



As we light the second candle on the Advent wreath, let us prepare ourselves through prayer and penance. Let us open a way for the Lord to come into our lives.
- P Lord Jesus, Your forerunner John calls us to repent for You are near.
- C Lord, have mercy.
- P Christ Jesus, You bring us forgiveness for our sins and You baptize us with Your Spirit.
- C Christ, have mercy.
- **P** Lord Jesus, You are the way, the straight path leading to the kingdom.
- **C** Lord, have mercy.
- C Amen.
