A WORD ABOUT THE LESSONS

The Lord Jesus Comes in Meekness and Humility to Save Us Although we pray that God "*would rend the heavens and come down*" (Is. 64:1), that He would take vengeance against our enemies, we ourselves "*have all become like one who is unclean, and all our righteous deeds are like a polluted garment*" (Is. 64:6). We have continued in our sins for "*a long time, and shall we be saved*?" (Is. 64:5). Yet, the Lord does not punish us in anger. He comes in voluntary meekness and humility to save us by His grace. Just as He once came into Jerusa-lem to sacrifice Himself for us upon the cross (Mark 11:4–8), He still comes to His Church with the fruits of His Passion. By His ministry of the Gospel, we are "*enriched in him in all speech and all knowledge,*" and so He will "*sustain you to the end*" (1 Cor. 1:5, 8). Although "*heaven and earth will pass away,*" His words "*will not pass away*" (Mark 13:31). As He sends disciples to call us to Himself in the fellowship of His Church, so will He "*send out the angels*" to gather us and all of His elect "from the ends of the earth" to Himself in heaven forever (Mark 13:27).
