## PASTOR'S MESSAGE

A few days after submitting my article for the January Heavenly Herald, I realized that I had completely forgotten something very important – 2026 is a very special year for Cheshire Lutheran. As of January 29, our Sanctuary and church building have stood in this place for 65 years. In addition, December 9 will mark 70 years since a handful of people met at the Cheshire Grange Hall for the first worship service of Cheshire Lutheran Church. This is a year to remember and give thanks for the people and all the other blessings that Almighty God has so graciously bestowed on the body of Christ gathered here at CLC.

It was Lutherans living in the area who first canvassed Cheshire in the Spring of 1956 looking to start a congregation, and that Summer the Rev. Darrel W. Geitz arrived to serve as their first Pastor. Less than a month after their first public worship service on December 9, the fledgling congregation had its first Baptism, as Karen Ann Clark was welcomed into the Lord's family by water and the Word on January 6. It was during Pastor Geitz's ministry that CLC purchased our property on West Main, the Ladies' Guild and Parish Choirs were formed, and the congregation marked its first Confirmations, a wedding, and a funeral.

In the Spring of 1960, Pastor Geitz received a Call to Evansville, Indiana, where he served the congregations of Our Savior and Messiah Lutheran Churches. Faced with a Pastoral vacancy, the people of Cheshire Lutheran issued their own Call to the Rev. Louis G. Nuechterlein who was one of the Pastors serving at Redeemer Lutheran Church in Fort Wayne, Indiana. Pastor N accepted the Call and arrived with his family just in time for the formal groundbreaking for CLC's building on June 19 of 1960. One week later, on June 26, Pastor N was officially installed as CLC's second Pastor.

Pastor Nuechterlein's time at Cheshire Lutheran

was a period of immense growth. The 1960's saw the dedication of our building and then the Schlicker Pipe Organ, CLC's first Vacation Bible School, the start of the Children's choir, and the dedication of our Bell Tower. During the 1970's, the CLC Women made our first Chrismons for the church Christmas tree, members began ringing bells in our new Handbell Choir under the direction of Jean (Kovach) O'Hara, the Church building was expanded to include the Parish Hall and Classrooms, and the Rev. George Heider came to CLC as our Assistant Pastor while studying at Yale.

Over the 1980's and into the '90's, Cheshire Lutheran continued to grow and flourish. The congregation began financially supporting missionaries in Korea and also a congregation in New Hampshire, Pastor Heider left Cheshire to serve at Concordia University in Nebraska, roofing projects were undertaking across the Church building, and the hard work of the members who tended CLC's gardens was recognized by the *Cheshire Garden Club* when it named CLC "Beauty Spot of the Month" (Summer 1987). It was in August of 1994, however, that Pastor Nuechterlein's ministry at Cheshire Lutheran ended as he, his wife Gloria (our Organist and Youth Choir Director), and Jean O'Hara retired on the 21st of that month.

To lead our music ministry, the congregation hired Gwynne Hopko, who began serving on November 1 of 1994. The following year, the members of Cheshire Lutheran voted to Call the Rev. Charles Gustafson as the parish's third Pastor; he was installed on September 10 of 1995. Pastor Gustafson's ministry at CLC lasted for twenty-two years until his retirement in May of 2017. It was during Pastor G's time at CLC that the congregation started financially supporting a Lutheran

founded Little Cherubs Christian Preschool, and the Columbarium and Memorial Garden was established. The period also saw the expansion of our Church building, including the construction of our Preschool wing. The parish was blessed during this time to have Martha Medford join CLC as our organist & Music Director; the church was also served by a number of men who were Called as "Director of Christian Education."

Our gracious Heavenly Father has continued to pour His blessing out upon our congregation, most especially His gift of our wonderful building and all the talented people who give of themselves to serve this congregation. Thanks to God's grace and their hard work and devotion, the Preschool program at Cheshire Lutheran has continued to grow and has a strong enrollment, our Sunday School is healthy with 25 children Elementary school-age and younger, and our Vacation Bible School routinely has 75 students sign up for the program. All of this is taking place under the roof of this building that Cheshire Lutheran is so blessed to call home.

Here, countless souls have been added to the family of faith by water and the Word in Holy Baptism. Here, young men and women have confessed their faith and made their Confirmation. Here, Christ Jesus feeds us His very body and blood to forgive our sins and strengthen our faith in Holy Communion. Here we have rejoiced and been consoled as members of the Body of Christ have joined the Saints Triumphant and entered the life of the world to come.

For all these – and all the reasons that are too numerous and lengthy for me to mention here – we are so very blessed, and we give to Almighty God our heartfelt thanks and praise. This year, as we celebrate 70 years as a congregation and 65 years in this place, let us follow the example of all those who have gone before us and led the way in the faith. Remember them with joy, give thanks to God for His people who are Cheshire Lutheran Church, and join me in serving the Lord with our whole hearts.

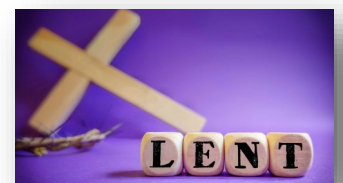
## SUNDAY WORSHIP ASSISTANCE FOR THE HEARING IMPAIRED ...

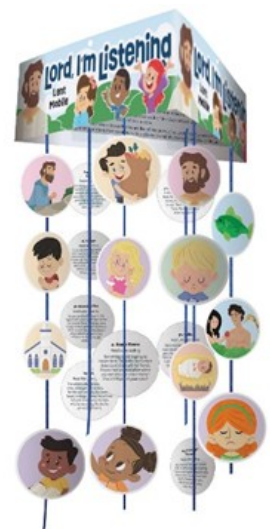


## KIDS' LENTEN DEVOTION AND MOBILE...

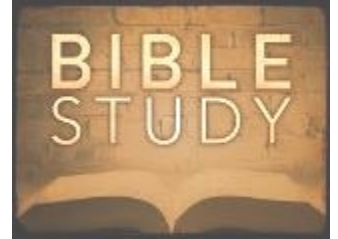

# Bible Studies at CLC

## WEEKLY BIBLE STUDIES...

The Sunday morning Adult Study between the services starts at approximately 9:15 a.m. every Sunday. Beginning February 1, we will be starting our next topic "End Times" from *The Lutheran Difference* Bible study series. "Millennium. Revelation. Rapture. Eternity. So many options. What do you believe? As Lutherans interact with other Christians, they often struggle to explain their beliefs and practices. ... Based on God's Word as faithfully reflected in the Lutheran Confessions, this study will help you to state clearly what you believe. ... *The Lutheran Difference* Bible study series identifies how Lutherans differ from other Christians and shows from the Bible why Lutherans differ."



In addition to our Sunday morning Adult study, our midweek Bible study meets on Wednesday afternoons at 1:30 p.m. We began looking at the book of Romans back in the fall and have almost finished working our way through it. We are on our last lesson and will wrap up our time in St. Paul's letter to the Christians in Rome in time for our traditional Lenten hiatus.

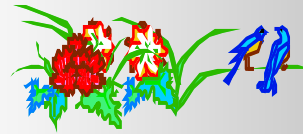
