PASTOR'S MESSAGE

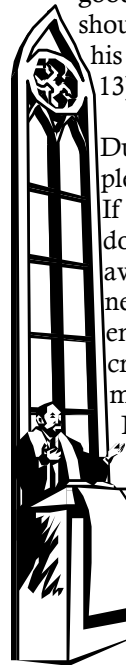
“To everything there is a season, and a time to every purpose under heaven.” Ecclesiastes 3:1 (KJV)

In October of 1965, the American folk rock group *The Byrds* released the song “Turn! Turn! Turn!” Originally composed by Pete Seeger in 1959 and recorded by a number of other artists before them, the version of the song by *The Byrds* made it to number one on the U.S. *Billboard* Hot 100 Chart by December of '65 – just two months after its release. Seeger used the first eight verses from Chapter 3 of Ecclesiastes from the King James Version of the Bible as the source for the majority of the song’s lyrics, adding just seven words of his own (one of them repeated multiple times) to create the text. The opening line of the song – and of Ecclesiastes 3 – is just as true today as it was over 60 years ago when *The Byrds* released their album, or when King Solomon first wrote the words in the 10th century before Christ. “To everything there is a season, and a time to every purpose under heaven.”

We find ourselves right now at the changing of the seasons. Memorial Day weekend will kick off the unofficial start of Summer as Beth Soulier works hard to put together this newsletter. Cheshire Public Schools will be ending their academic year earlier than normal in June to accommodate the remaining construction work on the two new elementary schools in town. Summer will officially start on June 21, which is also the first Sunday of our one-service Summer schedule and the day before CLC starts Vacation Bible School (June 22-26). The season of school and work will be over before we know it, and the time for rest and relaxation and vacations during the slower pace of Summer will soon be upon us.

That is the natural flow of things, as Solomon points out in Ecclesiastes 3. Our lives are a

continuous cycle of times and seasons, celebrations and laments, as the years pass by faster than we realize. Everything in life has its time and its season; that’s the way that God has ordered it and He wants us to make the most of each time and season as it comes to us, and to find the joy that is there in all of it. That fact is highlighted later in Ecclesiastes 3, where we are told by Solomon, “I perceive that there is nothing better for them than to be joyful and to do good as long as they live; also that everyone should eat and drink and take pleasure in all his toil – this is God’s gift to man.” (vs 12-13).



During the season that is about to start, please take the time to enjoy your Summer. If circumstances permit, take a vacation; it doesn’t matter if it’s a long trip to a far away place, or a short jaunt to a nice spot nearby. Just, please, use the opportunity to enjoy the life God has given you, the creation He has entrusted to us, and the marvels of the world that He made for us.

Make the most of moments spent with family and friends; focusing on one another while you are together and not letting thoughts of other matters distract you from the people there in front of you. Also, set aside time for yourself, apart from the pressures and the worries and the schedules of the world, so that you can actually breathe and relax. And, of course, remember to spend time with the Lord.

No matter our intention, the times and seasons of life always seem to become so full and fast-paced that we risk becoming overwhelmed. We may feel that there is too much to do and not enough time in which to do it. In spite of that, regardless of the season, there is always time to be with the Lord. Whether it’s the Divine Service on

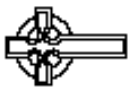

GUIDED BY FAITH: CELEBRATING NOAH WILDE, CLC'S 2026 SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENT ...

Cheshire Lutheran has 3 students graduating from high school this year. But, of them, only one chose to apply for the scholarship program.

The scholarship committee reviewed the application and found that it met all the criteria required to qualify. Therefore, this year we are awarding the scholarship to Noah Wilde.

Noah is the son of Alex Wilde and Daniella Morello and brother to Grace Wilde. Noah has been an active member of the church since he was a child. I know this because I was his Sunday School teacher a few years. I remember Noah being respectful, kind, dependable and attentive in class as well as always being a nice big brother to Grace when she would come into our room after class looking for him.

Not only has Noah continued to serve as acolyte when scheduled, he has also contributed to the Church's Christmas pageants, sang with youth choirs and youth assistant with VBS.

One scholarship application requirement is to write a 500 word essay that answers the question "How has your faith in Jesus Christ as your Savior and your membership at CLC made a positive difference in your life?" Noah wrote that He feels his attendance in Sunday School peaked his curiosity about the divinity of God and His creation. This led him to continue his involvement in Church and, as a result, increased his faith in Jesus Christ as his Savior. He said he feels his faith and membership have shaped who he is and has guided him to live his life with purpose.

Another requirement of the application is to provide a copy of your recent school year student transcript. Noah attended Prospect schools and then attended Woodland Regional High School in Beacon Falls. Noah has maintained an excellent GPA while taking honors and AP courses.

This has enabled Noah to be accepted as a student at Worcester Polytechnic Institute this fall with an interest in Cyber Security.

We, the scholarship committee, as representatives of CLC, are very proud to award Noah with this years scholarship of \$2,500, to help defray some of his higher education expenses.

Noah, we wish you great success in your future endeavors and pray God continues to bless your advancement as you stay rooted in His will.

Let's fill our summer Sundays with music that glorifies God and lifts the hearts of His people.

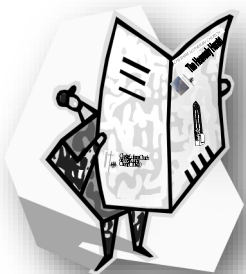

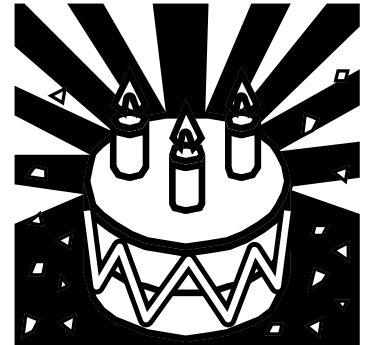

In a typical four Sunday month, there can be at least 70 “periods of service” where members usher, acolyte, read lessons, greet other members and guests before service, glorify God through musical offerings, prepare the altar, and operate CLC’s live stream broadcast.

Nursery Committee

I am forming a new three-to-five-member **Nursery Committee** per the CLC Bylaws. The impetus for this committee comes from the CLC Long Term Plan currently being developed and worked by the Church Council. At this point, three members have volunteered to serve on the committee and a fourth has been identified as a strong candidate.

As a group, we will develop recommendations, including potential capital expenditures, and then I will communicate them as Worship Deacon to the Church Council for thoughtful consideration in early fall. I don’t foresee this being a particularly cumbersome exercise, so the time commitment should be small but impactful. I expect to the committee to meet in late May for the first time and then convene a couple of more times during the summer.

NEWS FROM THE STEWARDSHIP DEACON...



To those of you who have expressed an interest in making charitable contributions to Cheshire Lutheran Church, this is a follow-up to previous articles on Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCD). I continue to field questions on how to report these type of donations on your tax return, so here's how.

In 2025, individuals 70 1/2 and older could transfer up to \$108,000 from a traditional IRA directly to charity. These qualified charitable distributions can count as all or part of your requested minimum distribution. You are not taxed on them and they are not added to your adjusted gross income. (The maximum QCD amount for 2026 is \$111,000.)

The 2025 Form 1099-R that you received this year won't reflect the QCD. It will only show the total distribution. When filling out your Form 1040, include on line 4a the total amount of distributions reported on Form 1099-R. Then subtract the amount you transferred directly to charity from your IRA and report the remainder, even if it is zero on Line 4b. Check the QCD box on line 4c so that the IRS knows why the numbers do not match. That should do it. Still, it's wise to check with your tax professional to ensure your filing is correct.

This picnic is always a wonderful opportunity to enjoy fellowship, delicious food, and the blessings of our church family. We look forward to celebrating the start of summer together.

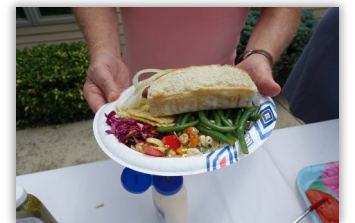
Lemonade on the Lawn:

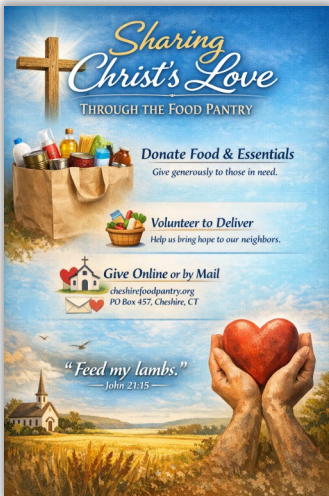

Every contribution — large or small — helps us live out that call.

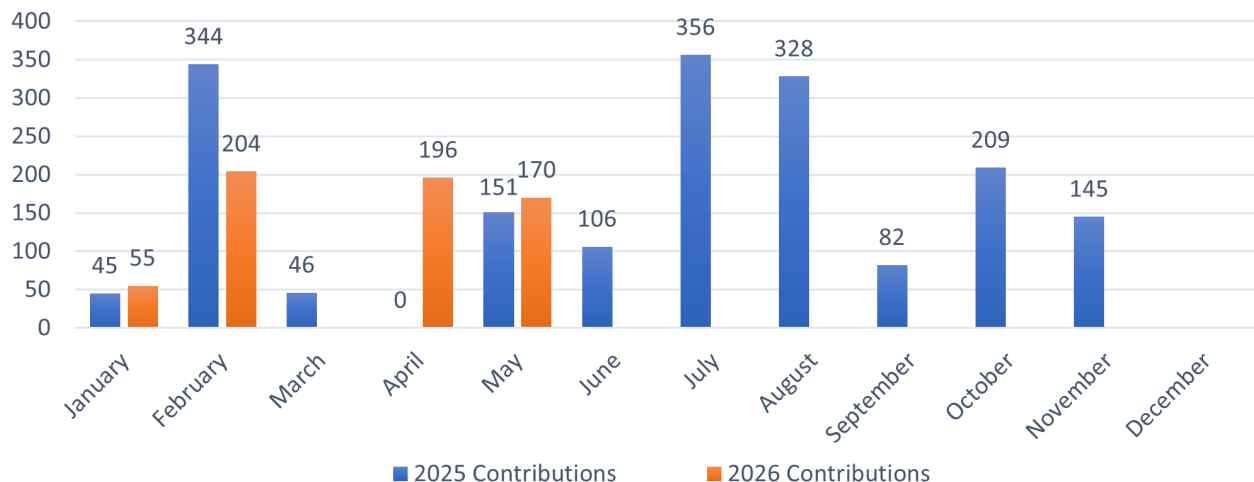

CLC SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM UPDATE...

Recent updates to the CLC Scholarship Program have been reviewed and approved by both the Church Council and the Voters' Assembly. Below is a summary of the program's history, current status, and the newly adopted policy changes.

Program Background

- ✦ Established in **2021** by **Marilyn Miller** and her committee.
- ✦ Scholarships awarded:
 - ☹ **2022:** Two \$1,000 awards (5 graduates assisted through scholarship + memorial funds)
 - ☹ **2023:** Two \$1,000 awards (2 graduates assisted)
 - ☹ **2024:** Two \$1,000 awards (3 graduates assisted)
 - ☹ **2025:** No applicants
 - ☹ **2026:** One application received and approved
- ✦ Additional support in earlier years came from the **Pat Di Domizio Fund** and the **Henderson family memorial funds** (Judy & Martha).

Strengthening the Fund

- ✦ Thanks to **congregational generosity** and **Pastor Nuechterlein's bequest**, the scholarship fund now holds a strong balance.
- ✦ With guidance from **Randy Raddatz** and **Priscilla Mulvaney**, the scholarship policy and by-laws were reviewed and updated for inclusion in the church constitution.

Committee Review – March 16

- ✦ By-laws remain current.
- ✦ Policy updated to reflect the healthier fund balance and continued support from Council.
- ✦ Council reaffirmed that **all eligible youth who apply will be supported.**

Eligibility Requirements (unchanged)

Applicants must:

- ✦ Be **high school seniors graduating in the award year.**
- ✦ Be accepted to a **college, university, or technical school** and provide verification.
- ✦ Be **active, confirmed members** of CLC.
- ✦ Submit a **resume** outlining church and community involvement.
- ✦ Provide an **unofficial high school transcript** including the most recent year's grades.
- ✦ Submit a **minimum 500-word typed essay** answering:
"How has your faith in Jesus Christ as your Savior and your membership at Cheshire Lutheran Church made a positive difference in your life?"

Award Amount

- ✦ All applicants who meet the criteria will receive the **same scholarship amount.**
- ✦ Due to the strengthened fund, the scholarship has been **increased to \$2,500** for 2026.
- ✦ Future award amounts may adjust based on fund balance and tuition trends.

Our Hope

These updates aim to encourage our youth to remain active in the life of the church, knowing that **their CLC family loves, supports, and walks with them** as they continue their education and service.

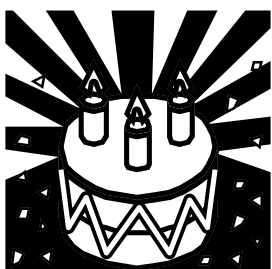

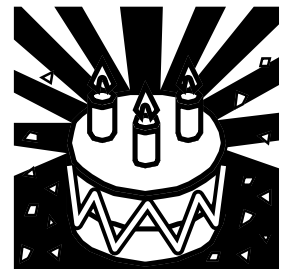

NEWS FROM OUR EVANGELISM DEACON...

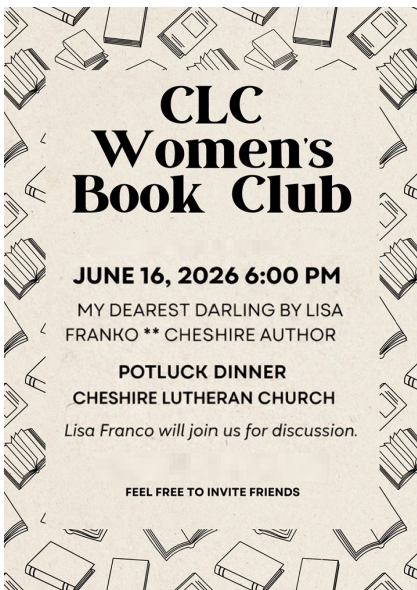
The Cheshire Fall Festival is scheduled for September 19. I will be unavailable that day and am hoping someone would be willing to volunteer to help run it.

MEMORIAL GARDEN & COLUMBARIUM NEWS...

Columbarium & Memorial Gardens Update:

Our Columbarium and Memorial Gardens continue to be a place of peace, remembrance, and quiet beauty for all who visit. We are grateful for the faithful hands that care for these sacred spaces and ensure they reflect the love and hope we have in Christ.

After careful review and consultation with Cheshire Nursery, our committee has approved the removal of the remaining diseased boxwoods on the main berm. These shrubs have suffered from multiple diseases and replacing them is the best way to restore the health and appearance of the garden. Cheshire Nursery has set aside twelve healthy “Freedom” boxwoods for us, an improved variety not susceptible to the issues affecting our current plantings. They expect to begin the work within the next couple of weeks. Once the new shrubs are in place, the area will be freshly edged and mulched to complete the renewal.

In addition, the Cross Garden received a full spring refresh: edging, shaping of the boxwoods, weeding, and new mulch throughout. We are thankful for the dedicated members who give their time and energy to keep this meaningful space looking its best. Glenn Myers is expected to handle the seasonal flower plantings as he faithfully does each year, and further small improvements are planned.

We give thanks for everyone who serves in this ministry of care. Your work blesses our congregation and honors the memory of those who rest in Christ.

Bible Studies at CLC

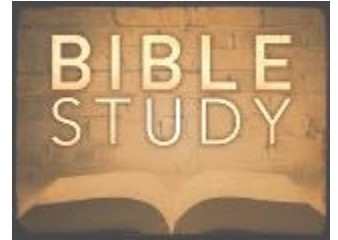
WEEKLY BIBLE STUDIES...

The Sunday morning Adult Study meets between the services through June 7, which will be our last session until Autumn. We completed our series **Explaining All The Scary Stuff In Revelation** in May and our final sessions of the school year will coordinate with the Sunday School lessons. To guide our time together, we will be looking at one lesson each Sunday from the series **Stuff They Didn't Teach Me In Sunday School**, published by *Lutheran Hour Ministries*.

Our Midweek Bible study continues to work our way through the book of Ecclesiastes, using a study from Concordia Publishing House's series *God's Word for Today*. This study takes a more thematic/topical look at the book of Ecclesiastes than many of our previous Midweek studies where we went through an entire book of the Bible verse by verse. Class meets on Wednesday afternoons at 1:30 PM and they will continue until we finish the study.

Our Adult Bible studies are meeting in the Church Library on Sunday mornings and Wednesday afternoons. If you cannot be with us in person, watch for emails each week to participate by Zoom.

Both Adult studies will be on hiatus for the Summer from mid-June through the end of August.
