Pastor's Message

"So those who received his word were baptized, and there were added that day about three thousand souls." Acts 2:41 (ESV)

On the first Pentecost, crowds of people gathered in Jerusalem to see what was going on after God poured out His Holy Spirit on Jesus' disciples. Peter proclaimed to the masses the Good News that Jesus had died to take away the sins of the whole world through His death on the cross, and also that God had raised Him from the dead for our justification. In response to this bold proclamation of the Gospel, three

thousand people believed and confessed their faith in Jesus.

On this Pentecost (May 19), people will gather in Cheshire to celebrate the day that God gave the gift of His Holy Spirit to His Church. The Good News of Jesus death to take away our sins and His resurrection for our justification will again be proclaimed. Following a two-year long period of instruction in the Christian faith and in response to the Gospel of Jesus Christ, three young people will stand before the congregation and confess their faith in Jesus.

I know three people is not nearly as dramatic as three thousand people – even if it is a lot easier to manage logistically – and we won't get to see the Holy Spirit descending as tongues of fire or giving the instant ability to speak in foreign languages. Still, on Pentecost Sunday we will see God at work, just as surely and certainly as He was two thousand years ago. We will see the fruition of the faith that God put into the hearts of our Confirmands and the years of work undertaken by the students, their parents, their Sunday school teachers, the Pastor, and the whole congregation.

God is working in and through His people today just like He did all those years ago when He first poured the Holy Spirit out on the disciples. He's at work through you and me and all the Christians who call Cheshire Lutheran their Church home. God is creating and strengthening faith in young and old. He's comforting and reassuring us as we face the challenges that the world sends our way. He's building us up in love and compassion for each other and the whole household of God.

There may be times when we look at our congregation and feel small, especially if we try to compare ourselves to other faith communities around us, but that's okay. Jesus' disciples probably felt small too as they gathered on Pentecost; after all, they all fit into one house (Acts 2:2). Still, God worked mighty deeds in and through them. As a result of their preaching, three thousand people came to faith. Who knows how many people will eventually confess their faith in Jesus Christ because of the work of our congregation?

Will we see the same kind of explosive growth that the early Church witnessed? Probably not. Will God use you, me, and CLC to make a difference for His kingdom? Definitely. How many people will be impacted? I don't know, and neither do you; only God knows. All we can do is wait and see. There is, however, one thing that I DO know – the total number will increase by three this May.

I pray that you will come out on Pentecost Sunday, May 19, and celebrate with us.





NEWS FROM THE PRESIDENT

AND THE CHURCH COUNCIL.

Greetings all,

I am sitting on my couch with my computer on my lap, trying to knock out my article, and I am experiencing a bit of writer's block. Not wanting to get too personal, but this past week I experienced a bit of a health scare that served to not only reinforce my faith in the Power of Prayer, but also to provide a greater trust in the value of modern technology.

I got up and checked my blood pressure, finding it to be extremely high and verifying that my heart rate was up to 159. Kyong and I went to Midstate as a precaution and after an EKG I was immediately admitted. I was told I was experiencing Atrial Fibrillation, and they would work to get my vitals under control and establish an effective medication dosage so I could be released. I would then return for a procedure involving a minor electrical shock to get my heart back to proper rhythm.

Midway thought the next day they were able to get my vitals under control and things were looking good. I fell asleep shortly after Kyong departed and was awaken sometime later as my room was full of nurses and I was informed that my BP was down to 90/40 and my heart rate was back up over 140. I was completely confused at what was going on, closed my eyes and began to pray.

I fell asleep praying, slept like a baby, and woke up to find that my prayers had been answered. As I was eating my breakfast the cardiologist came in and said, "congratulations." I responded, "for what?" and was informed that I came out of AFib on my own around midnight and would be going home shortly! Not believing this was done "on my own," I immediately said a prayer of thanks.

I was released on my third day in the hospital and, although I will have to deal with some follow-up, I feel great. I later learned that Kyong sent out a prayer alert on our family text chain and got everyone going. My Granddaughter Brynne told her mother, "A miracle happened for Grandpa because I prayed with Daddy last night"! We do not always get happy outcomes, but I believe lessons like this help to set our children on a path we hope they will follow throughout their lives.

At the onset of all this I sent a text to Pastor Rowold asking for his prayers. He responded immediately, not only telling me that I was in his prayers, but also sending me a prayer that he composed for me to

I knew my device had an EKG feature, but never knew it was constantly running in the background and programmed to provide alerts when abnormalities were detected – thank God!

A message from Pastor N and Gloria to all of you, fellow saints of God here at CLC:

It so happens that today, April 24th, marks the 70th (yes, 70th!) anniversary of our wedding in St. Trinity Lutheran Church in St Louis, MO, (Gloria's home congregation) back in the year 1954. I remember well the text of our wedding homily by Dr Richard Caemmerer, my professor of Homiletics (the art of preaching) at Concordia Seminary in St Louis – namely, James 1:17 – "Every good and perfect gift is from above (heaven)". Well, let me tell you, Gloria has surely been God's great gift to me all these many years and, with ongoing help from the Holy Spirit, I have tried to be the same to her! Annual CLC Family Picnic:



Reminders from Your Friendly Neighborhood Financial Secretary:


- ₱ If you have Pledge envelopes PLEASE use them, having to lookup members envelope numbers can lead to human error.




ELP WANTED

CLC SCHOLARSHIP UPDATE...

The Scholarship Committee met on Tuesday, March 26th, to review the scholarship applications we received from the 3 students in our congregation that are graduating from High School this year. Each student is planning to continue their education in the fall. The by-laws allow us to provide 1 or 2 students with a scholarship of \$1,000; therefore, we were able to choose 2.

The students are asked to submit their applications with three requirements:

- 1. A minimum of 500 word essay that answers the question "How has your faith in Jesus Christ as your Savior and your membership at Cheshire Lutheran church made a positive difference in your life?"
- 2. An unofficial high school transcript that includes their grades for the most recent school year.
- 3. A resume detailing their active membership in Cheshire Lutheran Church and community service during high school which exemplifies Christian values.

The committee reviewed each redacted application and choose Emma Finger and Sarah Rowold as our recipients for this years scholarship awards.

Emma Finger is the daughter of Kenneth and Lisa Finger. Emma's essay told us how her family moved here to Connecticut during the pandemic, to be closer to family. She was confirmed in Lamb of God Lutheran Church in Nevada, where she went on mission trips and volunteered at Boys and Girls Clubs. She has helped with VBS at CLC, attended Youth Group and attended the National Youth Gathering in Houston in 2022. She recounted how her faith in Jesus was tested and strengthened through trials her family experienced after moving here.

Emma's school transcript is very impressive with her high grades in many college and career ready and honors courses. Emma plans to study Occupational Therapy starting at Naugatuck Valley Community College.

Sarah Rowold is the daughter of Pastor and Tricia Rowold. Sarah states in her essay how her faith helped her transition in the move her family made from New Jersey to Connecticut at age 12. Starting here at CHS, and leaving a close friend who was experiencing a health crisis in New Jersey, were eased by her faith. Sarah has been actively attending Sunday School, Youth Group, singing in choir and helping to assemble backpacks for Orphan Grain Train here at CLC. She has also been an active volunteer with VBS every year, even bringing along friends to help. Sarah has been active in the Drama Club, Yearbook and Rampage paper at CHS, in addition to taking dance classes. She has also volunteered at the Cheshire, Yellow House. Sarah's transcript shows excellent grades in many courses of competitive college level and college prep categories.

Sarah is still deciding which college she wishes to attend although she has been accepted at Dean College and 4 state universities. Sarah plans to major in Technical Theater with interest in costume design.

The committee was saddened to not be able to award our 3rd applicant a scholarship, as he displayed excellent qualifications and commitment to church and community as well.

We congratulate all three applicants for their excellence in achievements and devotion to faith and family which will always serve them throughout their lives.

CONFIRMATION CLASSES NEWS...


