A WORD ABOUT THE LESSONS

**Jesus Is with Us in His Holy Christian Church** On the night when He was betrayed, Jesus  
interceded for His Church — for His apostles and all who believe in Him through their word  
— that all of His disciples “*may become perfectly one*” in the Father and the Son (John 17:21  
–23). For Jesus became flesh and dwells among us in order to reveal the Father and His  
name, to share with us the glory of His righteousness, and to bring us to the Father in  
Himself. As the Father loved the Son from “*before the foundation of the world*” (John  
17:24), so He loves the whole world (John 17:23, 26). Through the apostolic witness to the  
Baptism, cross and resurrection of Jesus (Acts 1:21–22), the Lord gathers His disciples  
throughout the world “*with one accord*” as one body in Christ (Acts 1:14). And so with one  
voice and by one Spirit, His Bride prays, “*Come*” (Rev. 22:17). And He comes to us. He  
gives us “*the water of life without price*” to wash our robes and quench our thirst (Rev.  
22:17); He feeds us from “*the tree of life with its twelve kinds of fruit*” (Rev. 22:2).
