'As each has received a gift, use it to serve one another, as good stewards of God's grace." 1 Peter 4:10 (ESV)

This time of year, my newsletter articles usually mention the end of Summer, the change of seasons or the start of the School year. They typically talk about topics like studying the Word of God in Bible study and Sunday School, returning to Church after Summer vacations, or passing on the faith to the younger generations. This month, however, is a bit different.

Instead of a Scripture passage about returning to the Lord, training up a child, or being taught the way of the Lord – like those that have accompanied previous September newsletters – the words of St. Peter's first epistle speak of something entirely different. "As each has received a gift, use it to serve one another, as good stewards of God's grace" (1 Peter 4:10). With their references to gifts and being a good steward, Peter's words sound like something out of a newsletter for the month of November, and you would probably expect a focus on Thanksgiving to accompany them, but giving thanks to God for all His benefits it not our focus this 19 month.

Saint Peter writes, "As each has received a

gift, use it to serve one another." It's these words that speak to us this September. The life of a Christian, the life that you and I have by virtue of our baptism into Christ Jesus, is a life of service; that shouldn't sound new or controversial to any of us. 1 Corinthians 6:19-20 tells us, "You are not your own, for you were bought with a price." Because Jesus gave His life on the tree of the cross to pay the price for our sins – ransoming us back from sin, death, and the devil – we now belong to Him. It just makes sense that we serve God in the new life that is ours in Christ.

Yet in our lives of service, we are not just called

to serve God; as St. Peter exhorts us, we are called to serve one another as well. Jesus Himself echoes this very reality when He quotes Deuteronomy 6:5 and proclaims that the great and first commandment is to "love the Lord your God" (Matt. 22:37; Mk. 12:30), which He them immediately follows by proclaiming that the second commandment is to "love your neighbor as yourself" (Matt. 22:39; Mk. 12:31). Just as we are to love God and love our neighbor, so too you and I are called to serve God and to serve our neighbor.

It is this aspect of the Christian life, "serve one another," that calls our attention and, to be entirely frank with you, where I need your help. In our lives together as Cheshire Lutheran Church, there are many people who give of themselves, who serve to make things happen, and I am grateful for every person who extends a hand to help, in whatever way they are able. For some time, I have written of our need for volunteers to help serve in specific ways – as Sunday School teachers, ushers, readers and in the altar guild. A number of my main newsletter articles have addressed the topic, and there have also been separate articles asking people to give of themselves and to serve.

In response to these past calls, there most certainly have been people who responded – and I am so very grateful for all of you. At the same time, the need for people to serve persists and has even grown. This September, we especially have a need for Sunday School teachers to help throughout the year (one of those needs that is ongoing and has grown), and we also need volunteers to help with ushering duties at the 8:00 AM service for the month of September. Please prayerfully consider answer the call and using the gifts God has given you to serve one another in these ways.


#### **Volunteers Needed for Worship Support:**



#### MEMORIAL GARDEN & COLUMBARIUM NEWS...

#### Columbarium Committee Update:

The Columbarium Committee met on August 4 to continue its careful planning and stewardship of our church's sacred memorial space. With deep respect for those who have gone before us and a commitment to serving our congregation's future needs, the committee reviewed several key items and made meaningful progress.

#### **Meeting Highlights:**

- Site Maintenance & Aesthetics: The committee discussed ongoing care of the Columbarium grounds, including seasonal upkeep and potential enhancements to the landscaping. The goal is to ensure the space remains peaceful, dignified, and welcoming year-round.
- Plaque and Niche Management: Updates were shared regarding the status of current niche reservations and plaque installations. The committee is working to streamline the process for families and ensure timely communication and coordination with vendors.
- Policy Review & Documentation: Members revisited the Columbarium policies to ensure clarity and consistency. A few updates were proposed to better reflect current practices and to make the guidelines more accessible to families considering future arrangements.
- Financial Oversight: The committee reviewed the Columbarium fund and discussed long-term sustainability. Stewardship of these resources remains a top priority, with transparency and care guiding all decisions.

**Outreach and Education:** Plans are underway to provide more information to the congregation about the Columbarium's purpose, availability, and spiritual significance. The committee hopes to host an informational session later this fall.

We are grateful to the committee members for their thoughtful leadership and dedication to preserving this sacred space. Their work ensures that our Columbarium continues to offer comfort, reverence, and connection for generations to come.

# Service Reminder!



#### News From Our Little Cherubs...

Little Cherubs Preschool Kicks Off a Joyful New Year!



This September, our learning themes will be both fun and foundational. We'll explore hand washing, germs, sunflowers, and apples, while beginning our journey through the alphabet with Aa, Bb, and Cc, and numbers 1 through 5. We'll also introduce basic shapes, circle, square, and triangle, and review colors and weather concepts to build on what the children already know.

#### Bible Time Focus: Creation:

Our spiritual foundation this month centers on the story of **Creation**. The children will learn what God spoke into existence on each of the seven days, supported by engaging Bible stories, Christian songs, and daily prayers over snack and lunch. We're also blessed to have **Pastor visit weekly** for a Bible time review, reinforcing these lessons in a nurturing way.

Children will bring home **coloring pages and artwork** that reflect our monthly themes. Our **Monday/Wednesday/Friday class** will receive weekly letter worksheets, and all students will practice writing their names using tracing printables, building confidence and fine motor skills in a joyful, hands-on way.


#### Hygiene Kits for Orphan Grain Train: Final Push Through September


Through the month of September, we will continue collecting items for hygiene kits to support the Orphan Grain Train, a mission that brings relief to communities devastated by natural disasters.








**IELP WANTED**





## LWML MITE BOXES: SMALL GIFTS, MIGHTY IMPACT...



Greetings from Niantic! As Treasurer for the New England District of the Lutheran Women's Missionary League (LWML-NED), I'm honored to share how Mite Donations help bring Christ's love to life through mission work.

These humble boxes are powerful tools for Gospel outreach.

#### What Is a Mite Box Offering?

The Mite Box tradition is rooted in the biblical story of the widow's offering (Luke 21:1–4), where Jesus praised her for giving two small coins, "all she had to live on." Inspired by this act of faithful generosity, LWML encourages regular contributions of "mites", small offerings given with great love and purpose. These gifts, though modest individually, collectively fund millions of dollars in mission grants across the country.



Churches and women's groups typically remit Mites monthly or quarterly.

Once received, I deposit the checks and allocate the funds according to our Mission Goal:

- † 25% supports national LWML Mission Projects
- ₽ 10% supports LWML-NED administration
- 廿 65% funds LWML-NED Mission Projects

As projects are fully funded, I send checks to the Grant Recipients in coordination with Ruth Scheumann of the Gospel Outreach Committee. I also prepare a monthly **Mite Report** for our District President and Communications Departments, keeping everyone informed of our progress.

Mission Projects are selected by vote at our District Convention every two years. We currently have **8 months remaining in this biennium**, and are actively collecting funds for several Projects.

Ladies of Cheshire Lutheran Church: your small offerings can make a mighty impact. Whether it's spare change from your purse or a planned monthly gift, every contribution helps share the Gospel and serve those in need. Kindly reach out to Karen Weiland for more information. 

#### NEWS FROM THE FINANCIAL SECRETARY...

There seems to be no limit to the creativity that scam artists will use to develop new ways to steal from us. Kurt Knutsson (known online as "the Cyberguy") has described one of the latest types of online scam to be on the lookout for:

Online scams are becoming more dangerous and convincing every day. Cybercriminals are finding new ways to gain not just your login credentials but full control of your computer and your bank accounts. Take John from King George, Virginia, for example. He recently shared his alarming experience with us. His story is a powerful warning about how quickly things can escalate if you respond to suspicious emails. Here is what happened to John in his own words,

"I mistakenly responded to a false PayPal email notifying me of a laptop purchase. The message looked real, and I called the number listed. The person on the phone gave me a strange number to enter into my browser, which installed an app that took control of my PC. A warning popped up saying 'software updating – do not turn off PC,' and I could see my entire file system being scanned. The scammer accessed my bank account and transferred money between accounts. He told me to leave my PC running and go to the bank, keeping him on the phone without telling anyone what was happening. I shut everything down, contacted my bank, and changed my passwords."


John's quick thinking in shutting down his computer and alerting his bank helped minimize the damage. However, not everyone is as lucky.



This type of scam is known as a remote access scam. It often begins with a fake email that appears to come from a trusted company like PayPal. The message claims there is an issue, such as an unauthorized charge, and urges the victim to call a phone number or click a link. Once the scammer makes contact, they guide the victim to enter a code into their browser or install a program, claiming it will fix the problem. In reality, this grants the scammer full control of the victim's computer. Once inside, scammers often search for sensitive files, access banking websites, steal login credentials, or install malware to maintain long-term access. Even if the immediate scam is stopped, hidden malware can allow scammers to re-enter the system later.



Welcome Back!

We have an exciting new year planed for our Youth and Sunday School families!

This year our lessons for grades Pre-K (ages 4-5) – Grade 6, are an overview of the Old Testament. Toddlers and parents have a different lesson set up that uses both New and Old Testament lessons throughout the year. Our Middle School and High School Youth have the opportunity to study what the Bible says about topics they may face in everyday life and a chance to volunteer as helpers in the younger kids' rooms.

- You'll be paired with a partner for support


Training and guidance will be provided every step of the way



## GIVING TO CLC THROUGH YOUR IRA: A SMART WAY TO SHARE...

If you're age 73 or older, the IRS requires you to take annual withdrawals from your traditional IRA—these are called **Required Minimum Distributions (RMDs)**. The amount is based on your account balance at the end of the previous year and your life expectancy. For example, at age 73, the IRS Uniform Lifetime Table uses a factor of 26.5, which means your RMD is approximately 3.77% of your IRA balance.

These distributions are **taxable income**. However, if you'd like to support CLC, there's a way to do so while reducing your tax bill: the **Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD)**.

A QCD allows you to contribute directly from your IRA to CLC. This amount can count toward your RMD and is **excluded from your taxable income**. How to Make a OCD:

- Contact your IRA provider and request a **direct transfer** to CLC. You'll likely need to complete a form or initiate the request online.
- The payment must be made **directly to CLC**, not to you.
- When you file your taxes, the amount you donated directly from your IRA as a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) doesn't count as taxable income.

**Please contact a member of the CLC Finance Committee** if you have any questions or plan to make a QCD. This helps us track and acknowledge your gift appropriately.

By using a QCD, you not only support a cause you care about—you also reduce your taxable income, making it a win-win for CLC and your finances!






