## Pastor's Message

"Behold, I am with you and will keep you wherever you go, and will bring you back to this land. For I will not leave you until I have done what I have promised you." Genesis 28:15 (ESV)

Summer is almost here and, with it, the time when people travel for family vacations. It's almost like a ritual passed down from one generation to the next – families pack their bags, pile into the car (or an airplane) and go on a trip. These vacations are a chance for us to take a break from the normal routine of our daily lives, whether at work or school or home. They are an opportunity for us to get away from the people and circumstances of our everyday lives (hence, the term "getaway" sometimes used) and to get some rest and relaxation, to "recharge" as it were.

Jacob in the Old Testament went on a trip to get away, but his was definitely not a vacation. He wasn't traveling for rest or recreation; he was running for his life as he tried to get away from his brother Esau. As you remember from your days in Sunday School (at least, I hope you remember), Jacob had first tricked Esau into giving up his claim on the inheritance that would eventually come from their father; then, Jacob tricked their father (Isaac) into giving him the blessing that should have gone to Esau. This blessing guaranteed that Jacob

would get Esau's inheritance. When Esau found living. God is with you through every step of out, he was so upset that he said he was going to kill Jacob.

As a result, Jacob found himself hastily packing a bag and setting off on a getaway in an attempt to literally "get away" from his brother. It was during this trip to stay with his mother's side of the family that Jacob had a dream one night of a ladder connecting heaven and earth, with angels going up and down, and God spoke to him in the dream. God said to Jacob, "Behold, I am with you and will keep you wherever you go, and will bring you back to this land." While

Jacob was running for his life on a journey to live with family that he had never met. God reassured him that he was not alone; wherever Jacob went and whatever happened to him, God promised to always be with him and to take care of him.

God made the exact same promise to you in Holy Baptism. There in the font, when God put His name on you by water and the Word in the Sacrament, He said to you, "I am with you and will keep you wherever you go." God goes with you when you go on your summer vacation, whether you're taking more of a "stay-cation" and just going on the occasional day trip, or you're traveling half-way across the world. It doesn't matter if you plan to go to Church every Sunday while you're away, or if you haven't even thought about that in your planning.

God is also with you as you make those major, life-changing journeys that we all go on. God is with you when you graduate high school or college and go on to more schooling or into the workforce. He's with you as you move out of your parents' home and into your own place for the first time. He's with

# HAPPY ANNIVERSARY PASTOR, TRICIA AND SARAH...



On February 25<sup>th</sup>, 2018, Pastor Rowold was installed as the fourth pastor at Cheshire Lutheran Church since 1956. Pastor grew up in Hamden, CT and graduated from Hamden High. He attended Southern Connecticut State University for 2 years then transferred to Concordia College in Bronxville to study for the ministry. He graduated with a Bachelor of Arts degree (cum laude) in Religious Studies. Pastor then pursued his Master of Divinity at Concordia Seminary in St. Louis, MO.

While attending Concordia Seminary, he completed a one-year Vicarage at Trinity Lutheran Church in Hicksville, Long Island. His first Call out of Seminary was to Saint John's Evangelical Lutheran Church in Bloomfield, NJ where he was Ordained and Installed in June of 2003. While at Saint John's, Pastor continued his education at Drew University in Madison, NJ where he earned the degree Doctor in Philosophy (PhD) in Liturgical Studies.

In December of 2017, we extended a call to him and after meeting with members and visiting the church and parsonage, Pastor accepted our call in January 2018. This not only filled the vacancy for us but also allowed Pastor and his family to move back home, closer to family. On February

25th, he was installed and three days later conducted his first Lenten service as the new pastor of CLC.

Since that first Lenten service, Pastor has led us through several firsts for our congregation; an unprecedented pandemic that closed business, schools and churches, set up our first video service when everything was closed, provided guidance and support in our acquisition of a permanent video solution, and was instrumental in setting up and being a part of our Wellness and Safety committee. All this on top of his official duties as religious leader, teacher, counselor, and visiting pastor.

On Sunday February 26<sup>th</sup>, 2023, we celebrated Pastor's 5 years here at CLC with a small affair of coffee and baked goods in keeping with Pastors wishes. We celebrated not only Pastor, but also Tricia and Sarah, who came ready and willing to become part of our congregation, joining the choir, and helping to run VSB and Sunday School. (Tricia is now our Sunday School Superintendent.) At this year's picnic, we hope everyone will join us in thanking God for sending one of His (best) servants to us and to recognize the Rowold Family's 5 years with us and the 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Pastor's ordination. We feel truly blessed to have not only Pastor, but Tricia and Sarah as part of our family.






#### **LUNCH ON THE LAWN:**

## GETTING TO KNOW OUR MEMBERS...

Both Vicki & Don participated in Walther League functions. so there were many opportunities where they saw one another. Then, in January of 1965, Vicki got that long awaited call from Don. However, it was not exactly what she was hoping for. He was inviting her to his going-away party. He had enlisted in the Air National Guard and was headed to Lackland Air Force Base in San Antonio, TX for basic training. He invited her to bring a date to the party if she liked! Vicki chose not to bring a date and, by the end of the night, they were promising to stay connected and get together when he was home on leave that summer. The rest is history. They just celebrated 20 years at their current home in Wallingford, CT, which is barely one mile from the Cheshire/Wallingford town line. They








# MANY THANKS TO OUR SUNDAY SCHOOL TEACHERS...


#### NEWS FROM THE HOUSE & GROUNDS DEACON...

## THE RIPPEL REPORT—SUMMER 2023...



Ripple Family History - Key Events and The Wedding Band

#### 1958 – 1969 – Key Events in the Ripple Family

We moved into our first home, a prefab in Centereach, LI. Our second home, a standout corner home in a development of 150 homes called Postacres in Centereach. Our first two children were born there. Our family became members of Our Savior Lutheran Parish in Eastwood Village, led by Pastor Kenneth Hoener and family; they were from Pennsylvania. Our Savior was a brand-new mission church, developed and founded by the Missouri Synod.

On October 18, 1959, our first child, a daughter, Janet Grace was born at Mather Memorial Hospital in Port Jefferson. On September 28, 1961, our second daughter, Diane Jean was born at Smithtown General NY.

### Big Changes February 1963

On a cold winter night, we received a phone call that would change our lives forever. It was from the owner of Superior Industries. This was my 1<sup>st</sup> job out of High School, I was a woodworker and assembler of pool tables. When I left his employment for a better paying job in the heavy construction industry almost 10 years earlier, he vowed to track me down and make me an offer I could not refuse. He and his firm were now the world's largest manufacturer of recreational pool tables, table tennis and much more. They were nearing completion of a large new facility in West Haven, Connecticut. I was offered a supervisor's position in charge of a large wood working shop in the new facility. A 5-year contract, year-round, top salary and benefits. This would be a stable future versus seasonal construction and masonry life and work. The downside was that it would require uprooting our family to Connecticut.

Each Monday through ½ day Saturday I lived in a Milford Motel, driving back and forth to family for 1½ days each week for 20 weeks until the family moved (all expenses paid) first to Woodland Rd. in Wallingford, where we were members of Zion Lutheran. Then to Hamden, Connecticut and became members of the Lutheran Church of the Good Shephard, across from Sleeping Giant State Park; Pastor Roger Schleffs led the congregation.

Our 3<sup>rd</sup> daughter, Patricia Ann, was born at Yale New Haven Hospital and baptized at Good Shepard. Our Hamden home by Spring Glenn on Dadio Rd was becoming small and overcrowded so we decided to relocate. From December to June 1970 our family rented a large rural colonial home at Falls Rd in Bethany while we waited for a new home to be completed in Seymour CT.

#### Another Wedding Ring Incident

After heavy snows in Bethany and after Sunday services, our 3 girls bundled up and went outside to play in the snow. Dad joined them and we decided to make a snowman. I told them I had no experience at this, but they had their own ideas. The snow was ideal for snowman and snowball making. We fashioned a reasonably looking creature, and as the day grew into late afternoon and getting colder, we went back into the warm house and Mother's hot chocolate. Once in, we shed our wet clothes and gloves.



Dad got a chance to read the "funny papers" from the New Haven Register. I had a habit, from my construction working days, to bend my left thumb to my ring finger to see if my ring was still there. This time, my wedding ring was not there. My first thoughts were how and what shall I tell my wife and family? I chose to "sleep on it" and inform the family the next day. Over the next 5 weeks blankets of added snow fell. Looking out our front windows frequently at the thick white snow, I realized my wedding band was surely lost forever.

Warmer weather came in the weeks ahead and the area around the snowman turned into slush then mud. In early April, almost all the snow had disappeared. As I came home from work and entered our driveway our 3 excited girls ran to my car shouting "we found it", "we found it", repeating over and over, "we found your ring". I had promised a \$5 reward to the finder, so I

promptly paid all 3 \$5 each.

The details are as follows: our girls wanted to have a snowball fight with the last bits of remaining snow that was left. Our daughter Janet rolled a snowball together and when the ball cracked in half, inside and clearly visible was my band of gold. Dorothy was stunned by these events. The next day I drove to S & H Sperry and Hutchinson in Derby to purchase another ring to wear.

Our new home in Seymour, in the Great Hill section, was completed in June 1970. After we moved in our 4<sup>th</sup> child, Charles Andrew, named to honor both his grandfathers was born. He was born at Griffin Hospital and baptized by Pastor Otto Borchert. Our family lived in Seymour for 37 years and we were members at Immanuel Oxford for 52 years.

These last three months of Heavenly Herald articles are written in honor of my late wife Dorothy Ann and the blessings we shared for 63 year of marriage.






# SUPPORT SESSIONS FOR CAREGIVERS OR BEREAVED ...
