The words are simple - and they are wholly insufficient to express the depth of what needs to be said – but they are all that I have, so I will say them again. Thank you.

Thank you to every member of Cheshire Lutheran Church, to every former member, to every friend, and to every acquaintance who so graciously gave of themselves to assist with the funeral service and reception for Pastor Nuechterlein on February 7 of this year. When word of the need for help went out, the response was swift and aweinspiring. People stepped up to help the family make arrangements prior to the service, working on the food, the spaces, the music, and the inurnment. You all showed up *en masse* on the day of the service, filling the building with hands ready to help and voices ready to serve in the kitchen, the sanctuary, the narthex, the hallways, and the Columbarium. You continued to offer yourselves to Gloria and her children, volunteering to help in ways big and small and everything in between. Even all of you who could not be in the building that day who reached out, expressing your ardent desire

to be with us and your regret that you could not. Thank you for the hands that served, the voices that sang, the lips that spoke words of comfort and support, and the hearts that loved so profoundly. I was deeply moved that day by the way you all responded to help Gloria and her family, and I continue to be moved when I look

back on it. The love and appreciation that we all endure. Yet we know that God's love for her have for Pastor N was clear to see that day; I pray that he knew in this life just how much he meant to all of us.

Thank you. I will not attempt to name all the truly wish I could, but I am certain that there are some I might accidentally leave out and that there are some I do not even know. Current members, former members, and friends all came forward in the way they knew best to help; some came, not knowing how to help, but ready and willing in whatever way they were needed. So many

continued to extend the offer to Gloria and her children during the calling hours that they were not able to keep track of it all.

Thank you for all the love and support that you shared with Pastor N's family and with each other. It is a testament to how much he loved this congregation and how much he loved our Lord Jesus. That was his motivation in everything that I saw him say and do – his love for Christ and his love for all of you. Pastor N always wanted to be useful to the Lord, being about the work of our Savior. You all saw it clearly during his over three decades serving CLC as its Pastor, and we continued to see it even in his "retirement." Even after Pastor and Gloria moved to Elim Park, he still wanted to be useful to Jesus. Many of us were blessed to receive a phone call from him, inviting us to share a meal with them at Elim or even just to check up

Thank you for putting your love for Christ Jesus and for Pastor Nuechterlein into action in the days leading up to Pastor's funeral, on the day of his service, and in the days since. We continue to extend our love and support to Gloria, as she navigates a painful reality which she repeatedly praved she would not in Christ Jesus is strong and ever present, as it is for each of us. 





Ash Wednesday will be observed on March 5th. The following week, on March 12th, marks the beginning of our Lenten Soup and Bible Study nights.





REV. LOUIS G. NUECHTERLEIN OCTOBER 10, 1928-JANUARY 25, 2025

CHESHIRE – Rev. Louis G. Nuechterlein, 96, entered eternal rest to be with Jesus, his Lord and Savior, on January 25, 2025, at Elim Park, Cheshire. He was born in St. Joseph, Michigan on October 10, 1928, and baptized eleven days later by his father, also Rev. Louis G. Nuechterlein, in that town's Trinity Lutheran Church. He was educated at St. Joseph's Trinity Lutheran parochial school; Concordia High School and Junior College in Ft. Wayne, Indiana; the St. Louis Institute of Music; Concordia Seminary in St. Louis, Missouri (M Div) and the University of Michigan (MA in Music Literature). Following graduation and ordination in 1953, he was called as assistant pastor and director of music and Christian education at Redeemer Lutheran Church in Ft. Wayne – and later in 1960, as pastor of Cheshire Lutheran Church in Cheshire, CT, where he served until his retirement from full-time parish ministry in 1994.

In addition to editing the LCMS New England District Worship Newsletter for a number of years, Rev. Nuechterlein served as one of the District's

Circuit Visitors and as a member of its Worship Commission and its Board of Directors. As a church musician, he led the parish choir of his congregation – as well as workshops for other organists and choirmasters, including several for the church-wide introduction in 1978 and 2006 of two new Lutheran hymnals. He also contributed articles for church music journals and periodicals; and from 1993 to 2008, he provided Program Notes for the annual concerts of the choral music of J.S. Bach presented by CONCORA, a Hartford-based professional choir.

During his retirement years, in addition to Sunday supply-preaching in area Lutheran congregations, he served as LCMS New England District Circuit Visitor, also as a member of the Board of Directors of Lutheran Social Services of New England and the Lutheran Home (for the elderly) in Southbury, CT.

Louis is survived by Gloria (nee Kinworthy), his wife of 70 years, their four children – John, Mary (Brod), Paul and Anne (Harney Nuechterlein) – four grandchildren – Michael Brod, Carol Brod, Corinne Gonzalez and Ben Harney, and five great grandchildren – Cynthia, Justus, Zippora, Owen and Simon. The family would like to thank the extraordinary staff of Elim Park and Rehab Facility for the wonderful care and support they provided throughout his residence in the last year.

The funeral will be held at Cheshire Lutheran Church, 660 West Main Street, Cheshire on Friday, February 7, 2025 at 1:00pm. Calling hours will be held in the parish library beginning at 11:30am. In lieu of flowers, memorial gifts may be given to the Cheshire Lutheran Church Scholarship Fund. The Alderson-Ford Funeral Home of Cheshire is assisting with arrangements.




The current Sunday study should run until mid-March, at which point we'll pick our next topic. Join us on Sunday mornings as we dig deeper into God's Word together.

We are meeting in the Church Library on Sundays and on Wednesdays. If you cannot be with us in person, watch for emails each week to participate by Zoom.


Everyone is welcome to join us any time, even if it's your first time, and even if it will be the only time. I look forward to seeing you.
