PASTOR’S MESSAGE

[Jesus said:] “Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age.” Matthew 28:19-20 (ESV)

These words are familiar to every adult Christian (or at least they should be). We refer to them collectively as “The Great Commission” and they were spoken by our Lord Jesus Christ to His disciples just before He ascended into heaven from that mountain top in Galilee. With these final words, our Savior laid out the task before His disciples and every Christian, truly making them and us both apostles (“ones sent”) and evangelists (“ones who share the Good News”). We often hear these words read at mission festivals, when missionaries or church planters are sent out, and, of course, as our Gospel reading on Ascension Day.

Just as these words are familiar to almost every adult Christian, they also strike fear into the hearts of those same Christians. Fear because we know that Jesus didn’t only speak them to the group of faithful followers who were gathered around Him on top of that mountain 40 days after His resurrection; He spoke them to each of us also. Every Christian is sent out to share the Good News of Jesus Christ in our every day lives, and that terrifies us. Just the thought of having to actively and openly talk about our faith to others has the all too common effect of making Christians, especially Lutherans, sick to their stomachs. Sure, we can usually drum up the courage to talk about our faith in a Bible study at Church and maybe with family, but to share our faith with someone who is not already a Christian, it strikes fear in our hearts.

There are all manner of reasons why this can happen to us. For some, it is because we are shy by nature; we just aren’t outgoing, talkative

people. It’s as simple as that. For others, we’ve tried talking about Jesus before, whether to a stranger, or coworker, or friend, and it didn’t go well. As a result, we’re “once bitten, twice shy.” Then there are those of us who catastrophize; we expect and anticipate the completely, absolutely worst possible outcome of talking about Jesus and, in order to avoid that totally horrible outcome, we don’t say anything at all. The list can go on and on *ad nauseum*: don’t know what to say, not that kind of person, don’t want to offend anyone, not knowledgeable enough to answer questions they might have, etcetera, etcetera, etcetera.



In all of our fear over these words and the expectation to go out and share the Gospel that they convey, we usually end up only hearing the first part of what Jesus says to us. Yes, He gives us a command/a charge/a mission to go out and share the Gospel, but He also gives us a promise. Those two things usually go hand in hand with our Lord; His words of command aren’t just commands, they’re normally words of command *and* promise. And that’s exactly what we get here, in the last chapter of the Holy Gospel according to Saint Matthew. Look at those words again:

“Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. **And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age.**”

You see those words there in bold at the end of The Great Commission, those are the words of promise that Jesus gives along with the words of command. Yes, our Lord makes us all apostles and evangelists, sending us out into the world, into our daily lives

Thank you all for your continued support and participation. Stay well and be blessed!



with the charge to share the Good News of our salvation in Him. He wants, no, He expects us to tell others about our Savior in our words and deeds. At the same time, He does not send us out there into the world on our own. You are not alone when you open your mouth to talk about your Lord and Savior, and I'm not talking about the person standing in front of you to whom you are terrified to speak. I'm talking about Jesus; He's right there with you, right there beside you as you go out into the world.


For so many of us, what terrifies us the most about the prospect of sharing our faith with others is the thought of doing it by ourselves, being alone. I cannot tell you how many times I have heard people say, myself included, something along the lines of "Sure, if someone will go with me." When a brother or sister in Christ is willing to walk along side of us, to go with us in the task, then we're not so afraid. I don't know if it's the "safety in numbers" mentality, or whether we're subconsciously remembering that Jesus sent His followers out in two's when they went to spread the Good News of the kingdom. Either way, if someone's with us, we're okay.

And that is the promise of The Great Commission. Someone is with you when you go out into the world to share the Good News of Jesus Christ with the people you meet during your life. The person is not merely another believer like yourself. That person is the Only-begotten Son of God, your Almighty Lord who gives you everlasting life. Jesus Himself goes with you. With Him always by our side, there is nothing we need fear.

The next time the opportunity presents itself to talk about your faith, don't be afraid. Remember that Jesus is with you, take a deep breath, and share.


NEW PICTORIAL CLC MEMBERSHIP DIRECTORY COMING SOON...






CLC STRENGTHENING OUR DIGITAL PRESENCE ON SOCIAL MEDIA...

CLCW LADIES NIGHT OUT...


The ladies of the church are cordially invited to a dinner to be held on Monday, May 12, 2025, at 6:00 p.m. in the Fellowship Hall.



Hello Everyone,

This is your donation check speaking to you through the Heavenly Herald.

First, let me thank all CLC Members who enclose me in their Offering Envelope when placing me in the collection plate. I feel so safe and protected when enclosed in your Offering Envelope. The envelope preserves the privacy of your donation, and it keeps me warm so I don't have to touch the cold metal of the collection plate.



And I know that your Collection Count Team really appreciates this. Your Offering Envelope includes a unique number that the team uses to keep track of all your donations, so that quarterly and annual offering statements can be sent to you. These statements should assure you that your donations have been accurately received and deposited.



Now I know there will be occasions when members will send me to the Church without using an Offering Envelope. When that happens, I hope you can remember to write your Offering Envelope number right on the front of me — you can write it on my “memo” line.

And I want you to know that I am fine with your using the Vanco online donation service to send your donations. Vanco can be easily accessed through the CLC website. When you use Vanco, your Collection Count Team appreciates it when you inform Vanco of your Offering envelope number in the space provided on their input screen. And when you use a credit card, the Church appreciates all of you Vanco users who choose to reimburse CLC for the Vanco transaction fees.

Charity Gifting Life Insurance Idea:

Another way to give to a charity is through life insurance. The client/donor can make a full gift of an existing policy and be eligible for an appropriate income tax deduction equivalent to the lesser of the fair market value or the donors' basis in the policy at the time of the transfer. Once the charity owns the policy, future donations can be used by the charity to pay premiums which might be eligible for an income tax deduction. The client/donor can also purchase a new policy, make the charity the owner, and take a deduction on the annual premiums. Life insurance can be a valuable way to leave a long-lasting legacy to their favorite charity.





Come and join us as we dig deeper into God's Word together in Bible Study.




