Lenten Address

Brothers and sisters in Christ, Almighty God created us to live in communion with Him and with one another in love. Let us pray to our dear Father in heaven, for the sake of His beloved Son, and in the power of His Holy Spirit, that He would grant us grace to amend our lives, and that He would have mercy on us, forgive us our sins, and bring us to everlasting life.
