Pastor's Message

"Then one of the elders addressed me, saying, Who are these, clothed in white robes, and from observance of that day a step further because where have they come?' I said to him, 'Sir, you know.' And he said to me, 'These are the ones coming out of the great tribulation. They have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb.'" Revelation 7:13-14 (ESV)

During November, much of our attention is focused on the end of the month and Thanksgiving. It makes sense; after all, most people are either preparing a meal large enough to feed their whole family, or they are preparing to travel to the home of whatever family member is hosting the Thanksgiving meal. Whether you're planning the logistics of cooking all that food or the logistics of transporting yourself and your immediate family to the designated location, it can be a lot of work.

On top of that, there are also all the other activities and events connected to Thanksgiving. There are the football games (high school, college, and professional), the Macy's Thanksgiving Day parade, and – of course – there is the Black Friday shopping and the beginning of the holiday season. (Nowadays, there is even some shopping on Thanksgiving itself, either online or in person, but we won't talk about that.) Yes, with everything that happens around Thanksgiving, it's no wonder that all the attention seems to be there.

In spite of fact that most of the world puts the majority of the focus on the events at the end of the month, November actually starts with a pretty big day. November 1 is All Saints' Day in the Christian Church; that's the day we remember all those who have died in the faith and gone before us to their eternal rest with our Lord Jesus. Most congregations take time to especially remember the faithful who have died in the twelve months since the last All Saints' Day. When November 1 falls during the week, we celebrate the day on the next Sunday after it.

At CLC, we have begun taking our of our Columbarium. We keep a running list of all the members of the Congregation who have died and we mention, in the Sunday service, the names of all those who have gone to be with the Lord in the last year; these are common among many congregations. We now also set aside time to gather at the Columbarium to remember and give thanks for all those Saints who's earthly remains rest with us and wait there for the Lord's return.

We do all these things to remember the faithful who are now with the Lord and also to remind ourselves that we too will join them one day. The time will come that we are transferred from the Church Militant (the Church here on earth) to the Church Triumphant (the Church in heaven with Christ Jesus). It will take place either by the Lord returning to earth at His Second Coming and taking us all to be with Him or by Him, calling us individually at the end of our earthly life.

As we look forward to that day, I have one question for you: are you ready? Are you ready to meet your Savior Jesus and join the Saints Triumphant? If you're not sure, if you're uncertain, I can tell you one sure-fire way to get ready. The way you do it is; look to Jesus. Trust in Jesus and rely on Him during the good times and bad times in life. Lean on Him when life is hard and give thanks to Him when life is joyous. That's what all the Saints who went before us did.

Just look at the verses above from the Revelation of Jesus Christ given to Saint John. It says, "These are the ones coming out of the great tribulation. They have washed their robes and made them white in

There's a lot going on at the end of the month of November that we look forward to, Thanksgiving and all that comes with it. Before we get there, we set aside time at the start of the month to look back. We look back and remember all the saints who have died in the faith, especially during this last year. We give thanks to God for their lives and the blessings that they shared with us, and we prepare for the day that we too will join them, all by God's grace.

In Christ Jesus, who has washed you with His blood in Holy Baptism and made you one of His Saints,



NEWS FROM THE FELLOWSHIP DEACON...


Progressive Social:



- PLEASE use black or blue ink for your checks. Our friendly bank tellers thank you.






Pastor N & Gloria Celebration Memories




Bible Studies at CLC




ELP WANTED


