Pastor's Message

"Oh sing to the LORD a new song; sing to the LORD, all the earth! Sing to the LORD, bless his name; tell of his salvation from day to day." Psalm 96:1–2 (ESV)

Lutherans are known for many things – our love of hymns, our theology, Bach, our stubbornness. One thing we are definitely NOT famous for is our receptiveness to change, to doing something new. We are so notorious for our dislike of change that there is more than one joke about our aversion to it: "The only time Lutherans like change is when they decide to put it in the offering plate." Or: "How many Lutherans does it take to change a lightbulb? Change?!?!"

Yet, in spite of our renowned dislike of doing new things, that is exactly what the Scriptures encourage us to do. Three times in the book of Psalms alone, God calls on His people – that's you and me – to "sing to the Lord a new song." So, even though we all have our favorites in worship (You know, the liturgy you'd use and the hymns you'd sing every week if given the opportunity.), this summer we are going to follow the admonition of the Psalms.

We're going to sing to the Lord, bless His name, and tell of His salvation with new songs and a new liturgy. Well... "new-lish"

We're not actually going to do something that CLC has never, ever done before – at least, not as long as I have been accurately informed about worship during the vacancy between Pastor G and myself. Beginning with June 22, we will be using the "Service of Prayer and Preaching" from our *Lutheran Service Book* hymnal (page 260ff.) for the non-Communion Sunday services. I have been told that CLC used that service at least once during the vacancy and I distinctly remember hearing the service's *New Testament Canticle* after I arrived (perhaps during Easter back in 2018).

So, fine, we may not exactly be singing totally new songs and using a totally new liturgy, but we will be doing some things that are definitely NOT part of our normal routine. We will be worshipping God in ways that call on us to pay attention and be engaged in, ways that are not so routine; that our minds will not be wondering while our mouths are singing familiar words. We will also be using another small portion of the wealth of worship materials in our hymnal.

Did you know that our Lutheran Service Book hymnal has a total of five different service settings for the Divine Service (Holy Communion), two services for use in the morning, two services for the evening, one service for the end of the day, and the "Service of Prayer and Preaching"? That's eleven (11) services, and it does not even include the two orders for responsive prayer, the litany, the rites for corporate and individual confession, and the daily prayer orders for use by individuals and small groups. Right now, we use two Divine Service settings regularly (Setting 1 and 2) and one occasionally (Setting 4), only roughly a quarter of the service orders in our hymnal.

Before you get anxious about the fact that we'll be doing something unfamiliar for our non-Communion services over the summer, let me reassure you: we're not just throwing you into the deep end and expect you to swim. We'll make sure that you've at least been exposed to the service before we use it for the first time. Handouts of the "Service of Prayer and Preaching" will be available for people to take home and look at before we worship with it the first time on June 22. We will also make time to go over the two Canticles found in the service before the day we use them.

In this relatively small and fairly safe way,





NEWS FROM THE FELLOWSHIP DEACON...







Initially written by Karen Baily on April 3, 2011 for Consecration Sunday

As a "life-long Lutheran" having attended eight years of parochial schooling at Immanuel Lutheran in Danbury, CT - I was confirmed at Immanuel Lutheran Church and married in that church. The Pastor who confirmed and married me also officiated at the renewal of my wedding vows at 25 years.

As a young girl, I remember "my church family" and my Pastor being there for my parents and I when my younger sister went through major heart surgery at 11 years old; school teachers came to our home to help with her studies while she was recovering, meals were brought (just as we do here at CLC through Helping Hands) and our Pastor was a constant support with prayers and visits.

Just months after my sister's surgery, my beloved father died of a heart attack at the age of 42. The very next morning my mother, sister and I were in church, sitting in the same pew we sat in as a family. Once again, feeling comfort from our Pastor, God's Word and our congregation.

My grandparents, aunts, uncles and cousins were all active members of this church. I've belonged to two churches in my life and the congregation here at CLC, along with Pastors Gustafson and Nuechterlein have become important in my life enough so, that this church and the wonderful job the "Dear Lord" chose for me six years ago have helped me to decide not to relocate to be closer to my children and grandchildren at this time. I trust I am where God wants me to be for now!

I start my day reading Portals of Prayer and on February 23rd the title was "Tell Your Story" - so I am!

Once again, my church family has been there for me especially in the last eight years as I went through my husband's diagnosis of terminal cancer, his difficult chemo and radiation treatments and his death - CLC members and friends called me; what can we do? What do you need? and Pastors Gustafson and Nuechterlein were a constant support.

When I contemplate answers to the following questions: What has the Lord done for me? When was the last time I told another person about God's Salvation or what God has done in my life? I have this to say: We do not have to worry about whether we have enough training to share our faith or worry that we will say the wrong thing. Rather, we can share what

God means to us, how we see him working in our lives and why we believe in Jesus. As we share our faith stories during this "Consecrated Stewards Program" with others in this congregation, God strengthens our own faith and uses our stories to strengthen our listener's faith.

I believe that God is closest to those broken hearts and part of God's plan for me to get through the grief process and continue living was to serve my congregation and community more! As many of you know, I work at the Harold Leever Cancer Center where my husband was a patient. I'm also involved in numerous events and fundraisers at the center. I do believe this was all part of God's plan for me - helping others - helps me! I believe one of God's goals for every human being on earth is to use the gifts God has given us to serve one another; if possible in the context of a local church.

A prayer at midday I use often says: Help me use my time wisely, strengthen me in the tasks that lie before me and bless me as a good steward of those things over which you have given me responsibility. My most recent responsibility here at CLC is being a mentor to Hannah and a friend to her mother, Monica and brother Christian - our stories are similar!

Yesterday afternoon as I was listening to my favorite FM station on the radio, 88.9 in Prospect, CT - a noon prayer was being said and it ended by saying: God has written the story of your life - trust Him.

As I walked into church this morning, I picked up one of our brochures titled "Who are Lutherans", one of the paragraphs states: "Lutherans are Stewards" which means they believe that all of life and health, all possessions and capabilities are, in a sense, on loan from God the creator. So they keep on learning - never rapidly enough, or profoundly enough - how to return on God's investment in them.

God bless everyone here at Cheshire Lutheran and thank you all for your friendship and continued support.

The following addendum recently written by Karen Bailey:

And 14 years later I continue to volunteer and serve on committees as needed here at Cheshire Lutheran Church. A Christian's deepest need is to be part of a truly meaningful community; the church is that community. Great opportunities to get involved and serve your church often disguise themselves in small tasks. God uses our time and talents to further His Kingdom.

My Lutheran Faith, my church and my church family continue to be most important in my life. Not only spiritually but socially as well. What would I do without my CLCW friends? Especially the ladies who are able to travel with me. Pastor Gregory Wismar's 10 day trip to Germany in 2017 for the 500th Anniversary Of The Reformation and walking in Martin Luther's steps each day with Vicki DePaolo was a blessing and a trip I will never forget.

Once again I thank the congregation and Pastor Rowold for the fellowship we share.







As I continue to get up to speed on tackling some projects at church, I am struck by what a beautiful gift we have been given. 


CLC CHOIR NEWS...

Church experiences afford participants the regular discipline of reverence as well as opportunities for usefulness through hands-on service.






NEED TO GET INFORMATION TO CERTAIN MEMBERS OF OUR CONGREGATION?
