

2022-2024 LWML-NED MISSION GRANTS

Mission Goal \$75,000 allocated as follows:

\$48,750 for LWML-NED Mission Projects. \$18,750 for national LWML Mission Projects; and \$7,500 for Lutheran Womens Missionary League-New England District Administration.

FROM OUR DISTRICT PRESIDENT



Dear Sisters in Mission:

We tend to fear the unknown, don't we? Jesus, knowing this and not wanting our hearts to be troubled, shared with His disciples and with us what will happen on the Last Day. It will be a day of great joy for us as He brings us to the heavenly banquet feast. We take comfort in His words, and we remain watchful and prepared.

In the *Parable of the Ten Virgins* in Matthew 25, Jesus calls five of the virgins foolish and five wise. They all take their lamps to meet the bridegroom, but only the wise take extra oil. The bridegroom's arrival is delayed. When he does come, the five wise virgins who brought extra oil trim their lamps and are ready to meet him. The five foolish who did not bring extra oil ask the five wise to share. The wise virgins refuse, and so the five foolish go to buy more oil, missing the arrival of the bridegroom.

On the surface, this could be taken as an exhortation to always be prepared for every situation and can make those of us who make lists and plan ahead feel very good about ourselves. We'd certainly have been a wise virgin in the parable! On the other hand, doesn't it sound harsh to us that the five virgins with the extra oil refuse to share? Aren't we supposed to share what we have to help others? Isn't that what LWML is all about, sharing our mites to help those in need and to share the Good News? Both of these interpretations miss the point of the parable.

Jesus tells us that He is the Bridegroom. Jesus said to them, "Can the wedding guests mourn as long as the bridegroom is with them? The days will come when the bridegroom is taken away from them, and then they will fast" (Matthew 9:15). The virgins are all church members, and the oil represents their faith. The five wise virgins who bring extra oil have nurtured their faith through the reading and study of His Word and the reception of the Lord's Supper. The hope and strength they receive from the Word and Sacrament sustain them until Christ returns. When Christ returns, it's too late to prepare, as the five foolish virgins found out. The five wise virgins could not share their "oil" (faith) with the five foolish virgins since no one can believe for another.

That is why it is so important that we share the lifesaving Gospel message now while there is still time. We want no one to hear on Judgment Day the words the bridegroom spoke to the foolish virgins as they tried to enter the marriage feast, "Truly, I say to you, I do not know you" (Matthew 25:12).

There are so many in our midst who need to be encouraged to listen to the Word and partake of the Lord's Supper, and so many who need to hear the saving Gospel message for the first time.

Please join us for our November retreat where your "oil" will be refreshed through the study of God's Word, where you will be able to serve others through participation in service projects and in your donation to "Gifts to the Heart", and where you will be able to donate to mites to help share the Gospel message with others. Come and bring a friend whose "oil" needs to be refreshed, or who needs to hear the Gospel's life-saving message for the first time.

9 God's Word for Teenagers Worldwide---Lutheran Heritage Foundation, Macomb, MI \$2,500



When sharing the Gospel with teenagers, many missionaries and pastors are searching for new ways to connect them to God's Word. A Bible storybook called, **GoD's Word For You**, has been written in an easy-to-understand way and colorfully illustrated in a comic book style that especially appeals to teens. Lutheran churches in countries like Muslim Indonesia and Buddhist Thailand are asking for this book to be translated into their languages. At a cost of just \$5 per book, this grant will provide 500 teens and their families in Southeast Asia with the Gospel. Books will be distributed free of charge. The total project cost for this project is \$16,500.





Orphan Grain Train (OGT) Announces Shipment



Volunteers for the Orphan Grain Train's (OGT) New England Branch, located at 33 South Main St. in Terryville, Ct. loaded a 53-foot Trailer with 20,000 pounds of needed items for Appalachia on Aug.29.

The Appalachian shipment was sent to **Manna from Heaven**, a local Mission in **Myra**, **Kentucky** that
provides food, clothing, medical items, and other needed
supplies to families in need due to the shutdown of the
coal industry. Included were thousands of pounds of
food to help with their meal program to feed over 800
families. Also on the shipment were pallets containing
hundreds of boxes and bags of blankets, linens, clothing,
household and cleaning supplies, hygiene supplies,
medical supplies, diapers, appliances, and sewing



machines. Over 100 pieces of furniture, other household items, hand tools, mattresses and box springs, beds and frames, boxes of books, and numerous toys. All these items had been requested by the Mission to assist the families there.


