

The LORD spoke to Moses, saying: "Speak to Aaron and his sons, saying, Thus you shall bless the people of Israel. You shall say to them, 'The In recognition of all this, the passage from LORD bless you and keep you; the LORD make his face to shine upon you and be gracious to you; the LORD lift up his countenance upon you and give you peace.' So shall they put my name upon the people of Israel, and I will bless them." Numbers 6:22-27 (ESV)

With the passing of Christmas Day, the thoughts and eventually to you and me. They speak of of many turn once again to New Year's Eve with its resolutions, parties, champagne toasts, and the dropping of the ball in Times' Square in Manhattan (notwithstanding, of course, the impacts that the Covid-19 pandemic may have on people's plans). Of all the things that come to mind when one ponders the start of the new year, one that does not occur to most of us are the words of the Aaronic blessing found in chapter six of Numbers – you know, the blessing that is used at the end of most of our worship services. We do not usually associate "The LORD bless you and keep you; the LORD make his face to shine upon you and be gracious to you; the LORD lift up his countenance upon you and give you peace." with the start of the new year, yet not only are those words appropriate, they are actually appointed for the day.

You see, while the secular world celebrates the start of a new year on January 1, the Christian Church marks the day as the Feast of the Circumcision and the Name of Jesus. We observe those occasions on that day because Luke's Gospel tells us the baby Jesus was circumcised and formally named on the eighth day after His birth, all in accordance with the covenant that God made with Abraham back in Genesis. By His circumcision, Jesus was officially made a part of God's chosen people and incorporated into the children of Abraham; He became an heir with His kinsmen of all the blessings that God promised to bestow on Abraham and His descendants, blessings later

summarized by the Aaronic blessing.

Numbers 6 is the appointed reading from the Old Testament for January 1; however, it's not just the passage's place in our lectionary that makes it so appropriate for us as we begin this new year. These words proclaim and promise God's blessings upon His people - all of His people - from Abraham to Christ, the blessings that God has given richly to

each and every one of us during this past year, and they reassure us of all that He will continue to do for us and for His Church in the year ahead.

Even though 2021 was not the year that any of us hoped that it would be when it began twelve months ago, it was still a year rich with God's blessings. I know that it was also a year that brought sadness and loss to many, but God was still so very good to all of us. His goodness may be harder to perceive due to things like the continued presence of the Covid-19 pandemic, but they were still there. And God will continue to pour His blessings out upon you and me in the year that has just begun. 2022 will be another year in which God bestows His good gifts on all of us in abundance, even if Covid still isn't

gone yet or other troubles come our way.

We speak these words from Numbers 6 at the end of nearly every service because they are God's Word of blessing upon His chosen people – that means you and me and every baptized Christian. They are His promise to each of us that He is there with us, to protect us and provide for us throughout our lives. As we begin this new year, we do so with the reassurance that God will continue to bless us richly in the months and years ahead, just as He has done throughout our lives and to this



#### GETTING TO KNOW OUR MEMBERS...

#### January 2022—Georgianna Schupp

Our featured member for January 2022 is Georgianna Schupp. Georgianna was born in Cranford, New Jersey. Her family moved often, and she remembers living in 3 different towns, 3 different schools and 2 different states by the time she was in 3<sup>rd</sup> grade. Three months before her high school graduation, the family moved from Maryland to East Port Chester (now Byram), New York, from which she graduated. The move challenged her to make changes to her future. She decided to go to New York City and apply for a modeling job. She was hired by Barbizon Modeling, which she enjoyed.

Georgianna particularly enjoyed modeling hats! She remembers everyone joining forces on the streets of New York City to sell war bonds. She got a job at the Paramount Theater in New York City. There was an usher there, who's name at the time was Vito Farinola who operated the elevator closest to the stage. Perry Como heard Vito sing. Georgianna recalls that he had a very good voice. A short time later the usher known as Vito Farinola changed his name (and nose) to Vic Damone.

After leaving the Paramount Theater, Georgianna saw an ad in the newspaper for a job with Army Intelligence. This was war time, and everyone came together to help. She was hired for the job. The job was in Washington, D.C., where the employees were housed at Arlington Farms Communication Station, in Virginia. The job required secrecy. She could tell no one what she was working on. There is a book published recently called "The Code Girls". The untold story of the American women code breakers of World War II by Liza



Mundy. The book is about a girl who lived in the same room as Georgianna-Idaho Hall-Room C6.

Georgianna was married to Ralph for 74 years. She remembers meeting Ralph at his parents' home where her Mom and Dad were invited for a game of pinochle. Ralph and Georgianna eloped to Maryland. They were married on April 28, 1947. They have 2 sons, Ralph and Bradford. They also have 3 granddaughters, 1 great grandson and 2 great granddaughters. They moved to Cheshire in 1958. Georgianna remembers attending CLC service at the Grange Hall in Cheshire. She is proud to be a Charter Member of the church.

Georgianna lost her husband Ralph this past September. Georgianna's many hobbies include painting, gardening, US history and crafting. If you have an opportunity to visit her, you will be impressed with her ability to master her hobbies. She is also a big Yankee fan. She remembers when she and Ralph went to a game and sat behind Clark Gable. (He was even more handsome in person.) They also sat in front of Joe Louis and Sugar Ray Robinson. Georgianna also enjoys UCONN women's basketball. She is an avid reader who loves reading the Bible. She recommends "The Code Girls" by Liza Mundy. The book is a reminder of her own personal experience. Two favorite movies are: "Gone With The Wind" and "Now, Voyager." Her most favorite accomplishments are her 2 sons and being married to a Marine for 74 years.






Lastly, an update on the 2022 pledge campaign (data as of December 23rd):







# LOOKING FOR VOLUNTEERS TO RUN OUR VIDEO EQUIPMENT...



















#### Oh, Christmas Tree Follow Up







#### UPDATED CONTACT INFORMATION PASTOR R...

Beginning today, December 1, 2021, I will be making a change to the way that you can reach me. Some things are not changing, but others are, so I want to make sure that you are all aware of what is going on and how it may affect you.

#### First, what is not changing:

Phone and text. These two continue to be the fastest ways to reach me, especially in the case of an emergency. I answer my calls and texts right away, regardless of the day or the hour. The only reason that I will not answer immediately is if I am unable to do so at that time. If that should occur, I will reply as soon as possible. Voicemails are only listened to by me, so you can leave whatever message you need, and I am also the only one who reads my texts.

#### Second, what is changing:

Email. I will no longer be receiving email notifications on my cell-phone, so I will not know when an email is sent to me during the evening or on my days off. While I will still check my email regularly when I am in the office, I will not be made aware of them when I am out of the office and will only occasionally check email during those times. This means that email is not a good way to reach me in an emergency; in those circumstances, please call or text. If the subject can wait until I am next in the office, then email is a fine way to contact me.

If you have any questions or concerns, please reach out to me using the most appropriate method from the options above. Of course, you can always speak to me directly on Sunday morning or if you come by the Church office during the week.

#### News from The House & Grounds Deacon...


Hi everyone, this is my final article before I take a mandatory year off and I want to fill everyone in on what has been done and what to expect going forward from house and grounds.

The next steps with the streaming will be training members on how to use the service and basic controls. We would also like to set up in-house broadcasting to the nursery and fellowship hall. The equipment is all set up for this, we just need to run wires and install a TV in the nursery; something I'm sure the new house and grounds deacon, Todd Plantier, will work to complete.




The other project we have been working on
