A WORD ABOUT THE LESSONS

We Are Humbled and Exalted by the Cross of Christ “Everyone who exalts himself will be humbled,” Jesus proclaims, but “he who humbles himself will be exalted” (Luke 14:11). For your hope is in the name of the Lord, who humbled Himself unto death on the cross and was exalted in His resurrection. So, are you humbled by His cross, and “at the resurrection of the just,” He will say to you, “*Friend, move up higher*” (Luke 14:10, 13–14)?
