Council & Voters Meeting Reminder

#### Pastor's Message

"Jesus said, 'Let the little children come to me and do not hinder them, for to such belongs the kingdom of heaven.'" (Matthew 19:14 ESV)

It's the kind of image that makes a beautiful cover for a Sunday morning bulletin or picture in Sunday School lessons; Jesus surrounded by a group of children as He reaches out to place His hands on their heads in blessing. The children must have been polite and well-behaved as they gather around our Lord; it's hard to believe there We live in a world where average Sunday was any hint of pushing or shoving and, of course, there was no impatience or complaining. As for noise, well, you'd expect some kind of awe or reverence at meeting the Messiah, their God and Savior, with perhaps some muted murmurs of amazement; beyond that, however, we'd hope that the children were largely quiet.

As serene as that scene may seem, I'm guessing that it was probably as far from the truth as you can get. The little children were probably fussy and restless, and I would not be at all surprised if there was some pushing and shoving as they ran around, just being kids. For most of them, there was probably a healthy dose of skepticism, as they viewed this unfamiliar man who was so ordinary that He was absolutely unremarkable in every physical characteristic. Instead of being the kind of peaceful image that graces bulletin covers and Sunday School lessons, I'm guessing that dynamics of the day were much more like a morning at Cheshire Lutheran Church during Vacation Bible School week.

If you have helped out with VBS, or even visited the Church during that week, then you know exactly what those days are like. Things are hectic and they are rushed. The children seem to be everywhere; their excitement makes it impossible for them to be still and they are definitely NOT silent. The phrase "a dull roar" comes to mind when I think of how the Sanctuary sounds as the kids gather for Opening

and Closing. As the week goes on, the "dull" part of that expression gets less and less, while the "roar" part seemingly grows exponentially. While, for some, that scene may seem overwhelming, the truth is that it's actually amazing. I say it is amazing because all those children who come to our Church during VBS are here for one reason: to meet their Lord and Savior Jesus.

School attendance is no where near the total enrollment, where Confirmation Classes have been taking place on Sunday nights because parents say their children are too busy on any other day of the week or time of the day, and where it is sometimes like pulling teeth to get many families with children to come to Sunday services on a regular basis. (We're not even going to talk about how easy it is or is not to get other folks out to services, not in this newsletter at least.) In the face of all that, we have families who willingly spend one whole week of Summer vacation getting their children up early and out the door to go to CHURCH and spend their morning learning BIBLE STORIES; by the end of the week the children are having loads of fun and often do not want VBS to end. We have children excited to learn about God and that is why I say it is amazing.

As the parents brought their children to Jesus that day, there was just one thing that got in the way, Jesus' disciples; the very people who were there to help spread the Good News became a hindrance. As people bring their children to VBS this year, there's just one thing that may get in the way, a lack of helpers; we need volunteers to help spread the Good News of our Savior Jesus and share stories from God's Holy Word in Scripture. If we don't have enough people, that's a real hindrance. We need people of all ages and abilities to help with every aspect of VBS.








This analysis is important for multiple reasons, such as being a key input into our long range planning, namely to better understand where our financial support is coming from.

Council discussed our impressions from this report, and what actionable next steps we would recommend and pursue.

First and foremost, what always resonates the most with me is that we are blessed to have some very generous members. As I have always said, thank you to all for your generosity!

Secondly, the analysis shows that a larger percentage of our financial contributions (in dollars) come from a smaller percentage of contributors. And although this is a common pattern more broadly in terms of giving, e.g., with religious, educational, civic giving, the Council discussion centered on a few areas of opportunity for CLC.

One opportunity is to increase our focus education-wise on the value of stewardship and pledging. Since all that we have is a gift from God, we as Christians want to support God's work, and one way to do this is via supporting the mission of CLC via our financial support.

Growing our congregation is another opportunity for CLC. But, to be clear, growing is important for reasons well beyond stewardship. Evangelism and growing our congregation allow us to spread God's Word and fulfill CLC's mission. We welcome and aspire to always be accepting new members, as this is foundational to being a healthy and vibrant congregation.

Giving is a personal decision between you and God. Please let me know if you would like any information on stewardship. Thank you, as always, for your heartfelt consideration with your pledging and giving. And, please, let me or any Council member know if you have thoughts or feedback on the topic of stewardship.

#### GETTING TO KNOW OUR MEMBERS...

#### July 2022—Donna Quast

CLC's featured member for July 2022 is Donna (Hillmann) Quast. Donna Hillmann was born on a little farm in Hector, Minnesota (MN). She and her siblings, two brothers and a sister, were all born in the family farmhouse. Donna grew up in a Wisconsin Synod Lutheran church, the Wellington Lutheran Church, which was founded by her great grandfather. Interesting story...Donna's strong German heritage comes from her great grandparents who emigrated from Germany. Her great grandmother died aboard the ship from Germany, leaving her great grandfather with two babies to raise alone. He had family in New York City (NYC), but wanted a quieter place to raise the children, so he headed northwest and settled in Minnesota, thus Donna's upbringing in that area.



Donna attended high school in Fairfax, MN, then went to school for nursing at Northwestern Hospital in Minneapolis. During high school, she was good friends with a classmate named David Quast. After graduation, she headed east to NYC where she worked as a nurse at New York University (NYU.) David headed west to California. Years later, the two old friends met up again at their ten-year high school reunion, and the rest is history. The young couple fell in love and were married in 1963 at the Emanuel Lutheran Church in Wellington Township, MN.

Prior to her wedding, Donna traveled the world. She toured Europe for three months with a friend of hers from Holland. The two girls had a wonderful time seeing the world; they visited Switzerland, Germany, Italy, Sicily and more. Donna also spent time in Mexico, Oregon, Arizona (where one of her brothers lived), and California (where her other brother lived). For a little farm girl from Minnesota, Donna sure did a lot of traveling!

Since this farm girl adored the big city, Donna and David settled in New York. She worked as a registered nurse on a per diem basis throughout the New York area, from Manhattan, to Queens, to Long Island, to Cortland Manor near Peekskill. Da-

vid spent his career working as an editor for the famous NYC publisher, McGraw Hill. Before long, Donna and David welcomed two beautiful bouncing baby boys to their family, David and Carl. They wanted to raise their boys away from the hustle and bustle of the big city and they had friends in Westchester who encouraged them to move to Connecticut, so they did. They found Cheshire and told their predominantly Roman Catholic neighbors that they were Lutherans. Before you know it, they found a flyer in their mailbox with information about Cheshire Lutheran Church. Their neighbors wanted to let them know that our Lutheran congregation was nearby and ready to welcome them as members. They followed up on this great lead and ended up happily joining our CLC family. Donna has remained a devout member of our church ever since.

Donna sites gardening as her favorite hobby and has always enjoyed tending to her plants. She is also an avid reader, favoring non-fiction books. With a husband in publishing, she was fortunate to have a steady stream of reading materials. As a matter of fact, David often brought home bags full of books, especially during the holidays, so they distributed books as Christmas gifts to their nieces and nephews. Spending much of her life in New York, Donna is a big NY Mets fan and attended plenty of baseball games during the years she lived there. She is also a big classical music lover. Her husband, David, was gifted in both writing and music. He was an organist and pianist at the age of twelve for a small Methodist church. Donna jokes that they did not have a TV, but were entertained by countless hours listening to music on an old stereo and reading a steady stream of books.

In addition to her numerous years of devoted service as a nurse, primarily working with children, Donna also dedicated time to volunteer activities. She served as the PTA president for two private schools during her boys' early school years. The boys said that she always "Picked up the gavel and just couldn't leave it on the table," meaning that no matter what, when she was needed, she jumped in and helped. In Cheshire, she also worked with the YMCA, taking care of young 3–4-year-old children in the day care, early in the morning from 7-10 am. She found joy reading stories to them, giving hugs, and wiping away tears. She also served for many years working with the local elections, where she helped by checking in voters at the polls. She found this to be a wonderful way to get to know people after moving to a new town. As an active member of CLC, Donna loves assisting in the kitchen during dinners and events, especially preparing snacks for the children participating in the summer Vacation Bible School (VBS) program. She also relishes her involvement in the various Bible studies offered to our members, and deeply appreciates the highly educated members sharing their knowledge and expertise on Bible topics and more. Donna feels truly blessed to have come into our church and enjoys the family atmosphere that Cheshire and CLC provides.


#### WE SUPPORT HOPE PREGNANCY CENTER...

## WE NEED SUNDAY SCHOOL TEACHERS: "YOU HAVE BEEN CALLED!"...

Years ago, before I had my own children (late twenties), I was asked by the Education Deacon if I'd be willing and interested to teach Sunday School at CLC. I politely responded that I would consider the request carefully. However, I thought to myself, "I've never taught before, let alone children. I have no experience. What if I mess this up? I probably won't be good at it."

A few days later, I was traveling with a colleague on a week-long business trip across the country. We had become friends over time as a result of working together. Being spiritual himself, we got onto the topic of faith and religion. I shared with him the request I received from the Education Deacon, and his response was like having water thrown at my face. He said, "For all the things God has given you, this doesn't seem like an unreasonable request. You have been called!" Upon reflection, I knew he was right.

I taught Sunday School for six years—5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> grades. It was rewarding, uplifting and an educational experience for me, not just the children. And, when a child shares his/her innermost feelings with their classmates and their teacher, you see firsthand how scriptures can connect them to their world. It's unforgettable.



And now, I'm the Education Deacon reaching out to you. Please help keep this evangelical mission moving ahead and energized. Tricia Rowold now leads the Sunday School ministry. She is and will do a wonderful job along with the teachers we have. But they can't do this alone. Please help us. We need you. You have been called!
